## Expansion of Airport land: HC condones delay with costs of Rs 10,000

JAMMU: In Airport expansion land case, Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh High Court condoned delay and restored petition

During course of hearing Advocate Inderjeet Gupta with Adv Yatin Gupta appearing for AAI submitted that petitioners had filed OWP No 684 of 2011 titled Amrik Singh & Anr versus State & Ors seeking alternate Land from the Government despite fact that petitioners are not the owner of the land mentioned in Writ Petition and that land is government land which has been transferred by State Government to Airport Authority vide cabinet decision dated July 18, 2000. Due to absence of the petitioners and their counsels above mentioned writ petition was dismissed on the ground that rehabilitation of all sufferers was resolved by the Court vide various orders passed in PIL No. 35 of 2018 titled Ravi Abrol Versus Union of India & Ors and during COVID-19, all the advocates were attending the courts through virtual mode. It is the petitioners and their counsel who has chosen not to appear in OWP No. 684 of 2011, after which High Court was left with no alternative and OWP No. 684 of 2011 was dismissed.

Justice Vinod Chatterji Koul after hearing Adv J P Sharma for the petitioner Amrik Singh & Other whereas Advocate Inderjeet Gupta with Adv Yatin Gupta appearing AAI, observed that by medium of CM No.6264/2022, the applicant seeks condonation of delay in filing restoration application and grounds taken in the application are that the said petition was dismissed during the Corona period. Court further observed that even if COVID period is excluded, there is still delay in seeking restoration of the writ petition as delay is from March, 2022 to October 2022. "Though grounds taken in the application do not constitute sufficient and reasonable grounds which prevented the applicant form seeking restoration after the COVID period, however, in the interest of justice, delay is condoned subject of payment of Rs. 10,000 as costs to be deposited with the Advocate's Welfare Fund. Costs shall be paid within a period of one month. On costs being deposited, Registry shall list the application seeking restoration of the writ petition," the Court directed.
