JAMMU: Apni Trade Union, J&K President, Ajaz Kazmi has appealed to the Govt to regularize all the daily wagers, need based workers, Anganwari workers, Home Guard, Rehbar-e-Khel and others.



as well as in Kashmir, but the Govt has not taken any humanitarian decision to regularize their services and provide jobs to the next of kins of the deceased daily wagers in the power department.

In a statement issued to the press, Ajaz Kazmi expressed serious concern over the delaying policy adopted by the Govt which has triggered uneasiness among the thousands of workers.

"These brave daily wagers put their lives at risk during covid19 pandemic when J&K was under lockdown. The Govt should come up with a policy for their families, children to support their education free of cost. These people have served honestly to the people without caring for their lives. Therefore, it becomes imperative for the Govt to regularize them and provide them needed support like it is done in case of a regularize Govt employee," he said.

"In a statement issued to the press, Ajaz Kazmi expressed serious concern over the delaying policy adopted by the Govt which has triggered uneasiness among the thousands of workers.

He said that the daily wagers are the backbone of

the Govt Depts. "Many departments have poor manpower and hence, these daily wagers work during odd hours to make the Govt mechanism functional in Jal Shakti, PDD, and other Govt sectors," he stated.

He said that the Anganwadi workers, Home Guards, Need based workers and others should also be regularized without further delay. "If a decision for their regularization is not taken within a time frame, the daily wagers will be forced to come on the roads boycotting their work. The bureaucracy has taken such harsh steps against these poor workers that they were deprived of their several months salary. It's a humanitarian issue and needs a Govt policy for regularization, and release of pending wagers in different Govt departments," he added.

## HC quashes detention of journalist under PSA

JAMMU: A year after detention of a journalist namely Fahad Shah under the preventive detention law, J&K Public Safety Act (PSA), Justice Wasim Sadiq Nargal of Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh High Court quashed his detention with directions to release him forthwith.

Justice Wasim Sadiq Nargal said that detention order against Shah was quashed and it is ordered he is 'set at liberty forthwith if not required in any other case.' "In the present case, the procedural requirement has not been followed by respondents in letter and spirit and as a corollary thereof, the petition is required to be allowed and the detention order is liable to be quashed," the Court said.

The Court further said no compelling reasons have been given or shown by the detaining authority while passing the detention order against Shah when he was already in custody under an FIR in which no bail had been granted. "In absence of any compelling

reasons, the order of detention cannot sustain the test of law," the court said.

On March 3, 2022, the District Magistrate Srinagar passed an order under section 8 of the Jammu and Kashmir Public Safety Act, 1978, placing Shah under preventive detention to 'prevent him from indulging in the activities which are prejudicial to the maintenance of public order.'

During arguments, counsel for Shah, N A Ronga, described allegations against Shah as baseless, unfounded vague and without any substance, saying there is not an iota of truth in the allegations.

As per case, Shah was arrested on February 2, 2022, by Jammu and Kashmir police in Pulwama d and booked under Section 13 of ULA (P), section 124A and Section 505 IPC. Shah filed a bail application before a Court in Pulwama and he was granted bail. However, when the order of the Court was served upon the police concerned, he was not released and fur-

ther shifted to Police Station Imam Sahib Shopian.

In Shopian, FIR under Sections 153 and 505 of the IPC was registered against him. He filed a bail application before the Court and was granted bail, but not released by police and further shifted to Safakadal area of Srinagar. At the police station, Safakadal another FIR was registered against him. While in custody at Safakadal the District Magistrate Srinagar passed a detention order against Shah.

Ronga argued Shah was not provided with a copy of the dossier, material or other records including copies of FIRs that have been referred to and relied upon by the detaining authority while framing grounds of detention and passing the detention order. The Government advocate Sajjad Ashraf argued that the purpose of preventive detention is detaining a person and not to punish him for something, he has done but to prevent him from doing it.
