It is pertinent to mention here that after the completion of first year of their studies, students will become mature enough where they will be exposed to specialized academic domain/subjects and thereby chose their path according to their interests.

The fourth year is the watershed moment for the students wherein the students may either opt-out after the completion of their third year with a degree or opt to incubate their ideas/s at JU or take up a minor research project. The well trained mentors shall be available to guide the students round the clock and help them in understanding the basic nuance of their research, further added Prof Singh and also said that the curriculum is designed in such a way that there is every possibility that some of the best ideas of startups, public policy research documents etc shall come out from this research.

Desirous candidates can also avail free counseling for preparation IAS/JKAS exams, he added.

JAMMU: Stressing on the need in releasing of 4 per cent Dearness Allowance (DA) in favour of UT employees and pensioners, National Mazdoor Conference (NMC) President Subash Shastri on Monday appealed the Lieutenant Governor Manoj Sinha to release the same pending installment of four per cent DA due from January this year to its employees and pensioners so that confusion and uncertainty among the employees and pensioners could come to an end.

"We demand release of four per cent DA in favour of J&K employees and pensioners. DA is the part of salary and routine financial matter and as such there should be no hitch in releasing it," Shastri said while addressing a meeting of NMC activists here. He also demanded exemption of DA from ambit of

Income Tax as it is linked with price index. Shastri further demanded separate wage head for regularly disbursement of monthly salary of daily rated workers till their regularization, enhancement of their wages to Rs 600 per day, regularizing their services under SRO 64, setting up Labour Welfare Board. implementation of all Central laws in the UT besides granting Medical Allowance of pensioners to Rs 1000 per month at par with Central Government beside releasing 18% DA arrears to employees working in both Central/ UT Governments.
