

# Preparations for special summary revision of electoral rolls-2023 reviewed at Kupwara

KUPWARA: Following the directions of Deputy Commissioner Kupwara, Dr. Doifode Sagar Dattatray, who is also District Election Officer (DEO) Kupwara, a meeting of EROs and AEROs to review Special Summary Revision(SSR) of Electoral Rolls-2023 was held on Tuesday at DC office complex under the Chair of Additional Deputy Commissioner Kupwara, Gh. Nabi Bhat.

Additional Deputy Commissioner Handwara, (ERO) Nazir Ahmad Mir, Dy. District Election officer Mehraj Din Wani, ACR Kupwara, Ajaz Ahmad Bhat and all Assistant Electoral Registration Officers(Tehsildars), Officials from District Election Authority Kupwara and other concerned were present in the meeting.

At the outset, the ADC took a detailed review of the action plan for smooth and successful conduct of the Special Summary Revision (SSR) of Electoral Rolls-2023 to register all eligible electorates in all Assembly segments of the Kupwara District.

On the occasion, the ADC was given a detailed overview about the exercise

and it was given out that the Special Summary Revision(SSR)-2023 with April 01, 2023 as the qualifying date is commencing from April 05 with the publication of Draft Electoral Rolls and culminate on May 10, 2023 with the Publication of Final Electoral Rolls. Giving activity wise details, the meeting was also informed that date of Publication of Draft Electoral Rolls of all Assembly Constituencies of Kupwara is 05-04-2023, while period of filing claims and objections for Additions, Deletions, Corrections and Transposition is from 05-04-2023 to 20-04-2023. It was also informed that 2 Special Camps for Electoral Registration will be organised at all the Polling Stations of the District on April 9, 2023(Sunday)

and April 15, 2023 (Saturday), to have focused outreach to enrol all eligible electors and concerned Booth Level Officers (BLOs) shall remain available at respective booths with requisite Forms and Draft Electoral Rolls for the assistance of the Electors. It was also given that the Disposal of Claims and Objections by ERO shall be made by April 28, 2023(Friday). Similarly, checking of health parameters and obtaining Commission's permission for final publication/Updating database and printing of supplements is April 04, 2023. Speaking on the occasion, the ADC emphasized on conducting extensive SVEEP awareness programmes in all the Assembly Constituencies of the District to max-

imise registration of all eligible electorates. The ADC said that the prime objective of the Special Summary Revision (SSR)-2023) to keep the Electoral Roll updated and to provide an opportunity to get fresh enrolment of young eligible voters having attained the age of 18 or more as on qualifying date and to give opportunities for correction in particulars of electors and also to invite objections against any wrong inclusion in the Electoral Roll. The ADC instructed all the EROs/AEROs to create momentum regarding the exercise from the day first and supervise the process with focused attention to ensure 100% registration of all eligible and ensure no elector is left unregistered keeping in view the limited time period to conduct the exercise. The ADC directed the Officers to conduct revision strictly in accordance with the ECI guidelines as per schedule and complete the process within the given timeline. The ADC also stressed on conducting analysis of Electoral Rolls to identify the areas and polling parts where some voters have remained unregistered in the Electoral Rolls.

BANDIPORA: The Bandipora administration on Tuesday organised a daylong training programme on Special Summary Revision and SVEEP activities for Supervisors and Booth Level Officers (BLOs) of the district at MC Bandipora.

The training programme was presided over by Deputy District Election Officer Noorudin Bhat while ACR Bandipora Shabir Ahmad Wani, nodal Officer SVEEP Mohammed Rafiq were present on the occasion.

The programme was also attended by Master Trainers, officials of Election Department, Supervisors and BLOs of Bandipora District.

Speaking on the occasion, the Dy. District Election Officer explained about the processing of prescribed forms under

ongoing Special Summary Revision.

He said the objective of the programme was to sensitize the booth level officers regarding their role in the upcoming special summary revision being undertaken with reference date of 1st Jan 2023.

The master trainers briefed the participants regarding updation of the data via Form 6, 6A, 6B, Form 7 and Form 8.

It was informed that form 6 is exclusively for registration of new electors, Form 6A for inclusion of name in electoral roll by an overseas elector, Form 6B for capturing Aadhaar no. by existing electors, Form-7 for objection to proposed inclusion/deletion of name in existing electoral roll with a slight modifications that a provision of attaching death certificate has been incorporat-

ed and Form 8 for correction in electoral roll, shifting of residence (within or outside constituency), replacement of EPIC and marking of a person with disability.

They also explained the role of supervisor and BLOs in checking the prerequisites before processing the prescribed forms.

Regarding SVEEP activities, the Dy DEO deliberated upon various awareness measures. It was stressed upon BLOs to undertake the task of spreading awareness along with the current Special Summary Revision exercise.

An interactive session was also held to clear the doubts regarding enrollment process and other relevant queries.

Similar programmes were organized at Sub division sumbal and Gurez.

# DM B'la calls for coordinated action against drug abuse in district

BARAMULLA: The District Magistrate Baramulla (DC), Dr Syed Sehrish Asgar on Tuesday convened 6th meeting of the District Level Committee of Narcotics Coordination (NCORD) at Drug De-addiction center Singhpora here.

Principal Government Medical College Dr (Prof) Ruby Reshi, Senior Superintendent of Police Sopore Shabir Nawab; Additional Deputy Commissioner Baramulla, Dr Zahoor Ahmad Raina, Assistant Commissioner Revenue Peerzada Mumtaz Ahmad, Chief

Medical officer, Dr Bashir Ahmad Malik, Chief Education Officer Balbir Singh Raina, District Social Welfare Officer Nissar Ahmad Wani and other members of the Committee were present in the meeting.

On the occasion, DM discussed various issues related to menace of drug addiction, areas of concern, age group of addicts, hot spots of drug peddling, abuse, besides, cultivation of illicit poppy and cannabis in the

District. She said that collective efforts are needed to curb the drug menace and all stakeholders shall have to work in tandem to enhance the rehabilitation of persons involved in drug abuse.

Dr Syed Sehrish emphasised on conducting awareness camps in schools and colleges on mass scale to sensitize the youth about hazards and ill effects of consuming drugs.

The DM asked officers of all line departments to make coordinated efforts to contain the drug peddling and break the supply chain besides taking stringent action against the persons involved in this dangerous trade.

Dr Syed Sehrish said, in order to combat this rising societal problem, multi-pronged rehabilitation, counseling and guidance policy is being implemented on ground to monitor drug abuse and take remedial measures to curb the menace.

She sought cooperation from the religious heads, families particularly from parents to overcome the menace among the youth which also leads to other

social evils and crimes. She emphasized upon the role of religious scholars and imams for fortifying the efforts in curbing the drug menace.

The DM directed concerned functionaries of Education and Health Department to get CCTV cameras installed at Schools, Colleges and all medical shops, clinical establishments and chemist/druggist shops respectively which lie within the limits of schools, colleges and hospitals so that overall surveillance with regard to the containment of drug sales is enforced.

Meanwhile, with regard to the recently established Drug De-addiction center Singhpora, the DM stressed for training of health officials for proper functioning of the centre so that it becomes one of the sources to eradicate the menace.

On the occasion, officers apprised about the situation with regard to the drug menace and shared their suggestions and measures to be taken at District level to control the drug peddling and its consumption, besides measures for rehabilitation of drug victims.

Besides, Additional District Development Commissioner, Zahoor Ahmad Mir, the meeting was among others attended by Chief Planning Officer; Mohammad Yaseen Lone, Programme Officer, ICDS, Zeenat Ara, Assistant Commissioner Development, Syed Farooq, Lead District Manager; Abdul Majid, the meeting was attended by concerned Zonal/Sectoral Officers, representatives of Banks and financial institutions operating in Srinagar.

At the outset, the Deputy Commissioner finalized the Panchayat wise action plan regarding three-month long saturation campaign rolled out by the Department of Financial Services (DFS), Ministry of Finance from

April 01, 2023 to June 30, 2023 to saturate all the eligible beneficiaries under Jansuraksha schemes including Pradhan Mantri Jeevan Jyoti Bima Yojana(PMJJB) and Pradhan Mantri Suraksha Bima Yojana(PMSBY).

On the occasion, the DC asked the concerned all Zonal/Sectoral Officers, representatives of Banks and financial institutions to gear

up for the saturation campaign and ensure active involvement of PRI members to cover all eligible beneficiaries under the scheme in all 21 Panchayats of the District.

The DC also finalised the Panchayat wise camp schedule for saturation under PMJJB and PMSBY in Srinagar District to be organized jointly by the banks with active participation of the

District Administration and other allied Departments to ensure that benefits of the two Jan Suraksha schemes PMJJB and PMSBY reach the masses.

The DC stressed upon the Officers of all line Departments to utilise their field functionaries for identification and mobilisation of the Scheme beneficiaries for cent percent enrolment. He further asked the Lead District Manager to distribute pamphlets among the people regarding awareness of the scheme. The DC also asked the ADDC to hold periodical meetings with members of Panchayat Raj Institutions and to undertake field visits for monitoring the Gram Panchayat level saturation campaign.

Highlighting the objectives of the scheme, the DC

said the two Social Security schemes of Central Government viz, Pradhan Mantri Jeevan Jyoti Bima Yojana (PMJJB) and Pradhan Mantri Suraksha Bima Yojana (PMSBY) are aimed at providing life and accidental insurance cover to the citizens, especially the marginal sections of the society. He said PMJJB provides insurance cover of Rs.2 lakh in the event of death due to any reason whereas PMSBY provides accidental insurance cover of Rs.2 lakh for death or full permanent disability and Rs1 lakh in case of partial permanent disability.

The DC further said the two schemes provide the much needed financial support to the subscribers and/or their families in such eventualities.
