INDIA bloc has nothing to offer besides corruption, nepotism, appeasement: Modi

VARANASI: Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Sunday said the INDIA bloc leaders have nothing to offer besides corruption, nepotism, and appeasement.

The opposition leaders attack him when people reject them, Modi said during a virtual interaction with party workers from his home constituency of Varanasi via the 'NaMo' app

During the 'Tiffin Baithak' programme, Modi once again attacked Congress leader Rahul Gandhi over his "fight against Shakti" remark.

"The INDI alliance relies on worn-out clich s. They lack both logic and facts. These individuals have nothing else to offer besides corruption, nepotism, and appeasement. That's all they know," Modi said.

"So, when the public rejects them, they resort to criticising Modi. But it's futile as the people have already seen



theirParivarvadi parties will never appreciate how far India has come. They are of the Parivar, for the Parivar, and by the Parivar," he added.

Modi also reaffirmed the BJP's commitment towards development.

"Ten years ago, entrusted me with the responsibility of being your representative for the first time. This year, I urge you to once again choose me as your representative and help the NDA win 400 seats in the

The prime minister highlighted several projects, including the restoration of the Kashi Vishwanath corridor, women empowerment, infrastructure and healthdevelopment

Modi said the first-time voters must understand the hardships their parents faced before his tenure and take note of the progress and infrastructural development in Kashi today.


Over 1,000 probationary police officers undergoing training at army's counter-terror facility in J&K

DODA: Over 1,000 proba tionary police officers, including 62 deputy superintendents of police, are undergoing a six-week long training at the Army's counterterror White Knight Corps battle school in Doda dis trict, officials said.

The integrated training programme -- a first of its kind in the Union Territory grappling with over three decades of Pakistan-sponsored terrorism -menced on March 19.

Union Home Minister Amit Shah, in a recent interview, said the government has plans to pull back troops from Jammu and Kashmir and leave law and order to the Union Territory's police

"We have plans to pull back troops and leave law and order to the Jammu and Kashmir Police alone. Earlier, the Jammu and Kashmir Police was not



trusted but today they are leading the operations," he had said.

According to police, the integrated training programme was aimed at enhancing the coordination and combined operational capabilities of both forces, which for over three decades have combated terrorism side

"The training is focussed on operational tactics, intelligence sharing, and counterterrorism strategies, drawing on the Indian Army's extenmarks a continued commitment to security and the wellbeing of the region's residents," a police official said.

He said it is a stride

towards a future where the alignment of the Army and local police play a pivotal role in maintaining peace and safety in Jammu and Kashmir. "The valour and sacrifices

of both forces in the face of adversity have been instrumental in maintaining national security. The synergy achieved during training

way for peace and stability. The operations are also testaments to the collaborative excellence of the Army and police. 

Jammu-Srinagar NH reopens for traffic after multiple landslides

BANIHAL: Traffic on the Jammu-Srinagar national highway was suspended for over 15 hours on Sunday due to landslides triggered by overnight rains at a few places in Jammu and Kashmir's Ramban district, officials said.

Hundreds of stranded vehicles were allowed to move towards their respective destinations after the route was cleared around 4 pm, the traffic department officials

The 270-km-long highway is the only all-weather road linking Kashmir with the rest of the country. The highway was closed for

vehicular movement following a massive landslide at Kishtwari Pather near Banihal around midnight, and a mudslide and shooting stones at Mehar-Cafeteria Morh near Ramban town, the officials said.

A truck was damaged after it was hit by a rock that rolled down a hillock at Panthiyal in Ramban late on Saturday evening. The truck driver and his helper escaped unhurt, they said.

The traffic department has said that no heavy motor vehicles (HMVs) will be

allowed on the highway from 4 am on Monday to 7 am on Tuesday in view of "urgent repairs and upgradation of the airstrip stretch" near Bijbehara

Kashmir's Anantnag district.

"Light motor vehicles (LMV) shall be diverted to the old national highway alignment between Alistop and Doonipora, including Wanpoh, Khanabal. Batengoo, Padshahi Bagh and Bijbihara. Truck drivers are advised to avoid their journey on the highway from 4 am on April 1 (Monday) to 7 am on April 2 (Tuesday),
