## Drug peddler arrested with heroin

AKHNOOR" Continuing its efforts to curb the menace of drugs from the society and tightening noose against drug peddlers under operation SANJEEVENI, Akhnoor Police arrested 01 drug peddler and recovered 4.04 gms heroin (chitta) like substance from him.

A police party of Police Station Akhnoor led by SHO Akhnoor Inspector Akhnoor Tariq Ahmed under supervision of SDPO Akhnoor Sh.Mohan Sharma-JKPS established a naka near Old bridge for vehicle checking.

During checking a pedestrian who was on his way from Bamberwan towards old bridge diverted his direction on seeing the police party and tried to escape but the police team apprehended him.

During his search 4.04 grms of Heroin (chitta) like Psychotropic Substance was recovered from the possession of the pedestrian namely Vishal Kumar alias Shaltu, son of Kali Ram, resident of Bomal Tehsil Akhnoor District Jammu. FIR No. 63/2024 U/S 8/21/22 NDPS Act stands registered at PS Akhnoor. Further Investigation of the case is going on.

## 13 gamblers apprehended, stake money of Rs 10,700 recovered

BARI BRAHMANA: Police apprehended thirteen gamblers red-handed in the jurisdiction of Police Station Bari Brahmana and recovered stake money to the tune of rupees 10,700 along-with playing cards, 04 Mobile phones and cash from their possession.

Acting on specific information regarding gambling, a Police team headed by SHO Police Station Bari Brahmana raided the gambling spot near Teli Basti Bari Brahmana and apprehended thirteen gamblers while gambling alongwith stake money of Rs 10,700/-, playing cards, 04 costly Mobile Phones and cash of Rs.900/- from their possession.

The apprehended gamblers, all residing at present Bari Brahmana, have been identified as Mukesh Raikwar S/o Shankar Lal Raikwar R/o Bagauta Chhatarpur (MP), Akhilesh S/o Gauri Shankar R/o Palera Tikamgarh (MP), Dayaram Ahirwar S/o Lalli Ahirwar R/o Chhatarpur (MP), Krishan Kumar Kori S/o Raja Ram R/o Bariyarpur (MP), Ram Prasad S/o Marsul Kol R/o Keraha (MP), Santosh Raikwar S/o Khuman Raikwar R/o Chhatarpur (MP), Foolan Chandra Raikwar S/o Khuman Raikwar R/o Chhatarpur (MP), Bajrang Rai S/o Pujan Rai R/o Nawadih Jharkhand, Pillu Sahu S/o Mohan Lal R/o Biehpura Chatishgarh, Golu Lahari S/o Anjor Lahari R/o Mudpar Chatishgarh, Asharam Majhi S/o Anjuram Majhi R/o Tharidih Chhatishgarh, Brajgopal Patel S/o Mangaldeen Patel R/o Saura Chhatarpur (MP) and Manoj Kumar S/o Kant Paswan R/o Dekpura Bihar.

Legal action under section 13 of Gambling Act has been taken by police against the said gamblers.

## Cash, liquor, drugs worth Rs 4 Cr seized in J&K ahead of LS polls: EC

JAMMU: Authorities have seized cash, liquor, drugs, and freebies worth over Rs 4 crore in Jammu and Kashmir ahead of Lok Sabha elections, the Election

Commission of India said on Monday.

The poll body is on track for the highest-ever seizures of inducements recorded in the 75-year history of Lok Sabha elections in the country, with seizures totalling Rs 4650 crores, showing an increase of Rs 175 crore compared to 2019, it said.

According to the EC data, cash worth Rs 1.2 crores, liquor worth Rs 63 lakh, drugs worth Rs 2.35 crores, precious metals worth Rs 25,800, and freebies and other items worth Rs 5.59 lakh were seized in Jammu and Kashmir.

"Total seizures in J-K are worth Rs 4.2 crore," it said.

Similarly, all items amounting to Rs 11,580 were seized in Ladakh, including liquor, making it the lowest seizure among all the states and union territories.

The EC stated that its crackdown will continue ahead of the Lok Sabha polls. Among the 36 states and Union territories, Jammu and Kashmir ranks 30th in seizures.

The enforcement agencies have made a record seizure of over Rs 4650 crores in the EC's resolute fight against money power even before the first phase of polling for the 18th Lok Sabha elections which commences on Friday, it added.

This marks a sharp increase over the Rs 3,475 crores seized during the entire Lok Sabha election in 2019. Significantly, 45 per cent of the seizures are of drugs and narcotics, which are under the special focus of the Commission, it added.

## Theft case solved within 3 hours; Stolen property recovered

KULGAM: Police in Kulgam have solved a theft case by arresting an accused person involved in the commission of crime and recovered stolen property from his possession within 03 hours after the commission of crime.

On 14/04/2024, Police Station Yaripora received a written complaint from Abdul Rashid Dhobi son of Ghulam Rasool Dhobi resident of Yaripora, stating therein that on 14/04/2024 at about 20:00 hours, when he was closing his shop, some unknown thieves in the meantime have stolen his bag from his shop at Main Chowk Yaripora.

In this regard, a case vide FIR No. 24/2024 under relevant sections of law was registered in Police Station Yaripora. Subsequently, a special team led by SHO Police Station Yaripora was constituted, who after strenuous efforts and by using all available means rounded up few suspects and put them to sustained questioning. During questioning, one suspect namely Saqib Ahmad Ganie son of Abdul Rashid Ganie resident of Yaripora admitted his involvement in the commission of crime who was accordingly arrested.

On his disclosure, stolen property (cash amount of rupees ?36240/=) and Record Book of his shop have been recovered by the police team. Further investigation of the case is in progress.

## Drug peddler arrested; Contraband substance recovered

SHOPIAN: Police in Shopian have arrested a drug peddler and recovered contraband substance from their possession.

A police party of Police Post Wachi at a checkpoint established at Safanagri, intercepted a suspicious person who tried to flee from the spot but was apprehended tactfully. During search, 20,548 Kgs of charas concealed in two nylon bags was recovered from his procession. He has been identified as Intiyaz Ahmad Dar son of Gh Mohd Dar resident of Darbagh.

Accordingly, a case vide FIR No. 29/2024 under relevant sections of law has been registered in Police Station Zainapora and investigation has been initiated.

## 8 miscreants booked under PSA

The booked persons have been detained and subsequently lodged in District Jail Udhampur & Central Jail Kot-Balwal Jammu.

Pertinent to mention here that many cases are registered against these persons and they were involved in disturbance of public order, criminal activities and subversion. Despite their involvement in many FIRs, they did not mend their activities, and thus were booked under Public safety act.

## Absconder arrested

## Bootlegger nabbed, 40 bottles of illicit liquor seized

## Bike theft solved within 24 hrs; 2 nabbed

The South Zone Police team of Police Post Gadigarh then set about investigating the case and rounded up possible suspect for questioning. During this, accused persons namely Sushil Kumar alias Raju, resident of Simbal and Vicky Kumar, resident of RS Pura were rounded up. After sustained questioning of the accused, the stolen Pulsar has been recovered from the Manguchak area adjoining to Miran Sahib.
