JAMMU: The second phase of voting for the 18th Lok Sabha Elections concluded peacefully in Jammu Parliamentary Constituency on Friday. The district of Jammu, along with Samba, Reasi, and a part of Rajouri, witnessed a remarkable tentative voter turnout of 71.91 per cent. This high participation reflects voters' unwavering commitment and deep faith in the democratic system, contributing to a flourishing society.

The polling took place across 2,416 polling stations, all equipped with necfacilities. Additionally, 1,364 polling stations were live webcasted. More than 15,000 polling staff has performed poll duty.

Despite scorching hot weather, enthusiastic voters from Jammu, Samba, Reasi, and Rajouri turned out in record numbers to cast their ballots. Long queues formed at polling stations as people eagerly waited for their turn, with youth and first-time voters excitedly participating in this festival of democracy.

Chief Electoral Officer, Jammu and Kashmir, Pandurang K. Pole closely monitored the voting process from the UT level Command and Control Center established at Bhawan, Nirvachan Jammu. Polling began at 7:00 AM and continued until 6:00 PM or the conclusion of polling, whichever was later.



SRINAGAR: In accordance with the election schedule issued by Election Commission of India (ECI) for the conduct of Lok Sabha Elections-2024, the scrutiny of nomination papers for Srinagar Lok Sabha seat was held on Friday in the office of the Returning Officer 02-Srinagar Parliamentary con-(DC)stituency Complex Srinagar).

During the scrutiny of all 39 nomination papers received, 29 nominations were found valid as per the guidelines of the Election Commission of India.



SC rejects pleas to revive paper ballots, Modi hails verdict

NEWDELHI: Supreme Court on Friday rejected pleas for reviving paper ballots and also 100 per cent crossverification of votes cast on EVMs with a Voter Verifiable Paper Audit Trail (VVPAT), holding that suspicions regarding tampering of the voting machines were "unfounded".

As the country voted in round two of the seven-phase 2024 Lok Sabha elections. the top court said the Electronic Voting Machines(EVM) were



Interacting with the families whose houses were damaged due to sinking of land, the DC assured them every



The Deputy Commissioner directed the Tehsildar to process relief cases of damaged houses on war footing under SDRF to provide assistance to victims in the shortest possible time.

The DC informed that out of the 50 houses at risk, about 30 have been damaged and affected families have been shifted to safer places besides providing tents, blankets, utensils and other essential items to them. He said experts from the Geological Survey of India will be called to visit at Pernote to ascertain the reasons



The Deputy Commissioner said that restoration of essential services and road connectivity is the priority of District Administration besides ensuring immediate temporary provision of accommodation and ration for affected families.

Responding swiftly to the road blockage on Ramban-Gool route at Pernote, the District Administration has opened the Sumber-Digdole link road for light vehicles. This initiative ensures continued road connectivity and essential/emergency services for Sub Division, Gool, with NH-44.

The Deputy Commissioner said that the District Administration remains vigilant, with a dedicated team stationed at the site to monitor the situation closely.

It is notable that the land started sinking Thursday evening, creating a panic among the locals while electricity supply to several areas also got

affected. "On getting information, a team of Tehsildar Ramban Deep Kumar accompanied by officers from District Administration along with police, SDRF, and volunteers of Quick Response Team (QRT) rushed to the spot to restore the road connectivity and shift the families in panic

to the safer locations." DC said. "Tilak Raj Sharma from District Hospital Ramban is deputed to Pernote today (April 25) along with ambulance (JK19-3309), to facilitate patient transportation," said Deputy Commissioner Ramban.
