NEW DELHI: Top-seeded Indian Velavan Senthilkumar eased past Frenchman Matteo Carrouget in straight games to move into the quarterfinals of the Batch Open squash, a USD 12,000 PSA Challenger Tour event in Paris. National champion Senthilkumar, ranked 58th in the world, beat Carrouget 11-4 11-6 11-7 in 29 minutes in the second round on Thursday night after receiving a bye in the opening round. He will meet fifth seed Jakub Solnický of the Czech Republic in the quarterfinals.

Elsewhere, National Games women's champion Akanksha Salunkhe advanced to the quarterfinals of the Expression St James Open, a USD 20,000 PSA Challenger Tour event in Springfield, US.

Fourth seed Salunkhe, ranked 70th in the world, beat Winifer Bonilla of Guatemala 11-8 11-2 11-9 in 25 minutes in the second round following a bye in the first. She will play fifth seed Alina Bushma of Ukraine next.

World Cup: Deepika ousts Korean rival to make semis; archers confirm four medals

SHANGHAI: Continuing her spirited progress post motherhood, former world number one Deepika Kumari eliminated Korean Jeon Hunyoung to storm into the semifinal, while compound archers continued to shine to assure India a fourth medal in the World Cup Stage 1 here on Friday. Deepika, the three-time Olympian, who has slipped to world No. 142 and qualified as 30th seed in the rankings round, overcame a 1-3 deficit to defeat Jeon 6-4 (27-28, 27-27, 29-28, 29-27, 28-28) in the women's recurve individual quarterfinal.

Having started off with an eight, Deepika lost the first set 27-28, but the 29-year-old continued to improve and levelled the second at 27-all, before taking the third (29-28) by dropping just one point.

From three-all, there was no stopping Deepika who went on to drill in four 10s including two X (closer to centre) from six arrows to make the semis. Deepika, who embraced motherhood in December 2022 and returned to win the Asia Cup gold in Baghdad in February this year, may have to overcome two more Korean rivals in her bid to



win a first World Cup individual gold medal since the Paris Stage 3 in June 2021. Korean teenager Nam Suhyeon, who qualified as the seventh seed, stands in Deepika's way in the semifinal.

The other half will feature top seed and 20-year-old world No. 2 Korean Lim Sihyeon taking on Li Jiaman of China.

The day began with Jyothi Surekha Vennam and Abhishek Verma advancing into the compound mixed team final.

The world No. 2 Indians dropped just five points to prevail over their Mexican opponents Andrea Becerra and Lot Maximo Mendez Ortiz 155-151.

They will face lower-ranked Estonia in the gold-medal clash on Saturday.

round bye, the second-seeded Indian pair of Jyothi and Verma started off by producing a flawless 160 out of 160 to knock out the lower-ranked Australian pair of Geogina Graham and Brandon Hawes by eight points.

Next up, 10th ranked Luxembourg's Mariya Shkolna and Gilles Seywert were also no match for the Indian pair, which dropped just five points from 16 arrows to storm into the semi-finals with a 155-151 win.

In the semi-final, the Indians started on a backfoot after Andrea and Mendez Ortiz capped three 10s and one nine to take the opening end 39-38.

But the Mexicans slipped in the next set of arrows as Jyothi and Verma snatched the lead by dropping one point.

The Indians then extended their lead by three points in the penultimate round after another slip-up by the Mexicans.

Jyothi and Verma sealed the issue with a perfect 40 in the fourth end.

The fourth-seeded Indian recurve mixed team of Ankit Bhakat and Dhiraj Bommadevara lost out to the top-seeded Korean duo of Lim and Kim Woonjin in straight sets 0-6 (38-39, 35-36, 36-38) in the semifinal. They will fight for bronze against Mexico.

There was heartbreak for other recurve archers as Tarundeep Rai made a quarterfinal exit, losing to Andres Temino 3-7 (29-26, 27-29, 27-27, 27-30, 27-28).

Ganguly bats for Axar and Pant's inclusion in T20 World Cup squad

NEW DELHI: Former captain Sourav Ganguly feels Axar Patel will book his place in the Indian team for the upcoming T20 World Cup as he can be moved around in the batting order depending on match situation.

Axar has bowled splendidly all season at an economy rate of 7.06 and when promoted, he showed his batting prowess against Gujarat Titans.

"Axar, is a certainty. Both Rishabh and Axar are certainties for me at the T20 World Cup. The way things are going in T20, Rohit will want someone to come at No. 8 and bat, give those 15-20 runs which Axar can easily do, and if he needs someone to go and smack spinners, Axar can do that as well.

"That's the advantage with Jadeja and Axar, they are so talented and gifted,"

Ganguly, Delhi Capitals' Director of Cricket, said on the eve of their IPL clash against Mumbai Indians here.

Ganguly, who has helped the left-handed Axar with his batting, said the all-rounder has the ability to bat in Tests as well as T20s.

"You should have the ability to strike the ball. You don't have to have time for technique in T20 cricket. But your basics should be there and he's always had that."

"When you see his batting in Tests for India, he gets runs under pressure on turning pitches. He has the ability to bat but in T20 you need the ability to strike and he does that when he's pushed up and he gets a little more time to settle and keep hitting."

"He's a tremendous cricketer -- bats, bowls, fields. He has the ability to bat

and can bat in T20 cricket. He is a very gifted cricketer," Ganguly added.

Pant has shown that he has fully recovered from the injuries sustained during his horrific car accident, scoring three half-centuries in the ongoing IPL. He was at his belligerent best against the Gujarat Titans.

He is locked in a battle with the likes of Sanju Samson, Ishan Kishan and Dinesh Karthik for the wicketkeeper's spot but Ganguly is confident the 26-year-old from Uttarakhand is a surety in the Indian team.

"I love Rishabh and Sanju. Rishabh will go to the T20 World Cup. Sanju might also go, not saying he shouldn't. He is as good a player as anyone, and keeps, bats, captains Rajasthan. Both can go if the selectors feel," he added.

Sift races ahead on road to Paris

NEW DELHI: Sift Kaur Samra stole a march over her four Olympic Selection Trial (OST) rivals in the women's 50m rifle 3 positions (3P), winning back-to-back competitions at the Dr. Karni Singh Shooting range on Friday.

Aishwary Pratap Singh Tomar also entered the OST winner's circle, claiming the men's 3P T2 final in a classic 0.22 scrap to the finish line.

Sift, the reigning Asian Games champion, world record holder and the undisputed India number one in women's 3P for some time now, shot 465.1 in the OST T2 final, to leave Ashi Choksey 2.4 behind in second.

Anjum Moudgil was third, after coming second-best in a shoot-off with Ashi. Shriyanka Sadangi and Nishchal came in fourth and fifth.

Sift had also earlier won the women's 3P OST T1 at the same venue on Wednesday. As things stand, one more good performance in Bhopal, where the OST 3 and 4 are scheduled next month, should see Sift through.

The men's 3P OST T2 final saw yet another India number one and Paris quota holder Aishwary Tomar emerge victorious



in a nail-biting climax. Heading into the final shot, Aishwary was 0.1 behind Akhil Sheoran. He fired a 10.6 to Akhil's 9.9 to secure victory with a final score of 463.6.

Day eight of the ongoing OSTs also saw the qualification round of the men's and women's 10m air rifle and air pistol T2 qualification round taking place.

Nancy continued her excellent current form to top the women's air rifle with a score of 633.1. Sandeep Singh was best in the men's event with an equally solid 632.6.

In the women's air pistol, Rhythm Sangwan was on top of the leader board with a score of 584 while Sarabjot Singh topped the men's air pistol qualification with 581. All the four finals are slated for the concluding day on Saturday.

The Muslim Conference Jammu and Kashmir (Bhat Faction) along with its leaders, members, factions, wings and front organization as well as that of their principal Office Bearers.

WHEREAS the Central Government in exercise of the powers conferred by Sub-section (1) of Section 3 of the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act, 1967 (hereinafter referred to as the "Act") has declared the Muslim Conference Jammu and Kashmir (Bhat Faction) as an 'unlawful association' vide Notification bearing No. S.O. 934 (E) dated 28th February, 2024 which has been published in the Gazette of India, Extraordinary, Part - II Section 3, Sub-section (ii).

AND WHEREAS by Gazette Notification bearing No. S.O. 1461 (E) dated 18th March, 2024, which has been published in the Gazette of India, Extraordinary, Part - II Section 3, Sub-section (ii), in exercise of powers under Sub-section (1) of Section 5 read with Sub-section 4 of the Act, the Central Government has constituted the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Tribunal comprising Hon'ble Ms. Justice Neena Bansal Krishna for the purpose of adjudicating whether or not there is sufficient cause for declaring the Muslim Conference Jammu and Kashmir (Bhat Faction) as an unlawful association. The Hon'ble Tribunal has considered the preliminary material placed before it in support of the Notification bearing No. SO 934 (E) dated 28th February, 2024 during (he course of proceedings held on 15th April, 2024 and consequent upon such consideration, has directed that a Notice be issued to you under Section 4 (2) of the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act 1967.

NOW THEREFORE, a Notice is hereby given to you under Sub-section (2) of Section 4 of the Act and you arc hereby called upon to show cause in writing within 30 days from the date of service of this Notice as to why your association should not be declared as unlawful and why an order should not be made confirming the declaration made in the above-mentioned Notification bearing No. S.O. 934 (E) dated 28th February, 2024.

The Objections/Reply/Written Statement along with documents, if any, may be filed/delivered within the statutory period of 30 days from the date of service to the undersigned at his Office in the Court of Registrar-2, Ground Floor, New Courts Block, High Court of Delhi, New Delhi. In case Objections/Reply/Written Statement and accompanying documents are to be filed in regional language, their true English translations be also attached.

You are required to appear before the Tribunal on 20.05.2024 at 04.30 PM. in Court Room No. 49, First Floor, New Courts Block, High Court of Delhi, New Delhi for further proceedings. Appearance can also be caused through a duly authorised and instructed Counsel/Advocate.

New Delhi, the 28th February, 2024

S.O. 934(E).-Whereas, the Muslim Conference Jammu and Kashmir (Bhat faction) (hereinafter referred to as the MCJK-B), chaired by Abdul Ghani Bhat have been indulging in unlawful activities, which are prejudicial to the integrity, sovereignty and security of the country;

And, whereas, MCJK-B has linkages with banned terrorist organizations and has supported terrorism in Jammu and Kashmir

And, whereas, the members of the MCJK-B have been indulging in generating feelings of hatred and disaffection against India to separate Jammu and Kashmir from Union of India; and whereas the leaders and members of theMCJK-B have been involved in the raising funds through various sources including Pakistan and its proxy organizations for perpetrating unlawful activities, including supporting terrorist activities, sustained stone-pelting on Security Forces in Jammu and Kashmir;

And, whereas, the MCJK-B and its members by their activities show sheer disrespect towards the constitutional authority and constitutional set up of the country;

And whereas, MCJK-B by giving clarion call to boycott elections on multiple occasions, has also attempted to subvert the will of people and democratic process in Jammu and Kashmir;

And whereas, MCJK-B is involved in promoting, aiding and abetting the secession or Jammu and Kashmir from India by involving itself in anti-national and subversive activities; sowing seeds of dis-affection amongst people; exhorting people to destabilise law and order; encouraging the use of armed struggle to separate Jammu and Kashmir; and promoting hatred against established Government;

And, whereas, the Central Government is of the opinion that if there is no immediate curb or control or unlawful activities of the Muslim Conference Jammu and Kashmir (Bhat faction), it will use this opportunity to-

(i) continue with the anti-national activities which are detrimental to the territorial integrity, security and sovereignty of the country;

(ii) continue advocating the secession of Jammu and Kashmir from the Union of India while disputing its accession to the Union of India; and

(iii) continue propagating false narrative and anti-national sentiments among the people of Jammu and Kashmir with the intention to cause disaffection against India and disrupt public order;

And, whereas, the Central Government for the above-mentioned reasons is firmly of the opinion that having regard to the activities of the Muslim Conference Jammu and Kashmir (Bhat faction), it is necessary to declare the Muslim Conference Jammu and Kashmir (Bhat faction) (MCJK-B) as an 'unlawful association' with immediate effect;

Now, 'therefore, in exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (1) of the section 3 of the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act, 1967 (37 of 1967), the Central Government hereby declares the Muslim Conference Jammu and Kashmir (Bhat faction) (MCJK-B) as an unlawful association;

The Central Government, having regard to the above circumstances, is of firm opinion that it is necessary to declare the Muslim Conference Jammu and Kashmir (Bhat faction) (MCJK-B) as an 'unlawful association' with immediate effect, and accordingly, in exercise of the powers conferred by the proviso to sub-section (3) of section 3 of the said Act, the Central Government hereby directs that this notification shall, subject to any order that may be made under section 4 of the said Act, have effect for a period of five years from the date of its publication in the Official Gazette.
