4 notorious drug peddlers booked under PIT NDPS Act

SOPORE: Acting tough against the drug peddlers/smugglers and to eradicate the menace of drugs from the society, Police booked 4 notorious drug peddlers under PIT NDPS Act in Sopore after obtaining formal detention orders from competent authority.

The four notorious drug peddlers identified as Parvaiz Ahmad Khan son of Abdul Rashid Khan resident of Model Town C Sopore, Waseem Ahmad Hajam son of Mohammad Akbar Hajam resident of Dooru Peer Mohalla, Shahbaz Ahmad Dangroo son of Ghulam Mohi-ud-Din Dangroo resident of Machipora Bomai Sopore and Sharafatullah Shah son of Muzaffar Ahmad Shah resident of Shalpora Sopore A/P Shalimar Colony Sopore have been booked under PIT-NDPS Act after obtaining formal detention orders from the competent authority. The booked drug peddlers have been detained and subsequently lodged in Central Jail Kot-Balwal Jammu.

Pertinent to mention here that many cases are registered against these drug smugglers and were still involved in drug abuse trade by supplying drugs to the local youth of the Police District Sopore and other areas of the district. Despite their involvement in many FIRs, they did not mend their activities and were again involved in promoting drug abuse trade by supplying drugs to local youth.

2 drug peddlers arrested; contraband substances recovered

KULGAM: Continuing its unwavering efforts to eradicate the menace of drugs from the society, Police have arrested two drug Peddlers in Kulgam and recovered contraband substances from their possession.

A police party of Police Station Qazigund during patrolling at Gulabgh near Khatana Petrol Pump intercepted a suspicious person carrying a nylon bag. During search, officers were able to recover 4.3 Kgs of Poppy Straw like contraband substance filled in the said bag from his possession. He has been identified as Balwinder Kumar son of Mewa Ram a resident of Ratharwan, Pathankot. Moreover, police party of Police Station Qaimoh at a checkpoint established at Naibasti Qaimoh intercepted a suspicious person who tried to flee from the spot but was apprehended tactfully. During search, officers were able to recover 2Kgs of Charas like substance filled in the nylon bag. The accused has been identified as Gulzar Ahmad Allaie son of Abdul Khaliq Allaie resident of Chinigam Chanpora, Frisal. Bothe the accused drug peddlers have been arrested and shifted to respective police stations where they remain in custody.

Accordingly, cases under relevant sections of law have been registered at respective police stations and further investigation have been initiated.

GRP Jammu arrests absconder after 28 years

JAMMU: Continuing special drive against wanted criminals, a specially constitut-

ed team of GRP arrested absconder Kaka Ram, son of Basant Ram alia Harbans Lal, resident of village Bagga Chak, Palli Morh, Tehsil And District Kathua who was hiding in ward No. 3 Tanda Urmar Tehsil: Tanda District: Hoshiarpur Punjab accused In Case FIR No. 01/1996 under section 379/34 RPC Police Station GRP Kathua. He was living In Punjab by changing his name as Kabal Singh S/O Harbans Lal R/O Kotli Jand Tehsil: Tanda District: Hoshiarpur Punjab. He was evading arrest for the last 28 years and finally apprehended after a hot pursuit from neighbouring Punjab state.



Today, the accused has been produced in the Court of Chief Judicial Magistrate Kathua and further lodged in District Jail Kathua as per the order of Court. This Is The Sixth Warrant under section 512 Cr.PC Executed By GRP Jammu In Five Weeks.

Notorious thief arrested, stolen bike recovered

SAMBA: Police arrested a notorious thief in a theft case registered at Police Station Samba and recovered stolen bike for his possession.

On April 20, 2024, a written report was lodged at Police Station Samba by one Rakesh Kumar S/o Ashok Kumar R/o Jatwal Samba, regarding theft of his motorcycle bearing registration No. JK21G-4039 near Chichi Mata Temple, Samba.



Acting upon the complaint, a case FIR No. 107/2024 U/S 379 IPC was registered at PS Samba and investigation started.

During the course of investigation, team of Police Station Samba rounded up one accused namely Rohan Kumar alias Gorav, son of Bobby Kumar, resident of Teli Basti, Bari Brahmana who upon sustained questioning confessed his involvement in the instant case. Further on his disclosure, stolen bike was recovered from Khad at Telli Basti, Bari Brahmana. Investigation of the case is going on.

It pertinent to mention that arrested accused is a notorious thief who was been earlier involved in couple of burglary and theft cases in Samba and Jammu areas. Recoveries were earlier also made from him in case FIR No. 213/2023 U/S 379 IPC of Police Station Samba and FIR No. 22/2024 U/S 457/380 IPC of Police station RS Pura.

Kishtwar's Cybercrime Investigation Unit recovers online defrauded amount of Rs. 1,29,450

District Police Kishtwar, while sharing the details, stated that a complaint was received by Tariq Hussain, son of Bashir Ahmed, residing in Nali Bunjwah, Kishtwar. The complaint outlined that Tariq Hussain received a link from the Telegram App regarding the installation of a 3rd party App (ClerTrip) Mobile Application for working from home. Subsequently, Tariq Hussain continuously sent money, amounting to Rs. 1,29,450, and was eventually defrauded.

During the enquiry into the instant complaint, the Cybercrime Investigation Unit Kishtwar displayed relentless efforts and advanced technical skills, leading to the successful recovery of the defrauded amount of Rs. 1,29,450.

Throughout the year, the team of the Cybercrime Investigation Unit Kishtwar received various applications regarding online scams. They were able to successfully recover a total amount of Rs. 7,16,446.00 (Seven lakh sixteen thousand four hundred forty-six).

Police's cracks down on overloaded vehicles in Kishtwar district; six detained for endangering passengers' lives

KISHTWAR: In a proactive move to uphold public safety on the roads, the District Police Kishtwar conducted a successful operation resulting in the apprehension of six drivers for endangering the lives of passengers through negligent driving and overloading of vehicles.

Under the direction of SSP Kishtwar, various checkpoints were established at key locations by a team of District Police Kishtwar accompanied by Traffic Police NIHW, under the supervision of Dy. SP Hqs Kishtwar, Dr. Ishan Gupta-JKPS. During surprise checks, vehicles were thoroughly inspected. Upon examination, it was discovered that six vehicles were significantly overloaded. Notably, the vehicles involved include Bus JK02BF-4758, Cruiser JK17-7075, Mini Bus JK06-0767, Mini Bus JK17-5682, Tata Sumo JK06-2536, & Mini Bus JK06-0518. exceeding their designated seating capacities. This blatant violation not only contravened the Motor Vehicles Act but also posed a severe risk to the safety and well-being of the passengers.

In response to this grave breach of road safety regulations, the District Police Kishtwar promptly registered FIRs - Case FIR NO.104/2024, 108/2024, 109/2024, 110/2025, & 112/2024 under relevant sections of laws at PS Kishtwar. The detained drivers will face legal consequences for their actions, ensuring accountability for endangering public safety.

Cyber Cell DPO Jammu solves online financial fraud of Rs. 1,40,683

JAMMU: Cyber Cell of District Police Jammu solved three separate online cyber crime complaints.

A complaint was received regarding financial fraud of Rs.26,000. The complainant was given task on review and ratings on Hotels and Restaurant by fraudsters and defrauded an amount of Rs.26000/.

One complaint was received regarding financial fraud of Rs.53,403 in which victim was deceived by fraudsters by giving job to him and defrauded an amount of Rs.53,403/.

A complaint of financial fraud of Rs.19,071 in which victim phone was hacked after clicked a unknown APK file from fraudsters and defrauded an amount of Rs.18,871.

During the investigation, the Cyber Cell DPO Jammu, acted swiftly and exhibited hectic efforts which ultimately led to put on hold an amount of Rs 1,16,930/- out of 1,40,683/ in these three separate online cyber crime complaints. Further investigation is underway.

Bootlegger arrested, 36 quarters of illicit liquor recovered
