The IRCS Rules, 2017 embody the humanitarian mission of the Indian Red Cross Society, aiming to prevent and alleviate suffering without discrimination based on nationality, race, sex, religion, lan-

guage, class, or political opinions. Notably, Schedule IV (Rule 13) mandates the election of key positions within the District Branch, including Chairman/Vice-Chairman and Treasurer, by the District Managing Committee for a term of three years.

above mentioned rules, elections for the Jammu District Branch Committee of IRCS were conducted on July 20, 2023, resulting in the unopposed election of ten Managing Committee Members. A certificate, duly signed by the then Commissioner, Deputy Jammu, was issued to vali-

date the election results.
