CRIME REPORT

6 drug peddlers arrested in Valley; Contraband/psychotropic substances, cash recovered

SRINAGAR: Police arrests 06 drug peddlers and recovered contraband/psychotropic substances & cash from their possession across Kashmir valley.

A police party of Police Station Kunzer headed by SHO PS Kunzer at a checkpoint established at Nangerpora Kunzer, intercepted 02 persons identified as Waseem Ahmad Parray son of Mohd Akbar & Gh Mohd Dar son of Mohd Maqbool, both residents of Yall Pattan. During search, 33 grams of Charas was recovered from their possession.

In Sopore, a police party of Police Post Bus Stand headed by IC PP Bus Stand SI Basit Ahmad under the supervision of SDPO Sopore at a checkpoint established at MRF Chowk Model Town Sopore, intercepted two persons riding a motorcycle bearing registration number JK05F-7415. They have been identified as Rayees Ahmad Sheikh son of Khazir Mohammad Sheikh resident of Seelo Sopore and Siraj ud Din Parray son of Mohammad Mukhtar Parray resident of Parrypora Hadipora Sopore. During search, 216 capsules of SpasmoProxynus Plus, 70 grams of Charas and cash amount of ₹36,000 (proceeds of narcotics) was recovered from their possession. Motorcycle used in the commission of crime has been seized.

Meanwhile, Police Station Pulwama received an information through reliable sources to the effect that one person namely Khurshid Ahmad Lone son of Mohd Sultan Lone resident of Pinglena has concealed Charas Powder at his residence. Accordingly, a case under relevant sections of law has been registered at Police Station Pulwama and during the course of investigation two transparent polythene bags apparently containing grinded charas powder in one bag and semi grinded in other, weighing 1 kg 56 gms and 1 kg 34 gms respectively. The accused has been arrested and investigation of the case is going on.

Similarly in Awantipora, a police party of Police Station Pampore headed by SHO Pampore at a checkpoint established at Gallander Crossing arrested a drug peddler identified as Zubair Shafi Wani son of Mohammad Shafi Wani resident of Tulbagh Pampore. During checking, 101 bottles of banned syrup (Corex Syrup) was recovered from his possession.

All the arrested drug peddlers have been shifted to respective police stations and cases under relevant sections of law have been registered and investigations have been initiated.

6 vehicles seized, 3 persons arrested for illegal extraction & transportation of minerals

KULGAM/SAMBHA: Cracking a whip on illegal extraction and transportation of minerals, police have seized three vehicles and arrested their drivers in Kulgam.

A Police party led by IC PP Mirbazar seized three vehicles (Tippers) at Mirbazar Chowk and arrested their drivers for their involvement in illegal extraction and transportation of minerals.

The accused drivers have been identified as Muzaffar Ahmad Lone son of Abdul Salam Lone resident of Shankarpura dooru, Anantnag, Mohammad Aarif Dar son of Noor Mohammad Dar resident of Hetiwara Lethpora, Awantipora and Aadil Ahmad Lone son of Gull Mohammad Lone resident of Shankarpura Dooru, Anantnag. They have been shifted to Police Station Qazigund where they remain in custody.

Accordingly, a case vide FIR No. 97/2024 under relevant sections of law has been registered at Police Station Qazigund and investigation has been initiated.

In a drive against illegal mining and to tighten noose against the violators, Reasi Police has initiated strict action against the criminals involved in illegal mining & minting money out of the public resources.

In random checking, Police teams of Reasi Police inspected at different locations and seized 03 Vehicles engaged in illegal mining.

In a surprise operation which was carried out at different locations team of Police Station Pouni seized two vehicles bearing registration numbers JK14E-4831 (Dumper) & JK11C-6408 (Tipper) involved in transportation of illegal mining material.

In a separate incident, team of Police Station Arnas laid surprise naka on Narloo Chinkah road and seized one tractor bearing registration number JK20B-5191 involved in transportation of illegal mining material.

After Seizure of these Vehicles Mining Officer was informed for necessary legal action.

Absconder evading arrest from 21 years nabbed

AWANTIPORA: Police have arrested an absconder who has been evading arrest for a long time.

Warrant under section 512 CrPC issued by Hon'ble Court of Principal Session Judge Pulwama pending with Police Station Awantipora against accused person namely Reyaz Ahmad Alaie son of Abdul Rehman resident of Awantipora at present Mehjoor Nagar Srinagar was executed and the person who was evading his arrest from last 21 years involved in case FIR NO. 19/2003 of Police Station Awantipora was arrested by a special Police team under the supervision of Mumtaz Ali Bhatti (SP) SDPO Awantipora.

Subsequently, the arrested accused person was produced before the Court of Law.

Narco smuggler arrested, 3.59 grams heroin recovered

SAMBHA: Continuing its drive against drug smugglers/peddlers, Samba Police on Wednesday arrested a drug peddler in the jurisdiction of Police Station Vijaypur and recovered 3.59 grams approximately heroin from his possession.

A Police party of Police Station Vijaypur headed by SHO PS Vijaypur during special naka established near Shamshan Ghat, Rakh Barotain Vijaypur, has intercepted a car bearing registration number JK02CN-5870 for checking. During checking of the vehicle, 3.59 grams approximately heroin was recovered.

The arrested drug peddler identified as Aman Toga, son of Bachan Lal, resident of Bassi Khurd, Near Kothi Morh, Bari Brahmana has been arrested. A case FIR No 44/2024 U/S 8/21/22/25 NDPS Act has been registered at Police Station Vijaypur and investigation started.

Absconder arrested

RAJOURI: Further tightening noose against absconders, a team of police from Chingus police post in Rajouri has nabbed an absconder who was evading his arrest from years. A team of police headed by Incharge PP Chingus, PSI Maan Singh arrested the absconder Mohammad Tofail son of Mohammad Hafiz resident of Dhara Samwla, Rajouri.

The accused was evading his arrest since 2017 in case FIR No 389/2015 under sections 397/323/34 RPC. A warrant U/S 512 CrPC was also issued against the accused by CJM Court Rajouri. The accused is being produced before the Court of Law.

3 miscreants nabbed, sharp edged weapon recovered

SAMBHA: Samba Police has nabbed three miscreants in the jurisdiction of Police Station Ghagwal and recovered sharp edged weapon (Toka) from the car they were travelling.

A police party of Police Station Ghagwal headed by SHO PS Ghagwal during vehicle checking at nakat-aypal, intercepted a car coming from Kathua side bearing registration no. CH01CE-6847 for checking. During checking, a sharp edged weapon (Toka) has been found lying in the car.

The accused identified as Sikander Singh, son of Bishan Singh, resident of Jasath Ghagwal, Tony Sharma, son of Bishan Das Sharma, resident of Harsath Ghagwal and Rakesh Singh alias Chiku, son of Sham Singh, resident of Jasath Ghagwal have been arrested and the car has also been seized. A case FIR No. 38/2024 u/s 4/25 Arms Act, 34 IPC has been registered at Police Station Ghagwal and investigation started.

Man arrested with desi liquor

RAJOURI: Police arrested a man for production and sale of locally prepared liquor. A team of police from Dharamsal police station headed by SHO Vishal Kumar was

on surprise naka duty at Siot when a man riding on two wheeler was intercepted. During checking and frisking of said person namely Naik Singh son of Puran Singh resident of Tanda, Beri Pattan, police recovered 25 litres of desi liquor.

The liquor was being carried by accused in two wheeler with registration number JK11B 9234.

A case FIR No 36/2024 U/S 48 (a) of Excise Act has been registered at police station Dharamsal and investigation has been set into motion.

Stolen vehicle recovered

BISHNAH: A stolen Mahindra vehicle recovered within days by Bishnah Police Station.

On March 29, 2024 complainant namely Som Dutt, son of Desh Raj, resident of Vill. Sarore Tehsil Bishnah District Jammu lodged a complaint regarding theft of Mahindra vehicle bearing Regd No. JK02AX-4469 from Sarore area.

On the receipt of this information, a case FIR No.34/2024 U/S 379 IPC stands registered at PS Bishna and investigation started.

During the course of investigation Police team of Police Station Bishnah led by SHO P/S Bishnah Inspector Abid Hussain with the help of technical assistance including CCTV footages along with timely human intervention, the police team established a strategic checkpoint near Sukatiar Domail, Jammu resulting in the successful retrieval of the stolen vehicle.

This swift and efficient recovery was achieved within days by SHO Police Station Bishnah and his team under the meticulous supervision of SDPO R.S.Pura & close supervision of SP Headquarters Jammu.

Further efforts are going on for the arrest of involved accused so that forward/backward linkage may be exposed accordingly.

Mobile phone recovered from District Jail; probe ordered

JAMMU: The authorities have yet again recovered one more mobile phone from the jail complex in high security District Jail Ambphalla in Jammu city.

Official sources said that on specific inputs, searches were carried out in the barracks wherein hardcore criminals are lodged especially those detained under PSA. A mobile phone was found near the barracks. The matter is being probed to ascertain the facts.

However, the jail authorities have lodged the complaint with the police. Here it is relevant to mention that in last four months, six cases have been registered with the Police Station Gharota related to recovery of narcotics and mobile phones from the inmates of Central Jail, Kot Bhalwal.

Notably, few days ago, jail authorities also recovered one mobile phone from the possession of Lashkar-e-Taiba terrorist lodged in the Kot Bhalwal jail.

In another case, a smartphone was recovered from a prisoner identified as Habib of Haria Chak in Kathua and was handed over to Jammu and Kashmir Police.

"We are trying to look into this security breach that how this smartphones got inside the jail," said the jail authorities. The recovered smartphone is from a Chinese manufacturer 'POCO'.

Here it is relevant to mention that On November 22, 2023, consignment of drugs was recovered from inside a cricket ball in the jail, on November 28, narcotics was seized, on January 2, mobile phones and earphones were recovered from inside the jail premises, on January 9, a mobile phone was recovered from the possession of a prisoner, on January 9 itself, three mobile phones were recovered from the jail premises and on January 11, one more mobile phone was recovered from a prisoner inside the central jail. Today a mobile phone has been recovered from District Jail, Jammu.

LS polls: Cash, liquor worth Rs 91 lakh seized in Kathua

JAMMU: More than Rs 51 lakh in cash and liquor worth nearly Rs 40 lakh were seized in Jammu and Kashmir's Kathua district on Wednesday, taking the total seizures to Rs 1.20 crore since the enforcement of the model code of conduct for the Lok Sabha elections, officials said.

Enforcement teams intercepted some vehicles and seized Rs 51.54 lakh in cash along with liquor valued at Rs 39.63 lakh, they said.

These decisive actions underscore a collective commitment to preserving the integrity of the electoral process, they added.

District Election Officer of Kathua Rakesh Minhas said, "We are continuously working to swiftly and resolutely identify and rectify any breach of the model code of conduct."

He emphasized that such efforts are pivotal in deterring illicit activities that may compromise the democratic process and ensuring that voters can exercise their rights without any external influence or coercion.

The administration urged citizens to remain vigilant and promptly report any suspicious activity or violation of the poll code to the authorities concerned.

On March 28, cash and liquor worth Rs 29 lakh were seized in Jammu and Kashmir's Kathua district.
