MUMBAI: The Reserve Bank on Friday retained GDP growth forecast of 7 per cent for 2024-25 financial year, lower than the 7.6 per cent expansion estimated for FY24.

In its February monetary policy, the RBI had projected the GDP growth rate of 7per cent for the financial year beginning April 1.

Announcing the current fiscal's first bi-monthly monetary policy, RBI Governor Shaktikanta Das said the rural demand is gathering pace, and sustained growth in manufacturing sector should boost private invest-

EC teams seize Rs 1 crore cash from vehicle in Arunachal

ITANAGAR: The flying squad and static surveillance team deployed by the Election Commission in Arunachal Pradesh seized Rs one crore cash from a vehicle in Longding district, a police officer said.

The cash was seized from the vehicle at Kanubari check gate on Thursday evening by the EC teams, the officer said. The vehicle which belongs to one Harshvardhan Singh, executive director of a private construction company, was following the convoy of Meghalaya Chief Minister Conrad Sangma, who went to Longding to address a party's election rally, he said.

"The vehicle was not part of the CM's convoy but was following the motorcade, Longding Superintendent of Police (SP) Dekio Gumja said. The income tax department was informed about the cash seizure and it will investigate the case and subsequently action will be taken as per the standard operating procedure, Gumja said. "Initial investigation suggested that the cash was meant for labourers payment by the construction company, whose works are

(UBT) has accused the BJP of making the bowand-arrow symbol disappear from many parts of Maharashtra after the saffron party started claiming the seats that were earlier contested by the undivided Shiv Sena.

In an editorial in party mouthpiece 'Saamana' on Friday, the Uddhav Thackeray-led Sena (UBT) said the undivided Shiv Sena used to contest in 23 of the 48 seats in Maharashtra on its bowand-arrow symbol.

Sena (UBT), which is a part of the opposition Maha



Aghadi, also claimed that the BJP high command was behind the move not to repeat many sitting Shiv Sena MPs.

The Eknath Shinde-led Shiv Sena has not renominated Bhayana Gawli. Krupal Tumane and Hemant Patil, sitting MPs

Yavatmal-Washim, Ramtek and Hingoli.

"But the Shinde group (Shiv Sena) is not even getting half of the seats now (in the seat-sharing agreement) and the BJP has made the bow-and-arrow symbol disappear in four-five seats," the editorial said.

Shiv Sena, BJP and Ajit Pawar-led NCP are part of the ruling Mahayuti alliance in the state. The Sena (UBT) alleged

that the BJP also made the bow-and-arrow symbol disappear in Sindhudurg-Ratnagiri, a seat traditionally represented by the Bal Thackeray-founded party but is now being claimed by the saffron outfit.

The editorial wondered if Shiv Sena's symbol will endure in Kalyan and Thane, the bastions of Chief Minister Eknath Shinde. His son Shrikant Shinde is the sitting MP from Kalyan.

"There is a remote possibility that those being nominated for the Lok Sabha polls will win. So the BJP has erased the historic bowand-arrow symbol from the political scene Maharashtra," the editorial

added. The Sena (UBT), which got the 'flaming torch' symbol, has so far announced

candidates for 21 seats. The Shinde-led Sena has declared candidates in nine seats, the BJP 24, the NCP four and its ally Rashtriya Samaj Paksha in one constituency. Candidates for ten seats are yet to be announced by the Mahayuti.

The 48 Lok Sabha seats in Maharashtra will go to polls in five phases between April 19 and May 20 and votes will be counted on June 4.

trend in global markets. The six-member rate-setting panel of the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) on Friday kept the benchmark interest rates unchanged at 6.5 per cent for the seventh time in a row. It also expressed concerns over food inflation, given IMD's prediction of above-normal maximum temperatures

during April-June. The 30-share BSE Sensex inched up 20.59 points or 0.03 per cent to settle at a fresh record of 74,248.22. The index oscillated between the intra-day peak of 74,361.11 and the low of 73,946.92.

The broader NSE Nifty ended with a marginal loss of 0.95 points at 22,513.70. As many as 28 components of the 50-share benchmark ended in the

"Although the RBI policy meeting unfolded as anticipated, concerns over food inflation and warnings of a heat wave tampered sentiment. While the main domestic indices concluded with marginal movement, the Bank Nifty edged higher, propelled by robust credit growth in Q4 FY24.

"The global sentiment was dampened by the rise in oil prices and tensions in the Middle East. Investors remain attentive to upcoming US non-farm payroll and unemployment data, seeking clarity on the

Federal Reserve's future rate path," Vinod Nair, Head of Research, Geoitt Financial Services, said.

Kotak Bank was the largest gainer in the Sensex pack, rising 2.09 per cent, followed by Bajaj Finserve, HDFC Bank, ITC, SBI, M&M and ICICI Bank. On the other hand,

UltraTech Cement, L&T, Bajaj Bharti Airtel, Finance and Mahindra were among the laggards. Among sectoral indices,
