With the advent of digital technology, libraries have also evolved to offer online resources, e-books, and virtual learning opportunities, thereby expanding their reach and relevance.



JAMMU: To discuss age criteria for the admission of the students in class 1st for the academic session 2025-26 in both government and private schools a meeting was organized by Rashpal Singh (President District Kathua).

During the meeting it was highlighted by the members that the children who had been admitted at the age of 2+ in nursery class now have completed three years in the pre-primary level.

They are in the age group of 5+ years and withholding admission of all such students in the same class by a year for not completing their age 6+ on or before March 31st of the academic year will attribute a loss of their academic year. They also showed their helplessness to convince all those parents who are pressurizing the school authorities to promote their children in the next

tion Ajay Gupta briefed the members that NEP -2020 was implemented in JKUT from the academic session 2022-23. The matter for the implementation of NEP gradually and in the phased manner was ${\it demanded} \quad \ {\it in} \quad \ {\it JKUT}.$ Education School Department gave relaxation of 06 months to the students (i.e. students completing 06 years of age up to September 30) in the previous academic sessions 2023-24 & 2024-25.
