Not a 'national disaster': Omar

RAMBAN: Jammu and Kashmir Chief Minister Omar Abdullah on Monday said the devastation caused by flash floods and landslides triggered by heavy rain and cloudbursts in Ramban district could not be declared a "national disaster" even as he assured adequate relief to the affected families.

Abdullah was speaking to reporters at Kela Morh, a few kilometres from the Ramban district headquarters along the Jammu-Srinagar National Highway. The highway was shut for a second consecutive day due to multiple landslides in the area. Addressing the 17th Civil Services Day function here, he said the civil servants should see themselves not just as administrators but as architects of a

Modi said that India has become the most populous country in the world and emphasised the prioritisation of saturation in basic amenities and a strong focus on last-mile

Citing evolving needs and aspirations of the citizens, he said that the civil service must adapt to contemporary challenges to remain

The prime minister said that the achievements so far must be surpassed manifold, setting higher benchmarks for progress.

He stressed the importance of human judgment in a technology-driven world, urging civil servants to remain sensitive, listen to the voices of the underprivileged, understand

RBI permits minors above 10 years to operate bank accounts independently

MUMBAI: The Reserve Bank on Monday permitted banks to allow minors above the age of 10 years to open and operate savings/ term deposit accounts independ-

The Reserve Bank of India has issued revised instructions on opening and operation in the deposit accounts of minors.

Minors of any age may be allowed to open and operate savings and term deposit accounts through his/ her natural or legal guardian, the RBI said in a circular addressed to commercial banks and cooperative banks. They may also be allowed to open such accounts with their mother as guardian.

"The banks are free to offer additional banking facilities like internet banking, ATM/ debit cards, cheque book facility, etc, to the minor account holders basis their risk management policy, product suitability and customer appropriateness," the circular said.

VATICAN CITY: Pope Francis, history's first Latin American pontiff who charmed the world with his humble style and concern for the poor but alienated conservatives with critiques of capitalism and climate change, died Monday. He was 88.

Ramban landslide: All 50 pilgrims from Gujarat safe

GANDHINAGAR: All 50 pilgrims from Gujarat who were stranded in the landslide incident in Ramban in Jammu-Kashmir are safe, Gujarat Commissioner of Relief Alok Kumar Pandey said here on Monday.

Three persons were killed and more than 100 people rescued after cloudburst-induced floods and landslides on Sunday caused massive damage to infrastructure, including roads and residential buildings, in Ramban district in the northern Union Territory.

Upon learning that pilgrims from Gujarat were stranded due to the landslide incident, Chief Minister Bhupendra Patel promptly instructed authorities to coordinate with the J-K government and ensure the safety ■ CONTD ON PAGE 9

Search ops launched following suspicious movement near Samba
