

JAMMU/SRINAGAR: Jammu and Kashmir Lieutenant Governor Manoj Sinha on Tuesday condemned the terror attack in the tourist resort of Pahalgam in south Kashmir's Anantnag district and vowed to bring the perpetrators to justice. Amit Shah reaches Srinagar, briefed on Pahalgam terror attack

SRINAGAR: Home Minister Amit Shah arrived in Srinagar to review the security situation in Kashmir following a deadly terror attack in Pahalgam in which 26 people were killed, officials said.

Hours after the attack Union Minister, Amit Shah chairing security meeting at Srinagar. on tourists. Shah rushed to Srinagar and drove straight to the Raj Bhavan from the airport.

JAMMU: BJP National General Secretary Tarun Chugh on Tuesday said that Pakistan ISI's nefarious designs of disturbing peace in Jammu and Kashmir would be decisively defeated by the security forces.

While condemning the terrorists' attack on tourists in the Pahalgam, Chugh said in a state ment that it was an act of cowardice and was strongly reprehensible.

JAMMU: Security has been beefed up across Jammu as various parties, including Pradesh Congress Committee (PCC), have called for a general strike and protests on Wednesday to condemn a deadly terror attack on tourists in south Kashmir's Pahalgam tourist

JAMMU: A wanted gangster died in a scuffle with cops while trying to escape from police custody along with an aide near here, an official said on Tuesday.

Four cops escorting wanted criminal Mushtaq Ali alias Raj Ali alias Bacchu Don from Puniab to Jammu were also got injured in the incident, a police spokesman

Sharing details of the incident, he said a police party from Jammu rounded up Ali and his associate, both wanted in a number of criminal cases in Jammu, Kathua and Samba, from the Baba Batala area of Amritsar

Terrorists cursed Modi, asked my father to recite Islamic verse before shooting him: Daughter

MUMBAI: The family was cowering in fear inside a tent when terrorists came. They asked Santosh Jagdale, 54, to come out and recite an Islamic verse. When he couldn't, they shot him thrice: once in the head, then behind the ear and then his back

The 26-year-old daughter of the Pune businessman recounted to PTI the terror the family went through in the horrific attack in Pahalgam in Jammu and Kashmir on Tuesday.

After her father fell to the ground, the gunmen turned on her uncle who was lying next to her and shot him sev-

eral times in the back.

"We were a group of five people, including my parents. We were in Baisaran Valley near Pahalgam and were at a spot called Mini Switzerland when the firing began," Asavari Jagdale told PTI in a telephonic interview five hours after the shooting.

Asavari does not know if her father and uncle are alive or among the dead. She, her mother and anoth-

er female relative were spared, and locals and security forces evacuated them to Pahaloam Club where they remain clueless about the fate of the two men.

Asavari, 26, a human resource professional in

Pune, said the family was on a vacation at the idvllic spot when they heard firing from "people who wore clothes similar to those of local police" descending from the

nearby hill. "We immediately rushed to a nearby tent for protection. So did six to seven others (tourists). We all lay down on the ground as protection against the firing which we then assumed was between
