RTO Jammu cracks down on overloading, wrong parking & traffic violations

JAMMU: In a decisive move to regulate traffic and curb violations, Team RTO Jammu, under the directions of Transport Commissioner Vishesh Mahajan and the guidance of RTO Jammu Jasmeet Singh, conducted a special drive at Bikram Chowk to tackle overloading by mini-buses, wrong parking by taxis, private cars, and three-wheelers, as well as inspections of school buses.

During the operation, three-wheeler drivers were warned against unauthorized parking in front of the Railway Station and behind Shiv Market, particularly on the main road in front of Vaishnavi Dham. Additionally, shopkeepers in Shiv Market were instructed to avoid parking their vehicles on the main road to prevent traffic congestion. The crackdown saw approximately 200 vehicles checked, out of which 35 vehicles were e-challaned for various violations, and two vehicles were seized. The estimated fine collected from e-challans is around Rs.60,000. The enforcement team included ARTO FS J-1 Er. Bipen Singh Charak, ARTO Mohd Salim, MVIs Azad Hussain and Surender Kumar, and MVTA Taranjot Singh. Authorities have reiterated their commitment to maintaining road discipline and ensuring a smooth traffic flow in Jammu.

Shiv Sena demands inquiry into expenditure incurred on cleaning of Ranbir Canal

Historical Ranbir Canal is turning into a dirty drain: Sahni

JAMMU: Shiv Sena (UBT) Jammu-Kashmir unit has demanded strict action against the concerned department and officials on the increasing dirt and plight of Ranbir Canal, which is considered to be the historical heritage of Jammu and the lifeline of the farmers, and an inquiry into the funds spent on cleaning. In a press conference held today at the party's state central office, state chief



Manish Sahni said that in 1905, Maharaja Ranveer Singh had built the 60 km long Ranbir Canal to supply water from the Chenab

river of Akhnoor to the fields of farmers in hundreds of rural areas of Jammu district. While Ranbir Canal became the lifeline of the farmers, it also provided relief to the people of Jammu from the scorching heat. But for the last few years, due to the indifferent attitude of the concerned department and the government, this historical heritage has taken the form of a garbage dump. The garbage floating on the water makes the historical canal look like a dirty drain. Despite spending crores of rupees every year for cleaning and repair, the condition of the canal remains the same. In almost every place of Jammu city, including Trikuta Nagar, Akhnoor Road, Mutthi, Mira Saheb etc., the water level of the canal is low and heaps of garbage are clearly visible floating on the water. Sahni said that water is released in the canal before Baisakhi festival and this year also preparations have been made to release water in the canal without cleaning. Sahni has taken strict cognizance of the Lieutenant Governor and Chief Minister of Jammu and Kashmir and has demanded an inquiry into the expenditure incurred on cleaning the canal and strict action against the negligent attitude of the department officials.
