Subsequently, he will attend another meeting at the Raj Bhavan in Srinagar where the security situation in Jammu and Kashmir will be reviewed, officials said.

On March 21, while replying to a debate on the working of the Home Ministry in the Rajya Sabha, Shah shared data on Jammu and Kashmir and said that between 2004 and 2014, there were 7,217 terrorist incidents, but from 2014 to 2024, the number dropped to 2,242.

During this period, the total number of deaths decreased by 70 per cent, the numper of civilian deaths reduced by 81 per cent and the casualties of security personnel went down by 50 per cent.

From 2010 to 2014, an average of 2,654 organised stone-pelting incidents occurred every year, but in 2024, not a single such incident occurred.

There were 132 organised strikes during 2010-14, but there has been none in 2024. In stone-pelting incidents, 112 civilians were killed, and 6,000 were injured, out now stone-pelting has completely stopped.

In 2004, there were 1,587 terrorist incidents, while in 2024, this number was reduced to just 85. In 2004, the number of civilian deaths was 733, but in 2024, it was reduced to 26, and the number of security forces' deaths dropped from 331 in 2004 to 31 in 2024, Shah had said.

The home minister had said that Prime Minister Narendra Modi laid the foundaion of democracy in Kashmir while adding that the government now "deals with tercorists by shooting them between the eyes as soon as they are spotted".

The bridge carries a deep cultural significance. According to the Ramayana, the

construction of Ram Setu was initiated from Dhanushkodi near Rameswaram. The bridge, linking Rameswaram to the mainland, stands as a remarkable feat of Indian engineering on the global stage. It is built at a cost of over Rs 550 crore. It is 2.08 km in length, features 99 spans and a 72.5-metre vertical lift span that rises up to a height of 17 metres, facilitating smooth movement of larger ships while ensuring seamless train operations, it said.

Constructed with stainless steel reinforcement, high-grade protective paint, and fully welded joints, the bridge boasts increased durability and reduced maintenance needs. It is designed for dual rail tracks to accommodate future demands. A special polysiloxane coating protects it from corrosion, ensuring longevity in the harsh marine environment.

In 1914, British engineers constructed the original Pamban Bridge, a cantilever (a long piece of metal or wood that extends from a wall to support the end of a bridge) structure with a Scherzer Rolling Lift span to connect Rameswaram Island with mainland India.

For over a century, it served as a critical lifeline for pilgrims, tourists, and trade. However, the harsh marine environment and growing transportation demands necessitated a modern solution. In 2019, the Government of India sanctioned the construction of a technologically advanced, future-ready replacement.

The new Pamban Bridge was constructed by Rail Vikas Nigam Limited (RVNL), a Navratna PSU under the Ministry of Railways overcoming several challenges, including environmental obstacles to logistical complexities, the Palk Strait's turbulent waters, strong winds, and unpredictable weather patterns created difficulties in the construction process

Additionally, the region's susceptibility to cyclones and seismic activity necessitated careful planning and robust design. It shares similarities with other globally recognised bridges known for their technological advancements and unique designs. These include the Golden Gate Bridge in the United States, Tower Bridge in London and the Oresund Bridge in Denmark-Sweden. Each of these iconic structures, though different in design and functionality, represents a pinnacle of engi-

"Now, the new Pamban Bridge stands proudly in their company, combining cutting-edge technology with the challenges posed by India's coastal and seismic conditions," the release said.

However, it draws a firm line against qualifications obtained through franchising arrangements, stating that these would not be eligible for equivalence.

The rules are expected to significantly benefit Indian students who study abroad and seek to continue their academic or professional journey in India.

The regulations, however, do not apply to professional qualifications in disciplines such as medicine, pharmacy, nursing, law, and architecture -- areas governed by respective statutory councils in India.

"These regulations mark a positive step to align the Indian education system with global standards. It will provide a transparent and easy mechanism to recognise foreign qualifications obtained by the students. With this, we aim to enhance opportunities for students and promote academic exchange," said UGC Chairperson M Jagadesh Kumar.

The UGC has also clarified that equivalence would be granted to qualifications awarded by foreign institutions duly recognised in their home countries. These include institutions listed by designated accreditation or recognition agencies

"The process ensures only qualifications from reasonably reputed foreign institutions are recognised. This safeguards the interests of Indian students and the integrity of Indian higher education while matching global standards," Kumar said. The UGC will also operate a dedicated online portal for receiving and processing applications for equivalence certificates. A standing committee of experts will exam-

ine these applications and make recommendations. If an applicant is dissatisfied with a decision, they may seek a review through a review committee constituted by the UGC.

Equivalence certificates issued under the regulations will be valid for pursuing higher education and research in India, as well as seeking employment opportuni-

According to the UGC, the final regulations were shaped after "careful consideration of the extensive public feedback received on the draft regulations issued in 2023", reflecting a consultative and inclusive policy-making process.

## Waqf Bill gets President's assent STATE TIMES NEWS

NEW DELHI: President Droupadi Murmu on Saturday gave her assent to the Waqf (Amendment) Bill, 2025, which was passed by Parliament earlier this week. Murmu also gave her assent to the Mussalman Wakf (Repeal) Bill, 2025.

"The following Act of Parliament received the assent of the president on April 5, 2025, and is hereby published for general information: The Waqf (Amendment) Act, 2025," the government said in a notification. Parliament early on Friday approved the Bill after the Rajya Sabha gave its nod

to the contentious legislation following an over 13-hour debate. The discussion witnessed staunch objections from opposition parties, which termed the Bill "anti-Muslim" as well as "unconstitutional", while the government

responded that the "historic reform" would benefit the minority community. The Bill was passed in the Rajya Sabha with 128 members voting in favour and 95 opposing it. It was passed in the Lok Sabha early on Thursday, with 288 mem-

bers supporting it and 232 against it. Parliament had also approved the Mussalman Wakf (Repeal) Bill, with the Rajya Sabha giving its nod. The Lok Sabha had already given its assent to the Bill.

After the president gave her assent, it has also become a law.

Congress MP Mohammad Jawed and All India Majlis-e-Ittehadul Muslimeen (AIMIM) president Asaduddin Owaisi on Friday challenged the validity of the Waqf (Amendment) Bill in the Supreme Court, saying it violated constitutional provisions. Jawed's plea alleged the Bill imposed "arbitrary restrictions" on Waqf properties and their management, undermining the religious autonomy of the Muslim community. The petition, filed through advocate Anas Tanwir, said it discriminated against the Muslim community by "imposing restrictions that are not present in the governance of other religious endowments".


