According to some knowledgeable persons an amount of Rs 25 lakh to Rs 27 lakh was donated to the bank account given on the Facebook page within two days. Soon it was discovered that the bank account did not belong to the poor family of Dooru. Sources said that at least three identical cases have surfaced in the last 10 days.

"The fraudulent beneficiaries post the picture or video of a poor family, add melancholic audio-visuals effects to it and the narrator makes passionate appeals to the common people to donate money to the same family in the holy month of Ramadan. Quite a large number of the gullible people take it as genuine and transfer donations to the same account. without knowing that the phone number and the bank account belong to a different person.
