

PRIORITIZING RURAL DEVELOPMENT

Alaying all rumors and misconceptions spread by politicians, especially that of opposition parties regarding Government's apathy towards proper development and progress of the rural areas, the LG Manoj Sinha has made it clear that the administration is quite alive towards the issues faced by rural populace and directed all the concerned departments to accord prioritized treatment to rural development without any failure, so that rural areas are developed at par with other urban areas of the Union Territory. Highlighting the need for ensuring provision for requisite infrastructure for providing necessary facilities to the rural populace, the LG straightway said that development of rural belts in the Union Territory is a must, as the road to prosperity of J&K has to pass through its villages. With this significant statement, the LG has made clear the intensions of the administration regarding ensuring development in all belts and hamlets of J&K, without any sort of discrimination. Besides directing the executing authorities to provide top most priority to the rural areas, while formulating development schemes and plans, he also asked for ensuring implementation of the same without any laxity, so that the residents of rural areas can also enjoy all facilities like others residing in urban areas of J&K and event outside UT. Pertinent to mention here that a major chunk of the J&K's population reside in rural areas and is dependent on agriculture and other allied activities. To ensure development on agrarian front, for ultimately enhancing the socio-economic status of people and making them self-sufficient, the LG stressed for adopting latest techniques to increase the produce for empowering the farmers financially. This statement of LG is an apt answer to all those, who just for sake for petty benefits and registering their presence on political front, often make abortive bids to misguide gullible masses residing in rural areas by alleging that the Government is only working for the rich and those living in urban areas. It has shown that for the administration all citizens are equal, without any discrimination of favoritism, and even the rural areas would be accorded prioritized treatment on development front.

The government has to take some stern steps to end the vicious cycle of violence as terrorists are continuously targeting people in Valley despite security forces and police claiming that they have eliminated many among those involved in such killings and attacks. JUBILANT J&K Accountable, transparent system for recruitments established in UT ‘Yogyata Se Rozgar’ celebrates spirit of ‘merit’ in public employment

Government of Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir has established an accountable and transparent system for the recruitment of various posts in different departments. Article 16 of the Constitution of India lays down that, "There shall be equality of opportunity for all citizens in matters of employment under the State". It enshrines the principle of fairness and equality in public employment. However, the allegations of nepotism and patronage present a serious challenge to this hallowed provision of our constitution.

In keeping with the spirit of the Constitution, the UT of J&K has embarked on a journey of ensuring transparency and accountability while appointing candidates to various public posts. Apart from record number of posts being advertised by JKSSB, JKPS and other recruiting agencies, the prime focus has been on ensuring that meritorious candidates are selected without any undue favour. The interview stage has been done away

with for non-gazetted posts as a measure of reform. More than 20,000 posts were advertised in current year and 10,831 selections have been made till now. The remaining posts are under process for fast-track recruitment and will be completed soon. The recent appointment of candidates to around 8,500 class-IV posts is a welcome sign of the reforms carried out by the UT of J&K.

Apart from these posts, the recruitment process for filling up 1,850 posts (350 Probationary Officers & 1,500 Banking Associates) was completed in a highly transparent manner by engaging IBPS to conduct the examination followed by an interview conducted by the experts. Gone are the days of favouritism and nepotism while making appointment to these posts.

Flying a drone is an exciting, captivating, and intriguing activity that has grown in popularity worldwide. But new questions are now being asked, how profitable can flying a drone be as a career? Career Opportunities in Drone sector: Civil Aviation Ministry estimates India's drone sector to achieve a total turnover of Rs. 120-150billion (US\$ 1.63-2.04 billion) by 2026, from its current turnover of about Rs. 800 million (US\$ 10.88million). In addition, the government plans to attract investments of Rs. 5,000 crore (US\$ 669.07million) in the next three years in the drone manufacturing industry and create job opportunities. The government is also encouraging start-ups and MSMEs (Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises) to invest in drone technology by easing the eligible annual sales bracket at a minimum level-Rs. 2 crore (US\$ 267.63 thousand) for drones and Rs. 50 lakh (US\$ 66.91 thousand) for drone components.

A Drone Service Technician conducts routine maintenance, troubleshoots and repairs malfunctioning or defective Drone while ensuring adherence to standard working practices. The individuals in this job maintain and repair drones of varying sizes that are used in various applications such as taking aerial photos or videos, transporting goods, firefighting and emergency operations, power line inspections, clandestine inspections, etc. Replace the faulty board and components and perform basic /SMD soldering/de-soldering. Disassemble and assemble different parts of the drone for testing and repair. Understand different batteries used for power supply of drones, their specifications and testing. Application and testing of different sensors used in drone, testing of different motors BLDC etc, Electronic Speed Controller card and it's connectivity with motor. Testing of flight controllers and the communication between transmitter and receiver and its calibration. Testing of landing gear, GPS Module, collision avoidance sensor and it's connectivity with console. Testing of transmitter, the control box to receiver at drone and the communication link. Testing of Gimbal Motor, Controller and its programming. The individual in this job identifies different applications in agriculture, surveillance, security and to test the additional specific application-based components to connect with drone.

The individual must have attention to detail, logical thinking, and ability to execute the repair and maintenance activity as per client's requirement. The individual should be good at following instructions and work collaboratively with diverse teams. S/he must stay abreast with technology changes and demonstrate strong technical expertise. Also, S/he must exhibit good customer service attribute - courtesy, problem-solving, reliability, good decision-making skills, etc.

Electronics Sector Skills Council of India (ESSCI), which is an apex body for skill development and certification in the electronics domain, under the aegis of Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneur, has developed 'Qualification Packs' (QPs) aligning to international standards for Drone Service Technician job role. The council has aligned its skilling competencies with the industry requirements and is making an all-out effort in meeting the industry requirements for skilled and certified Drone Service Technician with relevant technical capabilities, thus giving a boost to the growth of the sector along with creating employment opportunities for the youth of the country. Electronics Sector Skills Council of India (ESSCI) is building an eco-system for drone technology and making a pool of industry and academia. Recently, ESSCI has signed two MoU, one with Kaushalya - The Skill University and another with IG Drone, a leading player of the drone sector for developing university-based curriculum and industry-oriented training.

To become a Drone Service Technician, you would require: A strong interest in aviation; Ability to think in 3D; Strong concentration skills; Ability to remain calm under pressure; IT & Math skills; a good knowledge of various types and properties of Drone; Good analytical skills; and Awareness of latest Drone Technology.

One can join Aviation industry/other sectors as drone technician for implementing different applications of Drone and will progress further as Senior Technician, Supervisor and can rise-up to the level of Manager.

A candidate can work in a Drone service center as a specialist or start his own Drone Training Centre and become Entrepreneur in the related field. At the initial stage, a skilled person can earn around Rs 5 - 6 lakh. With the experience and expertise, one's income can potentially increase.
