SRINAGAR: Union Minister of State (Independent Charge) Ministry of Earth Sciences, Minister of State (Independent Charge) Ministry of Science and Technology, MoS PMO and Minister of State Ministry of Personnel and Public Grievances, Dr Jitendra Singh, on Tuesday said that Kashmir has huge potential in Agriculture and Dairy sectors which is largely unexplored and the Govt under PM Narendra Modi will support Start-Ups in these sectors. He said, the government is always ready to support the potential Start-Ups and the Union Ministry of Science & Technology has several schemes and funds to support such potential Start-Ups.

He said, though COVID caught us unaware, it made us realise our intrinsic potential and capacities.

Proposed hike in power tariff black warrant for industrial sector: BBIA

JAMMU: To discuss proposed hike in power tariff for Industry sector as per petition filed by Jammu Power Distribution Corporation Ltd (JPDC), suggesting an increase of average 40 per cent with substantial increase in Fixed/Demand Charges for the 2022-23, a meeting of the advisory/ Executive Committee of Bari Brahmana Industries Association held on Monday under the leadership of its President. Others present in the meeting included Arun Singla Senior Vice President, Ajay Langer Vice President, Viraj Malhotra General Secretary and Rajesh Jain besides other members. During the meeting, the members flayed JPDC for its proposal to hike average approximately 40 per cent power tariff along with substantial increase in Fixed/Demand Charges for year 2022-23 for Industrial sector; resulting uncertainty among minds of existing owners of industries and prospective Investors, who are in process of setting up of new units in J&K. Terming the proposal as a black warrant for industrial sector, the members condemned the move. "This is an unjustified move as department has failed to reduce AT&C Losses. JPDC has mentioned in the Writ Petition with the justification of gap between Purchase and Supply of Energy which is, in our opinion, only due excessive Transmission Losses in comparison to National Level, whereas in respect of Industrial Units working in Bari Brahmana Industrial Complex, the Transmission Losses are well within prescribed limit of Power Development Department which is 7 per cent to 8 per cent," they said, adding that Government should take preventive measures to plug loopholes in the system and try to control transmission losses in other areas too that Industries besides improving Infrastructure to control transmission losses in place of putting extra burden on already suffering masses.

JAMMU: Government College Women Parade Ground on Tuesday organized a one day Field Visit of students on Functioning of Panchayati Raj Institution in Jammu District.

The students' visit was conducted in collaboration with Sohagani Panchayat, Block Marh Jammu. Students of the Department of Political Science visited the Panchayat Sohagani. The village Sarpanch, Daljeet Singh Manhas interacted with the students and shared the information regarding the developmental programmes for the Panchayat. The Panchayat having a population of four thousand and 195 households consists of five villages. It has achieved the target to provide pension to each and every old age person, 550 Ayushman cards, 600 domicile certificates and 175 labour cards to the villagers. So far as the problems of this Panchayat are concerned, the proper functioning of the health centre at village Chakrali needs immediate attention. Release of funds, roads connectivity etc. are some of the important issues to be fulfilled. Dr S.P. Sarswat, the Principal GCW Parade Ground encouraged and motivated the students for the field visit especially to know the functioning of the Panchayati Raj

they strive for. Commenting that the youth should look beyond government jobs as a source of livelihood, Dr Singh said that start-ups are the thing of the future and the youth should prepare themselves for a change in mindset. He said that India has around 70,000 start-ups now as compared to just a few hundred some years back. Dr Singh said that agriculture and dairy sectors have immense potential in a place like Kashmir and

the youngsters should evaluate the opportunities that lay in front of them in these fields.

He assured all possible help to the youth from the government in setting up employment generating units for themselves. The minister said that the world has started to look up to Narendra Modi as a global leader. He added that the world is ready to be led by India, but the question is whether we are ready to lead the world.


