Shri Triloki Nath Dhar

The demise of **Shri Triloki Nath Dhar** on May 3, 2022 is a great loss for Kashmiri Pandit community. Shri Triloki Nath Dhar was a renowned personality in Kashmiri literary, religious and social spheres. He was a polymath with contributions in fields of story-writing, novels, poetry, philosophy, religion, politics and social charge. His multiple achievements are deeply motivated by Hindu philosophical thoughts and ideas.

Shri Triloki Nath Dhar was born on June 6, 1930 at Srinagar, to Shri Shyam Lal Dhar and Smt Arundhati Dhar. He completed his B.Sc from Punjab in 1948. He was active on social and political fronts, right from his student days. After graduation, Shri Triloki Nath Dhar was offered an opportunity to work with Radio Kashmir. Later, he remained associated with All India Radio and Doordarshan Srinagar, handling varied roles and responsibilities. As an author, he has a dozen books to his credit, including Short Romances, Life teachings and Philosophy of Rupa Bhawani, Tale of a Soviet Biologist, and Holy Virgin: Retelling of story of Mata Vaishno Devi, among many others. Some of these names are pivotal works in their own fields. He has also written two anthologies on modern poetry-Cascades and Inspiration in North East. He authored the first detailed exposition of verses of Rupa Bhawani in English, which is easy to understand while at the same time retaining complex spiritual nuances contained within each verse.


The upliftment of Hindu consciousness and Love for the country was one of his life-long endeavours. His book, The Battered Hindu, is one of the most impactful works which aimed at fulfilling this endeavour.

Beyond his literary works, he was a theological preacher and used to give lectures from auspices of the Vedic Bhawan from 1972 to 1974. He occupied leadership roles in Kashmiri social and religious organizations and was General Secretary of Bhokatkeshwar Bhairov Nath Trust and All-India Saraswat Cultural Organization in 1970. He led Kashmiri Pandits on land-row concerning the centuries-old Bhairov Nath Temple.

Apart from many accolade, his legacy lies in his day-to-day teachings, mentorship, Karma and the love, he showered on his family. He was a lively person with a zest for perfection and progress. Despite being immersed in the divine, he believed in an integral approach to spirituality, much along with same lines as Shri Aurobindo and Swami Vivekanand. While he stressed on meditation, worshipping of Deities and mysticism, he never neglected the study of Sciences, Arts and Literature. He enjoyed rich tastes in food and clothing. A staunch advocate of Women's Rights & Empowerment, upliftment of Hindu consciousness and Dharmic living, his thoughts and ideas came alive through his persona. His demise is a great loss to Kashmir Pandit community and Hindu ethos. We all should follow his footsteps and become more integral in life and Yoga.

CRIME REPORT

Missing mother-son duo traced within 6 hours

BUDGAM: Police on Wednesday traced a mother along with her minor son within 6 hours after a missing complaint was received.

As per details, Police Station Khag received a written complaint from one Ghulam Hassan Hajam of Sugan Khag stating therein that his wife, resident of West Bengal along with his 8 years old son went missing on May 10, 2022. Accordingly, a missing report was lodged & search was launched swiftly by a team of Police Station Khag. After putting in strenuous efforts, missing woman & her son were traced from Maharaj Ganj area of Srinagar within 6 hours after missing complaint was received. After completion of legal formalities, the duo was handed over to their legal heirs.

6 arrested for attacking girl, her family

BUDGAM: Police on Wednesday arrested 6 persons involved in attacking a girl and her family members in Magam area.

As per details, police received information that at a scuffle took place over a dispute regarding construction of local road at Bon Makhama in Magam area of Budgam where in Abdul Khaliq Parray, son of Ghulam Mohammad Parray, Mohammad Ramzan Parray, son of Ghulam Mohammad Parray and Bashir Ahmad Parray, son of Mohammad Maqbool Parray along with their family members attacked family of Abdul Rahsid Parray, resident of Bon Makhama.

In the incident, 17-year old daughter of Abdul Rahsid Parray was hit on head with some blunt object, injuring her seriously. She was shifted to SDH Magam and later referred to SMHS Hospital Srinagar, where her condition is stated to be critical. Accordingly, FIR No 64/2022 under relevant sections of law was registered at Police Station Magam and investigation started. During preliminary investigation, 6 accused were arrested while further investigation is going on and more arrests are likely in coming days.

Two absconders arrested

REASI/UDHAMPUR: Police on Wednesday arrested two absconders who were evading their arrest since long.

As per details, under the command of SSP Amit Gupta, a team of Police Station Katra on a specific information arrested one Raskaran Singh, son of Amarjeet Singh, resident of 726-C, Sainik Colony Jammu, presently staying at Sidhra, Jammu. Raskaran Singh is a notorious thief and was absconding in FIR No.01/2017 registered under sections 380/411 of RPC at Police Station GRP Katra. He was also charge-sheeted in the court of law and was facing trial. To avoid conviction, he jumped trial proceedings and became underground. A General Warrant of arrest was issued against him by Court of Munsif JMIC Katra on November 28, 2019. Reasi Police developed specific information and arrested accused from Jammu and produced him in court of law at Katra.



Udhampur Police also apprehended one absconder, who was evading arrest since 2019. A party of Police Station Udhampur headed by Addl. SP Udhampur Anwaar UI Haq raided some suspected locations and arrested an absconder Ahmed Din, son of Samdo, resident of GranMorh, Reasi from Battal Ballian, Udhampur who was absconding since 2019 in FIR No. 345/2016 registered under sections 457/380 of Police Station Udhampur. An arrest warrant under section 512 of CrPC was also issued by the Court of Munsiff Judicial Mobile Magistrate Udhampur against accused.

Two arrested for setting fire in forest areas

NOWSHERA: Two persons were arrested for setting fire in forest areas of Nowshera on Wednesday.

As per details, staff of Chingus Forest Block of Nowshera Forest Range nabbed two persons red handed while setting/igniting fire inside forest co.127/N of Rani Badether Forest of Nowshera Forest Range. One Mohd Shakeel, son of Mohd Zaman, resident of Rani Badether was caught igniting fire on spot in Forest co.127/N and handed-over to team of police post Chingus for further action under

provisions of Indian Forest Act, 1927 while other accused Yasir Alfaz, son of Mohd Ishaq, resident of Rani Badether, attacked field staff of forest department and managed to escape from spot. An application for registration of FIR against both accused under provisions of section 26(b) of Indian Forest Act, 1927 and relevant sections of CrPC/IPC has been submitted by Range Forest Officer, Nowshera to SHO Rajouri and Incharge police post Chingus.

Range Forest Officer, Nowshera Sudesh Kumar said that cases of setting fire inside forest areas will be dealt strictly and anyone found involved in such activities will be put behind bars as there is provision for two years imprisonment and a fine of Rs. 25000 in addition to compensation for damage occurred to forest property in such fire incidents. He further said that as per directions issued by Divisional Forest officer, Nowshera Neelima Shah and Conservator of Forest West Circle Rajouri Vivek Verma, staff of forest department is working hard day and night for prevention and control of forest fires.

Man arrested with 15 lts Desi liquor

ARNIA: Police on Wednesday arrested a man and recovered 15 litres of Desi liquor from his possession.

As per details, a specific information received through reliable sources that one Romesh Kumar, alias Meshra, son of Gyan Chand, resident of Sheikhpur was selling illegal liquor. Acting swiftly, SHO Devinder Singh along with his team of Police Station Arnia under supervision of SDPO RS Pura Surinder Singh conducted raid at Sheikhpur and arrested Romesh Kumar. Police also recovered 15 lts Desi Liquor from his possession near Aik Nala. FIR No. 40/2022 under section 48-F Excise Act was registered against him at Police Station Arnia.

105 bovines rescued, 7 smugglers arrested

UDHAMPUR/NAGROTA/KATHUA/RAJOURI: Police on Wednesday foiled various bovine smuggling bids by rescuing 105 bovines and arrested seven smugglers.

As per details, Police team led by Incharge Police Post Tikri PSI Abdul Satar under supervision of Addl SP Anwaar UI Haq and Sahil Mahajan DySP Hqrs Udhampur and under command of SSP Dr Vinod Kumar, intercepted 2 groups of bovine animals at Naka point Tikri, which were carrying 17 (7+10) bovines on foot. All 17 cattle were rescued and two smugglers namely Manzoor Ahmed, son of Abdullah and Mushtaq Ahmed, son of Gani, both residents of Satwari, Jammu were arrested on spot. FIR Nos. 97 & 98/2022 under relevant sections of law were registered.

Meanwhile, in a massive drive against bovine smuggling, Jammu Police rescued 67 bovine animals i.e., 48 bovines by team of Police Station Jhajjar Kotli and 19 bovines by team of Police Station Nagrota during Naka checking at Suketar and Ban Toll Plaza respectively. Five different vehicles (JK02AN-4710, JK02AT-4665, JK02AQ-2615, JK02AE-1552 and JK02CR-6093) were seized by Jhajjar Kotli police, while two vehicles (JK14B-0985 and JK02A1739) were seized by Nagrota police.

In this regard, five different cases viz FIR No. 85, 86, 87, 88 and 89/2022 under sections 188 of IPC and 11 of PCA Act were registered at Police Station Jhajjar Kotli and five accused were arrested. Moreover, two different cases viz case FIR no. 193 & 194/2022 under sections 188/11 of PCA were registered at Police Station Nagrota. The smugglers, arrested by police were identified as Mohd Qayoom, son of Bashir Ahmed, resident of Jagti Tanda Nagrota; Mohd Iqbal, son of Abdul Gani, resident of Jagti Nagrota along with associate Abdul Hamid, son of Mohd Mirza, resident of Rajpura Akhmoor and Sultan Hussain, son of Mohd Rafiq, resident of Jakhhar Gandala Udhampur along with associate Mohd Yousaf, son of Mohd Qasim, resident of Ukhral, Ramban, all arrested by Jhajjar Kotli Police. The overall arrests and recoveries were made by SHO Jhajjar Kotli Insp Vikram Sharma and SHO Nagrota Insp Vishav Pratap Singh under the supervision of SDPO Nagrota Pardeep Kumar.

In another instance, a team of Police Station Rajbagh led by Insp Amit Sangra SHO Rajbagh under supervision of SDPO Border Pankaj Soodan while on Naka/checking duty at Sunjwan Link road noticed two suspicious Mahindra Load Carriers (JK08E-2823 & JK08C-0797), which were signaled to stop for checking. On seeing police party, drivers of both vehicles managed to flee away from the spot leaving behind the vehicles. During checking, Police recovered 4 bovines from a vehicle while 5 bovines were recovered from other, thereby making a total of 9 bovines, which were rescued. Both the vehicles were seized and FIR No. 97/2022 under sec-



tions 188 of IPC Act, 11 of PCA Act was registered at Police Station Rajbagh.

Rajouri police also rescued twelve animals from the clutches of smugglers while foiling bovine smuggling bid in Rajouri area.

Police said that a team of Rajouri police station during Naka checking intercepted two Tata mobile vehicles (JK11D 0386 and JK11 D 4799) loaded with twelve bovines which were on way from Rajouri towards Buffliaz. In police action, two cases in FIRs 220 & 221/2022, under sections 188 IPC, 11 PCA Act have been registered in police station Rajouri.

Trucker arrested with 27 Kg poppy straw

JHAJJAR KOTLI: Police on Wednesday nabbed a trucker and recovered 27 Kg of poppy straw from a vehicle at Naka point, Jhajjar Kotli.

As per details, a team of Police Station Jhajjar Kotli constituted under the supervision of SDPO Nagrota Pardeep Kumar and led by SHO Jhajjar Kotli Insp Vikram Sharma, intercepted a truck (PB03Q-6292). On search, 27 Kg Poppy straw was recovered from tool box of truck. The accused driver identified as Jagtar Chand, son of Hans Raj, resident of Rahon Road, village Walipur, Basti Jodhewal Ludhiana (Punjab) was arrested and FIR no.90/2022 under sections 8/15/25 of NDPS Act was registered at Police Station Jhajjar Kotli.



Poppy/ Bhang crop destroyed

ANANTNAG: A team of Revenue officials of Tehsil Kokernag and officials from Excise department Anantnag on Wednesday conducted a joint and extensive Poppy/ Bhang crop destruction drive at Soafshali Tehsil Kokernag and destroyed the crop spread over land measuring 7 Kanals at different spots

Accordingly, a one missing report on April 28, 2022 was registered and investigation started. On this, a team under the supervision of SDPO West Rahul Nagar led by SHO Janipur Insp Ajaz Haider, after putting in hectic efforts, traced the missing woman. Subsequently, her family was informed and she was handed over to family members after completing all the legal formalities.

Kathua Police also traced out a missing girl and reunited her with family members. On April 30, 2022 a missing report was lodged at Police Station Kathua by father of a girl stating therein that her daughter, resident of Janglote Patyari Tehsil & District Kathua went missing. Accordingly, missing report was lodged and search was launched to trace her. After putting in hectic efforts, the girl was traced out and immediately handed over to her legal heirs after completion of all legal formalities.

Woman drug peddler held with Rs 6.7 lakh, intoxicants in Reasi

JAMMU: A notorious woman peddler was arrested along with Rs 6.7 lakh and banned drugs in Reasi district on Wednesday, police said. "Rekha Devi, wife of Sohan Singh, resident of Didi Phangal village, was nabbed during checking in the Agar Jeeto area of Katra", said Amit Gupta, Senior Superintendent of Police Reasi. He said banned drugs including 400 Tramadol capsules and 471 Alprazolam tablets besides Rs 6.70 lakh of drug money were seized from her possession. Devi was booked under FIR No. 138/2022 under section 8/21/22 NDPS Act at Police Station Katra. Termining her arrest as a big success, he said she is being questioned and some more arrests and recoveries are expected at her disclosure.
