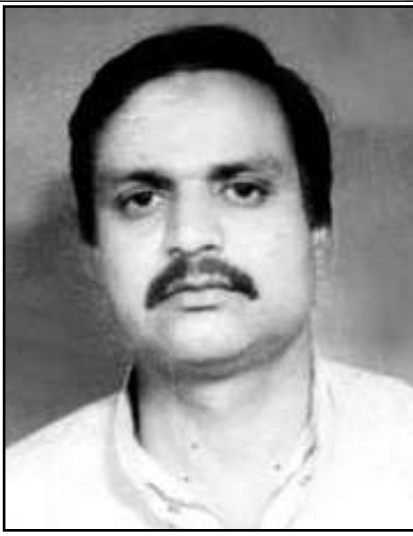

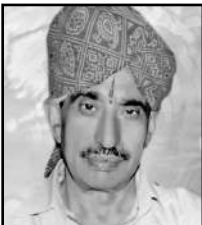

CRIME REPORT

Viral stunt biker Challaned for dangerous driving, other traffic violations

JAMMU: Traffic police on Thursday Challaned a viral stunt biker for dangerous driving & other relevant traffic violations.

On directions of SSP Traffic Jammu Dr Koshal Sharma, a Challan no JK91296220512165454 was served to the violator having a motorcycle bearing registration number (JK02BR5164) by DTI Kapil Manhas under supervision of DySP Traffic Neeraj Padyar for performing stunts at public place and rash driving without wearing Helmet. E-court challan under relevant sections has been served to biker with instruction to present himself before the traffic police. It was further advised by SSP Traffic City Jammu that traffic rules should be followed properly on roads.



Leh Police nabs drug peddler with 1,110 gm Ganja like substance

LEH: District Police Leh continuing its efforts to eradicate menace of drugs from society, arrested a drug peddler and recovered contraband substance from his possession.

As per details, a party from Police Post Housing Colony Leh while conducting random traffic checking at Airport- Skalzangling road, apprehended a suspect and recovered 1,110 gm Ganja like substance from his possession. Police said that accused had concealed the contraband in medicine bottles and Beedi packets. The accused was identified as Samser Sheikh, son of Shantu Sheikh, resident of Pratapganj, Murshidabad (West Bengal) and FIR No 60/2022 under sections 8/20 of NDPS Act was registered at Police Station Leh.



Cyber Police Kashmir outsmarts scammers by saving Rs 58 Lakh

SRINAGAR: Cyber Police Station Kashmir Zone, Srinagar received complaints from two men hailing from Bandipora and Avantipora Districts, wherein complainants alleged that they were defrauded by online scammers of an amount of Rs 44 lakh in online investment/trading scam. Both complainants received links of fake investment websites on their cell numbers wherein they were promised to get double monetary benefits. The victims fell prey and accessed website where they got themselves registered and opened e-wallets. After registration, duo was made to transfer hefty amount of Rs 44 Lakh in wallets through various UPI/IMPS transactions. The victims after depositing the money were unable to get benefits and even unable to withdraw their money back. The complainants also tried hard to reach out on available contact details of the website but all in vain.

Accordingly, both complainants approached Cyber Police Kashmir Zone, Srinagar for redressal of their grievance. Subsequently, the matter was taken up with bank authorities to ascertain details of UPI/IMPS transactions. During analysis of transactions, it came to fore that the said amount has been settled through online payment gateways. The strenuous and timely intervention by the team of Cyber Police Kashmir Zone, Srinagar led to holding of payment of Rs 44 Lakh in two different payment gateways and later on, entire amount was also refunded back into victims' bank accounts.

In another compliant received from a businessman hailing from Srinagar, he was cheated/duped by online fraudsters on pretext of transportation of goods, services through an e-Commerce company web portal. The complainant was looking for goods-carrier services to transport goods of his firm. He searched through Google

search engine in which an e-Commerce company's web portal surfaced which was operated by Scammers. The complainant contacted on cell numbers provided where-in the fraudster, offered him to provide goods/services at low costs. Enticed by offer, the complainant made online payment of Rs 16 Lakh. After depositing money, the complainant was unable to contact company. On realizing that he was cheated by fraudsters, the complainant approached Cyber Police Kashmir Zone, Srinagar for redressal of his grievance. Accordingly, the matter was taken up with bank authorities to ascertain details of transactions. During analysis of transactions, it came to fore that the amount was transferred through RTGS payment. With timely and strenuous intervention by Cyber Police Kashmir Zone, Srinagar was able to hold the payment of Rs 16 Lakh and later same was refunded into complainant's bank account.

4 drug peddlers arrested, contraband recovered

SRINAGAR: Continuing its efforts to eradicate menace of drugs, Police on Thursday arrested four drug peddlers in Handwara & Avantipora and recovered contraband substances from their possession.

In Handwara, a police party from Police Station Kralgrund at a checkpoint established at Rasripora intercepted three suspects and on search, recovered 306 gm Charas like substance from their possession. They were identified as Asif Rasool Khan, son of Gh Rasool Khan; Arif Ahmad Najar; son of Ab Aziz both residents of Beigpora Kralgrund and Muzafar Ahmad Bhat, son of Reyaz Ahmad, resident of Kralgrund.

Similarly in Avantipora, officers from Police Post Reshipora intercepted a person at Liddermud crossing and on search recovered 1 Kg Charas like substance from his possession. The accused was identified as Farooq Ahmad Lone, son of Abdul Salam Lone, resident of Kulpora, Pulwama. He was arrested and shifted to respective police station where he remained in custody. Accordingly, cases under relevant sections of law were registered and further investigation started.

Theft case solved; 1 arrested, stolen property recovered

REASI: Police on Thursday solved a theft case by arresting an accused and recovered stolen property from his possession.

As per details, FIR no. 108/2022 under section 379 of IPC was registered at Police Station Reasi after getting complaint regarding theft of spare parts of JCB Excavation machine from Sandeep Singh, son of Shamsher Singh, resident of Vijaypur. Multiple teams of Police Station Reasi were constituted to work-out theft case. Police teams scanned CCTV footage and rounded up a number of suspects. After strenuous efforts, Police teams zeroed upon a suspect namely Anksuh Kumar; son of Ashok Kumar; resident of Nai Basti who during sustained interrogations confessed his crime. Further, a Jack Hammer, Jack Pin, Socket, Bucket LAB & Bucket Chain were recovered from his possession. Further investigation to unearth his linkages with other theft cases is going on.



Three narco-smugglers arrested with 25 gm Heroin

POONCH: Police along with Indian Army foiled a narcotics smuggled bid in Dharana area of Mendhar Sub-division by arresting three accused besides seizing a vehicle. Rs 19,740 cash and 25 gm heroin like substance was also recovered from their possession.

As per details, during routine checking at Dharana area, a team of Poonch police along with army intercepted a vehicle and recovered 25 gm heroin like substance from three accused namely Intiaz Ahmed, son of Mohd Fazal, resident of Gohlad, Mendhar; Mohd Gafoor; son of Nazir Hussain, resident of Deri Debsi, Mendhar and Mohd Javed, son of Talib Hussain, resident of Deri Debsi, Mendhar, who were arrested on the spot. Police team headed by SHO Mendhar Insp Manzoor Kohli and SDPO Mendhar Sheezan Bhat (JKPS) executed recoveries under supervision of ASP Poonch Mushim Ahmed and SSP Rohit Baskotra in close coordination with army.



Missing boy traced within 24 hrs, reunited with family

JAMMU: Police on Thursday traced a minor boy within 24 hours and reunited him with family members.

As per details, on May 10, 2022 one Arun Tomar, son of Jaiveer Singh, resident of Apna Vihar Kunjwani lodged a complaint that his nephew namely Suryansh Tomer, son of Rajiv Tomer went out from home for tuition but did not return back. In this regard, FIR No 50/2022 under section 363/IPC was registered and investigation started.

During investigation, a team was constituted by SHO Joginder Singh Chib to trace out missing boy. The team swung into action and a contact was established with Jammu Railway authority and Aadhar card of missing boy was also shared. On checking, railway authority informed that boy has confirmed his seat in Shatabdi Express which has departed from New Delhi. Further communication was made with RPF authorities and boy was recovered at Kurukshetra station. Meanwhile, a team from Gangyal Police also rushed to spot and after completing all legal formalities, the boy was handed-over to his legal heirs. This entire operation was done under supervision of SDPO South Sachit Sharma with overall supervision of SP South Mamta Sharma.

Two arrested, 13 bottles & 5 lts illicit liquor recovered

REASI: Continuing drive against illicit liquor, Reasi Police arrested two liquor smugglers and recovered 13 bottles of JK Special Whisky and 5 lts of illicit liquor from their possession.

As per details, during surprise raids and searches near hospital area of Pouni, Police arrested one Mangu Ram, son of Nanak Chand, resident of Saiter Nallah Tehsil Pouni District Reasi and recovered 13 bottles of liquor (750 ml each) from his possession. FIR No 25/2022 under section 48 (A) Excise Act was registered at Police Station Pouni and investigation started to unearth forward and backward linkages.

In another incident, a team from Police Post Dhanasal arrested an illicit liquor smuggler namely Chand Ram, son of Balku Ram, resident of Panchayat Dhanour Tehsil Arnas District Reasi along with 5 lts illicit liquor and 10 lts Lahan.

FIR No. 71/2022 under sections 48(a)(e) and 50 of Excise Act was registered at Police Station Arnas and investigation started.

Two sons of DDC member attacked; 3 arrested

SAMBA: Two sons of DDC member Kartar Chand of Block Nud in Samba district were attacked by unidentified youth on Wednesday night with sharp-edged weapons, due to which they got injured and were shifted to district hospital Samba from treatment. The injured were identified as Jagdish Raj and Bodhranj, both sons of Kartar Chand, resident of Nud.

According to information, accused were repeatedly passing in front of victim's house by making loud noise of speaker on tractor and when son of DDC objected them, they attacked him with sharp-edged weapon. Firstly they attacked elder son and when younger son went to rescue him, he was also attacked. After getting information about matter, police rushed to the hospital and after recording the statements, launched search for three accused. After hectic efforts, they were arrested.

One killed, two injured in car accident

KATHUA: A person was killed while two others got injured after a car they were travelling in turned turtle in Kathua on Thursday.

As per the details, a car turned turtle near Bada Nallah as driver lost control over it. Three persons who were travelling in it and were returning from a marriage function, got injured and were shifted to hospital where doctors declared one of them as brought dead. The deceased was identified as Lucky, resident of Nanan.

Man arrested for stealing cheques from bank

JAMMU: Police on Thursday arrested a man for stealing cheques from bank in Jammu. As per details, bank management lodged a complaint with City police that two cheques amounting Rs 1.5 lakh have been stolen from bank. Acting on complaint, police rounded up a suspect who confessed his crime. Police is investigating the matter.
