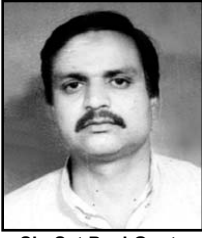

CRIMEREPORT

Major crackdown on bovine smuggling; 138 cattle rescued, 17 smugglers arrested in a day

JAMMU: In a massive crackdown against bovine smuggling, police on Friday rescued 138 bovines in a single day in various actions and arrested 17 smugglers.

In Jammu, Police rescued 117 bovine animals i.e., 30 bovines by team of Police Station Jhajar Kotli and 87 bovines by team of Police Station Nagrota during Naka checking at Suketar Naka and Ban Toll Plaza Naka respectively. Three vehicles (JK05D-7785, JK02AG-6481, JK13A-1001) were seized by Police Station Jhajar Kotli and eight vehicles (JK13E-8204, JK06A-5743, JK14D-4503, JK02AL-3675 and JK02AM-9557, JK02AF-4379, JK02AH-6741, JK02AJ-8867) were seized by Police Station Nagrota. FIR Nos.91, 92 & 93 /2022 under sections 188/IPC 11 of PCA Act were registered at Police Station Jhajar Kotli and three accused were arrested while FIR Nos.195, 196,197,198,199,201,202 & 208/2022 under sections 188/IPC 11 of PCA Act were registered at Police Station Nagrota.

The arrested smugglers were identified as Manzoor Ahmed, son of Mohd Ramzan, resident of Banihal; Naseer Ali, son of Fagu Ali, resident of Ragoora; Mohd Mansa, son of Mohd Yousaf, resident of Reasi; Mohd. Farid, son of Mohd Latief, resident of Tararo Kalakot District Rajouri; Mohd Yasir, son of Mohd Iqbal, resident of Baggar Tehsil Assar; Mohd Maqbool, son of Farooq Ahmad, resident of Baggar Assar; Shafiq Ahmed, son of Farooq Ahmad, resident of Qazigund Mazmon; Shaidd Anwar, son of Ayub Khan, resident of Rajpur Domana; Sajad Ahmad, son of Abdul Majid, resident of Kachwan Anantnag; Mohd Nazim, son of Kalu khan, resident of Reasi; Mohd Rafiq, son of Mohd Shadi, resident of Kansai Kansa Reasi; Jamal Din, son of Fazal Din, resident of Parnote Ramban; Mohd Ashraf, son of Mohd Iqbal, resident of Chenani and Noor Din, son of Abdullah, resident of Pogal Paristan. The overall arrests and recoveries were made by SHO Jhajar Kotli Insp Vikram Sharma and SHO Nagrota Insp Vishav Pratap Singh under supervision of SDPO Nagrota Pardeep Kumar.

Meanwhile, teams of District Police Reasi laid special Nakas and arrested 2 bovine smugglers besides rescuing 6 bovines and seizing 2 vehicles. Team of Police check Post Dharmrai laid a surprise Naka at Chandhar Morh area and intercepted a Tata mobile (JK20-7378), which on checking was found laden with 4 bovines, which were rescued. Two bovine smugglers namely Zaffar Hussain, son of Abdul Gani, resident of Seela Tehsil Mahore & Bhasharat Ali, son of Misher Din, resident of Kansoli Tehsil Mahore were arrested and FIR No. 73/2022 under section 188 of IPC, 11(1)(A) of PCA Act was registered against them at Police Station Armas. In another incident, team of Police Post Talwara during surprise Naka checking foiled bovine smuggling attempt in Talwara. During checking, police intercepted a Tata Mobile (JK11F 0942) and rescued 2 bovines. However, smugglers fled away from the spot taking advantage of darkness. FIR No. 111/2022 under sections 188 of IPC and 11 of PCA Act was registered at Police Station Reasi and investigation started.

At Rajouri, during intervening night, a special Naka was established by a team led by SHO Kalakote Deepak Pathania near Kesar Gala on Kalakote - Rajouri road. During checking, a Tata mobile (JK11E/7151) was signaled to stop but the driver accelerated the vehicle and jumped Naka. The vehicle was chased and apprehended on Androla road but smugglers, taking cover of darkness, jumped from vehicle and fled away. Six bovines were found laden in vehicle, which were rescued. FIR no. 36/22 under section 188 of IPC, 11 of PC Act was registered at Police Station Kalakote.

Kathua Police under overall supervision of SSP R C Kotwal also rescued 9 bovines, arrested a smuggler and seized two vehicles. In first instance, on receiving information from the reliable source regarding smuggling of bovines in a Mahindra vehicle (JK02CA-4239), a police team led by Insp Amit Sangra SHO Rajbagh under supervision of SDPO Border Pankaj Soodan signaled the suspected vehicle to stop for checking. On seeing police, driver lost control over the vehicle, which turned turtle and driver vehicle managed to flee. During checking, 5 bovines were found laden in said vehicle which were rescued. The vehicle was seized and FIR No. 101/2022

under section 279/188 of IPC, 11 of PCA Act was registered at Police Station Rajbagh.

While in another instance, a team of Police Station Hiranagar led by Insp Sunil Kumar SHO Hiranagar under the supervision of SDPO Border Pankaj Soodan during Naka checking duty noticed a Tata Mobile (JK14D-3237), driven by one Tanvir Ahmed Chowhan, son of Jan Mohd, resident of Astan Chack Manzomh Dooru and signaled it to stop for checking. On thorough checking 4 bovines were found loaded in it which were rescued. The accused was also arrested and vehicle was seized. FIR No. 62/2022 under section 188 of IPC,11 of PCA Act was registered at Police Station Hiranagar .

Two missing minors among three traced, reunited with families

JAMMU/SAMBA/KATHUA: Police on Friday traced three missing persons including two minors and reunited them with their families.

As per details, a complaint was lodged at Police station Gangyal, by the legal heirs of a boy stating that he went missing from his house. FIR No 50/2022 under section 363 of IPC was registered and search was launched to trace him. A team under the supervision of SDPO South Sachit Sharma led by SHO Gangyal Insp Joginder Singh Chib, after putting in hectic efforts, traced the missing boy from Kurukshetra station with help of RPF team. Subsequently family of missing boy was informed and he was handed over to family members after completing all legal formalities.

At Kathua, on May 8, 2022 a missing report was lodged at Police Station Hiranagar by husband of woman stating therein that his wife, resident of Mela Tehsil Hiranagar District Kathua went missing. Accordingly, a missing report was lodged and search was launched to trace her. After hectic efforts, the woman was traced out and handed-over to her legal heirs after completion of all legal formalities. District Police Samba also recovered a minor girl within 24 hours and reunited with her family. On May 11, 2022, a complaint was lodged at Police Station Bari Brahmana by a resident of Village Dharampura Tehsil Manjhi District Chapra, Bihar at present residing near Shiv Public School Bari Brahmana, Samba that his minor daughter went to school but did not return home. Acting on the complaint, FIR No. 98/2022 under section 363 of IPC was registered at Police Station Bari Brahmana and search was launched to trace out minor girl. With continuous strenuous efforts, a team of Police Station Bari Brahmana recovered the minor girl from Talwara, Reasi within 24 hours and safely brought her to Police Station Bari Brahmana. After completing all legal formalities, she was handed-over to her parents.

Bike-lifter arrested, three stolen motorcycles recovered

JAMMU: Police on Friday arrested a bike-lifter and recovered three stolen motorcycles from his possession.

As per details, a complaint regarding bike theft was lodged at Police Post Canal road Jammu under the jurisdiction of Police Station Nowabad and FIR no. 49/2022 under section 379 IPC was registered in Police Station Nowabad and investigation started. A team of Police Post Canal road under supervision of DySP Hqrs Swati Sharma led by SHO Nowabad Insp Vijay Kumar assisted by Incharge Police Post Canal road PSI Amreek Singh, after putting in strenuous efforts, arrested accused, Mohd Akram, son of Mohd Qazi, resident of Javed Nagar; Nikki Tawi, who during sustained questioning, disclosed that he had stolen three motorcycles bearing Chassis no.MBLHA10BFFHE51361 Engine No HA10ERFHE72952 Pro-splendor Silver Black; Chassis no MBLHA10A3DHL24071 Engine No HA10ELDHL35738 Pro-Splendor Silver Black and Chasis No MD2DHLJZ-ZPCM15963, engine No DJGBPM22496 Pulsar 180 DTS Black.

Three theft cases solved; 6 arrested, stolen items recovered

JAMMU: Police on Friday solved three theft cases by arresting six accused persons and recovered stolen items on their disclosure.

As per details, two theft cases were solved by teams of Police Post Pounichak Jammu. Complaint was lodged at Police Post Pounichak by a complainant stating that some thieves have stolen iron-kits used for construction. Accordingly, FIR No 116/2022 under sections 380/457 of IPC was registered and investigation started. Similarly, another complaint was lodged at same Police Post by one Mohinder Singh stating that some thieves stole 2 tyres of his truck and a tyre of another truck. FIR No 137/2022 under section 379 IPC was registered at Police Station Domana and

investigation started.

After this, teams of Police Post Pounichak under supervision of SDPO Domana Sunil Singh led by SHO Domana Insp Tilak Raj assisted by Incharge Police Post Pounichak PSI Nitish Khajuria, after putting in strenuous efforts and with help of CCTV footages of area, arrested three persons. Further on their disclosure stolen items were recovered. Similarly a suspect namely Mohd Shakeel, resident of Nagrota was arrested under FIR 137/2020. During questioning, accused confessed their involvement in crime and on their disclosure stolen items were also recovered. The overall recoveries and arrests were made under supervision of SP Rural Sanjay Sharma.

In another case, a complaint was lodged at Talab Tillo Police Post by one Rakesh Sharma, son of Dina Nath, resident of Niteco Lane, Talab Tillo, Jammu regarding theft at Maryada Parshotam Temple. On this, FIR No. 54/2022 under sections 454/380 of IPC was registered at Police Station Nowabad and investigation started. A team of Police Post Talab Tillo under supervision of DySP Hqrs Swati Sharma led by SHO Nowabad Vijay Kumar assisted by Incharge Police Post Talab Tillo PSI Rajesh Kumar arrested accused persons identified as Mukul Khaltora, son of Bharat Bhushan, resident of Krishna Nagar Jammu and Santosh Kumar alias Gorkha, son of Vishno Bahudur, resident of Peer Kho Jammu. The overall arrests and recovery were made under supervision of SP City North Kulbir Handa.

Man arrested; 12 Its illicit liquor seized, 200 Its Lahan destroyed

RAJOURI: Police on Friday arrested a man and recovered 12 Its illicit liquor from his possession besides destroying 200 Its Lahan.

As per details, on basis of some reliable information, a police party led by PSI Anis Choudhary under the supervision of SHO Kalakote Deepak Pathania conducted raid at village Kurlian and recovered 12 Its illicit liquor from possession of one Roop Singh, son of Lal Chand, resident of Kurlian. About 200 Its lahan was also destroyed on spot. The accused was arrested and FIR no. 37/22 under sections 48 (A) of Excise Act was registered at Police Station Kalakote.

Snatching case solved within 24 hours, accused arrested

DODA: Police on Friday solved a snatching case within 24 hours by arresting accused. As per details, on May 12, 2022 at about 9:00 AM, a complaint was lodged by Krishan Chand, son of Prem Nath, resident of Shaie Arnora, Doda at Police Station Doda stating that on May 11, 2022 when his mother, after withdrawing pension from SBI Doda, was returning home, an unknown person snatched her bag containing Rs 20,000 cash and some other items near Passenger-shed, Bus-stand Doda. Accordingly, FIR No. 86/22 under section 382 of IPC was registered and a police party led by PSI Ankush Nagra of Police Station Doda immediately swung into action and visited the spot. The team collected CCTV footage and on basis of some vital clues, nabbed a suspect namely Ramsaroop, son of Shadi Lal, resident of Ugad Doda for questioning. During sustained questioning, he confessed his crime and on his disclosure police party managed to recover snatched money as well as other item within 24 hours of incident. The whole operation was carried out under overall supervision of Insp Arun Sharma SHO Police Station Doda.



Drug peddler arrested
