# NIA conducts raids at 4 places in Kashmir; arrests 2 overground TRF workers

SRINAGAR: The National Investigation Agency (NIA) on Saturday conducted searches at four locations in Kashmir Valley in connection with a terror conspiracy case and arrested two overground workers of The Resistance Force (TRF), a front of Pakistan-based Lashkar-e-Taiba (LeT), an official said.

The searches were carried out at four locations -- one each in north Kashmir's Baramulla and Kupwara districts and south Kashmir's Pulwama and Shopian districts -- a spokesperson of the NIA said. The official said digital devices such as mobile phones, laptop, SIM cards and memory cards and incriminating material used for fabrication of improvised explosive devices, jihadi literature and posters have been seized during the searches.

The case was transferred to the SIA from the Jammu and Kashmir police last year. Investigation


## Jammu records season's hottest day as mercury hits 43.5 deg C STATE TIMES NEWS

JAMMU: Jammu recorded its hottest day of the season so far with the mercury touching 43.5 degrees Celsius on Saturday as the heatwave intensified engulfing most parts of Jammu and Kashmir.

The maximum temperature in Jammu city was 6.6 degrees above season's average, forcing people to stay indoors especially in the afternoon.

Jammu recorded a minimum temperature of 23.3 degrees Celsius which is almost near normal during this part of the season, an official of the Meteorological department said.

He said Katra, the base camp for the pilgrims visiting the Mata Vaishno Devi shrine, was the second hottest recorded place in the region with a high of 40.4 degrees Celsius and a low of 23.9 degrees Celsius. The mercury is also on the

JAMMU: Reiterating his stand that the abrogation of Article 370 in August 2019 was "unconstitutional and unlawful", National Conference vice president Omar Abdullah on Saturday said his party is not ready to accept defeat and will continue its peaceful struggle for the rights of the people of Jammu and Kashmir

The former chief minister pooh-poohed the claims of the Bharatiya Janata Party leaders about normalcy in Jammu and Kashmir in the wake of the abrogation of Article 370 that gave special status to the erstwhile state,



saying "except BJP-linked people, everyone else is disappointed".

"Some people are in a hurry to remove the word 'state' from everything as if J&K was never a state or its statehood will not be restored. While coming from Srinagar

through Mughal Road, I saw some State Road Transport Corporation (SRTC) trucks where the word state was removed using paint. "They have changed the

name of the company from JKSRTC to JKRTC even as the government is promise bound to restore statehood... We are not ready to accept defeat. Let them try their best, we will continue our struggle in a peaceful manner for the restoration of our rights, respect, identity and honour," Abudllah said addressing party workers in the border district of Poonch.

# Army Chief visits forward areas in eastern Ladakh

NEW DELHI: Army Chief Gen Manoj Pande visited some of the most difficult and inhospitable forward locations in eastern Ladakh and reviewed India's overall military preparedness during his three-day tour of the region amid the lingering border row with China, officials said on Saturday.

They said the Chief of Army Staff interacted with the troops in multiple locations along the Line of Actual Control (LAC) in the high-altitude region and took stock of the ground situation.

Gen Pande concluded his three-day visit to Ladakh on Saturday.

The Army chief, accompanied by senior commanders, visited some of the most difficult and inhospitable forward



areas in Ladakh to review operational preparedness.

locations in eastern Ladakh to have first-hand knowledge about the prevailing situa-

tion, the officials said. "General Manoj Pande #COAS visited forward

areas in #Ladakh to review the operational prepared-#COAS interacted with the troops & complimented them for their steadfastness & high morale," the Army tweeted.

On Thursday, senior commanders briefed Gen Pande at the Fire and Fury Corps headquarters in Leh about the overall security situation in eastern Ladakh.

The Fire and Fury Corps is responsible for guarding the LAC with China in the Ladakh region.

Gen Pande's visit to Ladakh came days after he said China's intention has been to keep "alive" the overall boundary question with India though it remains the "basic" issue between the two

While referring to the east-

ern Ladakh border row, the Army chief had said the Indian Army's aim is to reestablish the "trust and tranquillity" between the two sides but asserted that "it cannot be a one-way affair".

He also asserted that the Indian Army's aim was to restore the status quo ante prior to April 2020 in eastern

The eastern Ladakh faceoff began on May 4-5 in 2022. India has been insisting on the restoration of the status quo ante prior to the stand-

India and China have held 15 rounds of military talks so far to resolve the eastern Ladakh row. As a result of the talks, the two sides completed the disengagement process last year on the
