NEW DELHI: The Cabinet on Wednesday empowered boards of state-owned companies to decide on the closure and divestment of units/subsidiaries.

Presently, the Board of Directors of holding or parent public sector enterprises have been delegated certain powers to make equity investments to establish financial joint ventures and wholly-owned subsidiaries undertake mergers/acquisitions, subject

to certain ceilings of net However, the Boards do not

have powers for disinvestment or closure of their subsidiaries or units or stake in JVs, except for some limited powers given to Maharatna PSEs for minority stake disinvestment in their subsidiaries.

Therefore, approval of the Cabinet was required for both strategic disinvestment and minority stake sale or



closure of the subsidiaries or units or sale of their stakes in a JV irrespective of the size of operations or capital deployed of such subsidiaries, etc.

# Criminal proceedings can't quash merely on grounds superior officers expressed contrary opinion: HC

JAMMU: Justice Sanjay Dhar of Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh High Court Srinagar wing dismissed a petition challenging quashment of FIR with observations that the Court can't quash proceedings simply because some superior officer has, at some point in time during investigation of case, expressed a contrary opinion.

The petitioners have challenged FIR No.353/2016 registered for offences under Section 147, 341, 354-B, 323, 506 of RPC at Police Station Pulwama, Kashmir. The impugned FIR has been

registered on basis of a report lodged by complainant, wherein he had alleged that on July 18, 2016 at about 7.30 PM, when busy in her household chores, she heard some noise after which she came out of her house and saw that her nephew was telling accused that petitioner No.1 had constructed a cattle-shed by keeping a window towards his house, due to which he has to face foul smell emanating there from. After this, the petitioners/ accused went away from there and she also returned to her house. After sometime when complainant again

came out of her house and was going through the street, the petitioners all of a sudden launched an attack on her. They pelted stones and threatened her. The petitioner took away Dupatta from her head and caught hold of her hair whereas petitioners No.2 and 3 gave blows of fists and kicks. Petitioners No 4 and 5 are stated to have beaten her and torn her clothes. In the meantime, minor son of complainant, namely Mohsin Altaf came there and petitioner No 2 hit him on his left arm with a stone. Thereafter, some people gathered on spot and they

because complainant's husband was on duty, as such, she could not lodge the report promptly and when her husband came back from duty a few days back, approached the police. It was further alleged in the complaint that petitioners are extending threats to complainant and her family.



There are 53 active cases while the overall recoveries have reached 4.49.354, officials said. The COVID-19 death toll stands at 4,752. No fresh Covidrelated fatality was reported in the last 24 hours, they said. There were 51 confirmed cases of mucormycosis (black fungus), they added.

## SC upholds provisions on setting-up of NGT, rules out branches in all States, UTs

A bench comprising Justices K M Joseph and Hrishikesh Roy, while dismissing the plea of the Madhya Pradesh High Court Advocates Bar Association, also held that the provision of an appeal directly in the top court against an order of the NGT was intra-vires and does not oust the high courts' power under writ jurisdictions as it was part of the basic structure.

appeal before the High Court is a creature of the statute and is not an inherent right. The provision for appeal to the High Court should not, therefore, be created by issuing a writ of Mandamus as that would be legislating through a judicial order, and would impinge upon the wellfounded concept of separation of powers, the judgement said

It cannot also be overlooked that it is the Supreme Court itself that had recommended the setting up of an environmental court with direct appeals to it, the bench said.

This would also support the proposition on the constitutional validity of Section 22 of the NGT Act and that it is not ultra vires to

WASHINGTON: By June 2022, India intends to deploy the S-400 missile defence system that it has received from Russia to defend itself against threat from Pakistan and China, a Pentagon spy master has told US lawmak-

India started receiving the delivery of S-400 missile defence system from Russia in December last year, Lt Gen Scott Berrier, Director, Defense Intelligence Agency told members of the Senate Armed Services Committee during recent

Congressional hearing. As of October 2021, India's military was seeking to procure advanced surveillance systems to strengthen its boost its offensive and defensive cyber capabilities. India

December, received its initial delivery of the Russian S-400 air defence system, and it intends to operate the system to defend against Pakistani and Chinese threats by June 2022, Berrier said.

India continued to develop its own hypersonic, ballistic, cruise, and air defence missile capabilities, conducting multiple tests in 2021. India has a growing number of satellites in orbit, and it is expanding its use of space assets, likely pursuing offensive space capabilities, he

Berrier told lawmakers that New Delhi is pursuing

ernisation effort encompassing air, ground, naval, and strategic nuclear forces with an emphasis on domestic defence production. India is taking steps to

establish Integrated Theatre Commands that will improve its joint capability among its three military services.

Since 2019, Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi has given priority to strengthen India's economy by expanding its domestic defence industry, and establishing a negative import list to curtail defence purchases from foreign suppliers.
