JAMMU: Reiterating its resolve to support genuine demands of KP employees posted in Valley, the Kashmiri Pandit conference (KPC) has urged the people in general and members of KP community in particular to lit candles on tenth day of Rahul Bhat, falling on May 22, 2022.

In a press statement issued here, Kundan Kashmire said that no doubt UT administration has directed concerned authorities to resolve all service-related matters of PM package employees besides posting them at district Headquarters and not in remote areas. "This shows that administration is contemplating to give a final shape of resolve all issues of PM package employees, but these simple measures will not give ensure safety of KPs as Rahul Bhat was also posted in a safe area and still he was martyred. The gun-yielded youth left the spot freely and easily without any check.

Same thing at happened at wine shop in Baramulla," said Kundan, adding, "Government needs to contain these divisive elements effectively and has to come up with a foolproof security strategy to ensure safety of minority Hindu community in Valley. Till that time, KP employees should be posted outside valley." The KPC also appealed to entire Kashmiri Pandit community residing in various parts of J&K, Delhi, Pune, Bangalore and other parts of country and even abroad to lit candles and observe two-minute silence at their respective locations at 7.30 PM on May 22, 2022 on tenth day of Rahul Bhat.
