CRIME REPORT

Govt employee arrested in Uri with heroin worth Rs 20 Cr

SRINAGAR: A government employee was arrested with 10 Kg heroin worth Rs 20 crore from Uri town in Baramulla district, police said here on Friday.

Acting on a specific information regarding smuggling of drugs, police at a checkpoint established in Uri intercepted a vehicle, bearing registration number JK01AK-2765, driven by Mohammad Zaid Shah Geelani, son of Syed Hasaan Din Shah, resident of Basgran Uri, an employee of the Rural Development Department, a police spokesman said.

During checking, 10 Kg of heroin worth around Rs 20 crore was recovered from his possession, police said.

"He has been arrested and shifted to police station where he remains in custody," the spokesman said, adding a case under relevant sections of law has been registered in Police Station Uri.

The police have urged the community members to come forward with any information regarding drug peddlers in their neighbourhood. Persons found indulging in drug peddling will be dealt as per law. Our consistent actions against drug peddlers should reassure the community members that we are making efforts to keep our society free from the scourge of drug menace, the officials said.

2 juveniles among 3 held for molesting minor girl

SRINAGAR: Police has arrested a man and apprehended two juveniles for allegedly molesting a minor girl here, officials said on Friday.

As per details, all three accused are drug-addicts and molested a girl when she was coming back from school at Badamibagh cantonment area, they said. "The three accused, who molested the girl, were apprehended and a case was registered under relevant sections of law," police said.

The girl was allegedly molested on Thursday. The accused escaped after the victim raised voice, police said.

The juveniles are residents of Batwara while 20-year-old man is a resident of Rajbagh area, they added.

In another incident, the police arrested two men and recovered 100 gm heroin worth around Rs 1 crore from their possession, officials said. The accused were apprehended during checking on Ashaibagh bridge in Nigeen area of city on Thursday, they said. The car used in smuggling of was seized, a police spokesperson said, adding that case under relevant sections of NDPS Act has been registered.

Illegal extraction & transportation of minerals: 4 arrested; 8 vehicles, JCB seized

BUDGAM/UDHAMPUR: Acting tough against illegal extraction and transportation of minerals, Police on Friday arrested four persons and seized 8 vehicles and a JCB involved in crime.

As per details, parties from Police Station Budgam at various checkpoints intercepted 3 tippers loaded with illegally extracted clay Near FCI Chandpora, Patlibagh & Chandpora crossing respectively. The trippers (JK04-7552, JK01P-3573 and JK01AG-7743) were seized and drivers identified as Younis Ahmad Qazi, son of Ghulam Ahmad Qazi, resident of Watirwani; Showkat Ahmad Baba, son of Ghulam Hassan Baba, resident of Khadipora and Gulzar Ahmad Beigh, son of Abdul Razzak Beigh, resident of Khadipora were arrested.

Similarly, officers from Police Station Beerwah seized a JCB and arrested a driver for illegally extraction of soil at Hardumalpora, Beerwah. He was identified as Balvinder Singh, son of Kulwant Singh, resident of Jungal Bawani Gurdaspur (Punjab). In this regard, cases under relevant sections of law were registered at respective police stations and investigation started.

Meanwhile, Roun Domail Police also seized five vehicles including three dumpers (JK14D-0172, JK14E-6178 & JK14AF-2167) and two trolleys (JKAF8339 & JK14-8339) found indulged in illegal mining.

ARTO Reasi conducts checking on Mahore- Chassana route; recovers Rs 42,500 fine

REASI: A special Naka was laid by Assistant Regional Transport Officer (ARTO) Reasi Rajesh Gupta, along with his team on Reasi-Mahore-Chassana route to conduct checking of vehicles after public complained about overloading and violation of traffic norms by transport operators. The checking on the route continued for two days and teams seized 2 vehicles and compounded 86 others including 7 for not having HSRP and recovered Rs 42,500 as fine.

Meanwhile, the inspection team educated people about their duties towards observing traffic norms and road safety rules while travelling.

The ARTO said that it is prime duty of commuters to raise voice against overloading and use of mobile phones by drivers while driving. He also directed transport operators to charge 50 per cent fare from students.

Two theft cases solved; 3 arrested, stolen property worth Rs 1.5 lakh, gold ornaments recovered

REASI/R S PURA: Police on Friday solved two theft cases by arresting 3 accused and recovered stolen property worth Rs 1.5 lakh and gold ornaments from their possession.

As per details, FIR no. 115/2022 under section 379 of IPC was registered at Police Station Reasi after receiving a complaint of theft at NS Associates Construction Company, at Gran Morh Reasi. Multiple teams of Police Station Reasi were constituted which scanned CCTV footage and rounded up a number of suspects. After strenuous efforts, Police teams zeroed upon a suspect namely Maqbool Ahmed, son of Alam Din, resident of Tronth Gran, Reasi, who was put under sustained interrogation after which he confessed his crime. On his disclosure, 38 bags of Steel fiber, 8 MS Pipes, 5 shuttering plates worth Rs 1.5 lakh were recovered. A

vehicle (JK21A 4076) used for ferrying stolen construction material was also recovered. SSP Reasi Amit Gupta, while sharing details, conveyed that further investigations to unearth his linkages with other theft cases is going on and more arrests and recoveries can't be ruled out in case.

Meanwhile, R S Pura police also solved a theft case by arresting two thieves and recovered stolen ornaments from their possession. The duo was identified as Sohan Lal alias Sonu and Amit Kumar.

72 bovines rescued, 4 smugglers arrested

KATHUA/JAMMU/NOWSHERA: Police on Friday foiled various bovine smuggling bids by rescuing 72 bovines and arrested 4 smugglers.

As per details, police team led by Insp Sunil Kumar SHO Hiranagar under supervision of SDPO Border Pankaj Soodan while on Naka/checking duty near Londi Morh Naka point noticed a suspicious Truck (JK02AP-4087) and signaled it to stop for checking after which 16 bovines were found laden in it, which were rescued and vehicle was seized. Accordingly, FIR No. 65/2022 under section 188 of IPC Act, 11 of PCA Act was registered at Police Station Hiranagar.

While in another instance, acting on reliable information that one Shokat Ali, son of Ibrahim, resident of Fatehpur Tehsil, Bani District, Kathua is indulged in smuggling of bovines. Acting swiftly, a team from Police Station Kathua headed by Insp O P Chibb SHO Kathua under supervision of DySP Headquarters Kathua Shammi Kumar noticed a suspect indulged in transportation /smuggling of bovines by foot. 5 bovines were rescued from his possession and accused was arrested. Accordingly, FIR No. 202/2022 under section 188 of IPC was registered at Police Station Kathua.

31 bovines were rescued by a team of Police Post Sidhra under jurisdiction of Police Station Nagrota. FIR No 222/2022 under section 188 of IPC was registered at Police Station Nagrota and vehicle was seized. The team was led by SHO Nagrota Insp Vishav Partap Singh assisted by Incharge Police Post Sidhra SI Majid Hussain under supervision of SDPO Nagrota Pardeep Kumar.

Nowshera police also foiled multiple bovine smuggling bids and rescued 20 animals from clutches of smugglers. In an official statement, Rajouri police said that in wee hours of Friday, a vehicle (JK11D 3056) driven by one Zakir Hussain, son of Mohd Ashiq, resident of Chingus Tehsil Rajouri, with two other persons travelling in it was intercepted and during checking it was found loaded with four bovine animals, which were rescued.

Another police team intercepted a vehicle in at Qila Darhal and found it loaded with nine bovines, which were rescued but smuggler Zafar Javid, son of Mir Hussain, resident of Behrote Thanamandi managed to flee while a manhunt has been launched to nab him. In another action, police team recently intercepted a vehicle (JK02AK 6181) and found it laden with 7 bovines, which were rescued. The vehicle was intercepted at Khui Dheri in Siot after it hit a pedestrian leaving him injured. The vehicle was seized while animals were rescued and manhunt was launched to nab the accused.

Woman among two bootleggers nabbed with 150 bottles, 18 lts of illicit liquor

KATHUA: In recent action against consumption/production of illegal liquor, Kathua Police under overall supervision of SSP R C Kotwal on Friday seized 150 quarters of illicit liquor (180 ml each) near GDC Mahanpur and 18 lts of illicit liquor (Desi) at Chak Drab Khan Kathua.

As per details, information was received from reliable source that illicit liquor is manufactured near Chak Drab Khan and its adjoining areas. Acting swiftly, a team of Police Post Nagri led by Insp Balram Sharma Incharge Police Post Nagri under supervision of DySP Headquarters Kathua Shammi Kumar, during special checking/ patrolling, noticed a suspect indulged in preparing/selling illicit liquor to people of Chak Drab Khan. On checking, approximately 18 lts illicit liquor (Desi) was recovered from possession of a woman namely Sunita, wife of Ashok Kumar, resident of Chack Drab Khan Kathua Tehsil & District Kathua. The woman was arrested and FIR No. 201/2022 under section 48(A)/ Excise Act was registered against her at Police Station Kathua.

While in another instance, a team of Police Station Basohli headed by SHO Basholi Insp Rajinder Khajuria under supervision of SDPO Basohli Shazia Akhter during patrolling /checking duty near Govt Degree College Mahanpur noticed a suspicious car (JK08A-4461). On thorough checking, 150 quarters of illicit liquor (180 ml each) were recovered from possession of one Suram Singh, son of Prem Singh, resident of Ward-7, Mahanpur, District Kathua. He was arrested and FIR No. 40/2022 under section 48(a) of Excise Act was registered against him at Police Station Basohli.

Kidnapped girl rescued, accused arrested

Fire at Kothi Bagh Police Station Fire; records & articles intact

SRINAGAR: Police on Friday said that Kothibagh Police Station fire seems to be accidental in nature and all records and articles are intact.

In a series of Tweet, Srinagar Police Tweeted, "Around midnight, a fire incident took place in first floor of Kothibagh Police Station building. Due to wooden structures on first floor, the fire spread to some rooms but it was controlled within few hours by hectic efforts of fire department. Prima facie the fire seems accidental."

As per other tweet, "As fire didn't spread to ground floor, all the record of Police Station and articles are intact. Damage took place to SP, SDPO chambers, allied offices and barracks on first floor."

Absconder arrested

2 heavy excavators, 3 vehicles seized for illegal mining

KATHUA: To curb menace of illegal mining, District Mineral Officer Kathua Rajinder Singh on Friday inspected different sites and seized 2 heavy excavators and three vehicles. The seized excavators and vehicles were imposed a penalty of Rs 13 lakh as per laid down rules.

Among seized machinery, 2 heavy excavators involved in illegal mining were seized at Ujh river and 3 vehicles carrying sand and Bajri without valid documents. "It was an entire day's exercise wherein a team of Mineral Department visited all spots after with assistance of police," an official said.

The team also checked enforcement of notified rates of minor minerals and advised consumers to purchase minerals only from legal sources and stay away from illegal miners. The seizures were made in continuance to the administration's tough stand against illegal mining. Moreover, the general public was appealed to inform Mineral Department in case of any issue pertaining to mining, exorbitant rates etc. They were urged to immediately report to the District Administration about any action and violation of mining rules under MM(D&R) Act-1957 and SRO-105.

Fire broke out at Chenani forests, fields gutted in Samba

UDHAMPUR/SAMBA: A forest fire broke out in Margana forest area of Chenani in Udhampur district late last night. Forest department officials, fire & emergency department initiated joint efforts to douse the flames.

As per details, efforts are on to control fire, but due to strong winds, the fire spread fast. Meanwhile in district Udhampur, fire was also reported from other areas including Siuna, Pakhlai, Bashat etc. Teams of forest department and police administration are busy in extinguishing it.

At Rajpura in district Samba, at around 1 PM, some unidentified people set fire to residue left after harvesting wheat crop in their fields in village Sanura. Meanwhile, due to strong wind, the fire reached main road of Ghagwal, Rajpura, burning entire field, bushes. Not only this, the flames also reached a house of Darshan Singh, located near roadside due to which a shed built for animals and other household items were reduced to ashes. After getting information, fire brigade rushed to spot and brought the fire under control.

Youth found hanging under mysterious circumstances

Two killed, 5 injured in twin car accidents

As per details, a car (JK06-9064) turned turtle while taking a sharp curve in Doda area due to which all three occupants got injured. They were shifted to hospital where doctors declared one of them as brought dead. The deceased was identified as Rattan Singh, son of Sunit Singh, resident of Bhalla, while injured were identified as Ranjeet Singh, Jagjit Singh and Balbir Singh.

Meanwhile, an alto car (JK11B-4224) which was on its way from Jammu to Poonch met with an accident near Thalka Police Post, Nowshera as a result three persons boarding in it got injured.

They were shifted to hospital where one of them was declared dead by doctors. The deceased has been identified as Sham Singh, son of Balwant Singh, resident of Poonch while the injured were Rakesh Kumar, son of Kishore Kumar and Lucky Kumar, son of Sardari Lal, both residents of Kothi Shah, R S Pura.
