CRIME REPORT

2 absconders arrested from Chenani, Udhampur

SRINAGAR: In continuation of stringent actions against absconders, Srinagar Police on Sunday arrested two absconders who were evading their arrest for a long time.

As per the details, Srinagar Police succeeded in arresting two absconders from Chenani Udhampur. They have been identified as Shabir Ahmad Sheikh alias Khan, son of Ab Rashid, (occupation contractor) & Intiyaz Ah Lone, son of Gh. Ahmad Lone (occupation contractor), both residents Chenani Udhampur Jammu. They were wanted by law for their involvement in FIR No. 21/ 2020 under section 452, 354, 376, 511 IPC 8 POCSO Act dated Feb 26, 2020.

Notorious drug peddler arrested; 1.25 Kg Charas, Rs 1.29 Lakh cash recovered

BUDGAM: Continuing its efforts to curb the menace of drugs from the society, Police on Sunday arrested a notorious drug peddler in Budgam and recovered contraband substance from his possession.

As per the details, Police Station Magam received a specific information through reliable sources that one person namely Shabir Ahmad Sofi, son of Abdul Khaliq Sofi, resident of Mazhama has indulged in drug peddling and hoarded a huge quantity of narcotic substance in his residential house.

On receipt of this information, a party of Police Station Magam alongwith Executive Magistrate raided the specific location. During search, officers were able to recover 1 Kg & 250 grams of Charas like substance from his residential house. Besides, cash amount of RS 1,29,000 believed to be the proceeds of narcotic crime was also recovered from his possession. He has been arrested and FIR No. 67/2022 under relevant sections of law was registered against him at Police Station Magam.

Rape accused arrested within 5 hours

BUDGAM: Police on Sunday arrested a person accused of rape within 5 hours after complaint was received.

As per the details, Police Station Khansahib received a written complaint from one person stating therein that his daughter (name withheld) aged about 19 years was forcefully raped by Mudasir Ahmed Wani resident of Zagoo Kharein.

Accordingly, a case vide FIR Number 67/2022 under relevant sections of law was registered in Police Station Khansahib and investigation was set into motion.

Acting promptly, a team of Police Station Khansahib swung into action and arrested the accused from Zagoo Khansahib within 5 hours. He has been shifted to the police station where he remains in custody. As a part of investigation, necessary medico-legal formalities have been carried out. Further investigation in the matter is going on.

Police destroys poppy cultivation

AWANTIPORA: Continuing its efforts to eradicate the menace of drugs from the society, Police, CRPF alongwith civil authorities destroyed poppy cultivation at village Larmoh area of Awantipora.

As per the details, a joint team of Police, CRPF headed by SDPO Awantipora Mumtaz Ali Bhatti along with officials of Revenue department destroyed illegal poppy cultivation spread over more than 03 Kanals of land at village Larmoh area of Awantipora.

Accordingly, a case vide FIR No. 99/2022 under relevant sections of law stands registered at Police Station Awantipora and further investigation has been initiated.

172 bovines rescued, 6 smugglers arrested

JAMMU: Police on Sunday foiled various bovine smuggling bids by rescuing 172 bovines in a single day across Jammu division and arrested 6 smugglers

Hiranagar Police under the overall supervision of SSP Kathua R C Kotwal on rescued 9 bovines near Tarnah area. At about 1:50 hours an information was received

from the reliable sources that some unknown persons are indulged in smuggling of bovines from Tarnah side towards Kunthal area. Acting swiftly, a police team led by ASI Rajinder Kumar In-Charge Border Police Post Chakra under the close supervision of SDPO Border Pankaj Soodan and Insp. Sunil Kumar SHO Hiranagar during patrolling duty at said area noticed the movement of few unknown persons who were enroute from Tarnah side towards Kunthal area. On seeing police said persons were managed to fled away from the spot leaving behind all the bovines. During checking, police rescued 9 bovines On this an instant FIR No. 68/2022 under section 188/IPC case has been registered at Police Station Hiranagar.

Meanwhile, Police also rescued 42 bovines animals i.e 11 bovines by team of Jhajjar Kotli Police and 31 bovines by team of Nagrota Police during Naka checking at Suketar Naka and Ban Toll Plaza Naka. One vehicle (JK19- 4539) was seized by Jhajjar Kotli Police while three vehicles bearing (JK02AL- 7963, JK02AP- 2481 and JK03D- 0362) were seized by Nagrota Police.

FIR No.117/2022 under sections 188/IPC 11 PCA Act was registered at Police Station Jhajjar Kotli and one accused was arrested. Moreover, three FIRs No.223, 224,225/2022 under section 188/IPC 11 PCA Act were registered at Police Station Nagrota.

Five accused arrested who were arrested have been identified as Mohd. Iqbal Wani, son of Sonauallah Wani, reside of Kaskoot Banihal; Abdul Rafiq, son of Abdul Latief, resident of Jagti Tanda Nagrota; Rafi, son of Khalid Hussain, resident of Domail Katra; Zahur Islam, son of Amaan Ullha, resident of Batote Disst Ramban and Bashir Ahmed, son of Hussain Ali, resident of Ramban Rajgarh at present Fallain Mandal Jammu. The overall arrests and recoveries were made by SHO Jhajjar Kotli Inspr. Vikram Sharma and SHO Nagrota Inspr Vishav Pratap Singh under the supervision of SDPO Nagrota Pardeep Kumar.

A major bovine smuggling bid was also foiled by Ramban Police by rescued 118 bovines. Acting tough against the bovine smugglers and to curb the bovine smuggling menace in District Ramban, different police parties of Police Stations Batote, Chanderkote, Ramban & Police Post Jawahar Tunnel intercepted eight (JK14D-3771, JK14B-4007, JK06B-7575, JK18A-2310, JK05D-2430, JK19-0062, JK21F-4786 and JK02BK-8607) which were on their way from Jammu towards Srinagar. During checking all the above mentioned vehicles were found loaded with 118 bovines which were rescued". FIR No's 112, 113 & 114 in Police Station Batote, 94, 95 & 96/2022 registered in Police Station Chanderkote, FIR No 190/2022 was registered in Police Station Ramban & FIR No 118/2022 in Police Station Banihal.

The overall rescue operation was made by police parties under the command of Insp Rakesh Jamwal SHO Batote, Insp P D Singh SHO Chanderkote, Insp Sandeep Charak SHO Ramban, PSI Harish Kumar IC Police Post J/T & Insp Muneer Khan SHO Banihal under the supervision of Pardeep Singh Sen Dy.SP HQ Ramban and Nissar Khoja SDPO Banihal with the overall supervision of SP Ramban Mohita Sharma.

District Police Samba also foiled an attempt to smuggle bovines by rescuing 3 bovines with the arrest of one smuggler. Acting on an information received through reliable sources regarding illegal transportation of bovines, a party of Police Station Samba while performing vehicle checking duty at Nud Naka, Samba intercepted a Mahindra vehicle (JK08L/6337). During checking, 3 bovines were found laden inside the said vehicle without any permission which were rescued. The driver of the vehicle namely Mohd Shareef, son of Ghulam Nabi, resident of Jrai Teh and Distt Kathua was arrested and FIR No. 125/2022 under section 188 IPC, 11 PCA Act was registered against him in Police Station Samba.

Bootlegger nabbed with 40 bottles of illicit liquor
