CRIME REPORT

Theft case solved; 2 arrested, stolen property recovered

HANDWARA: Police on Monday solved a theft case by arresting 2 accused persons involved in crime and recovered stolen property from their possession.

As per details, on May 22, 2022, Police Station Vilgam received a complaint from one Khurshid Ahmad Mir of Dolipora stating therein that his motorcycle bearing registration number PB02BL-9018 has been stolen. Accordingly, a case under relevant sections of law was registered at Police Station Vilgam and investigation started. During the course of investigation, many suspects were called for questioning and after strenuous efforts investigating team zeroed in on two suspects namely Adil Ahmad Sheikh, son of Ab Gani Sheikh, resident of Punzwa and Nazir Ahmad Khan, son of Bashir Ahmed Khan, resident of Dingree Vilgam.

During questioning, officers learnt about their involvement in crime and on their disclosure stolen motorcycle along with another motorcycle bearing registration number JK05C-9203 were recovered. Both accused persons were arrested and further investigation of the case is going on.

Snatching case solved; accused arrested within 48 hours

REASI: Police on Monday solved a snatching case within 48 hours by arresting an accused.

As per details, FIR no. 118/2022 under section 382 of IPC was registered at Police Station Reasi after getting complaint of snatching at Bus Stand Reasi from one Sakeena Bibi, wife of Mohd Sharif, resident of Simbal Chowa. Complainant stated that she withdrew Rs 55,000 from J&K Bank Reasi on May 21, 2022 at around 1300 hours, when she was on her way back to home; a person snatched her bag containing cash and ran away.

Sensing gravity of offence SSP Reasi Amit Gupta constituted multiple teams of Police Station Reasi to work out case. Police teams scanned CCTV footage from the areas and a number of suspects were rounded up during investigations. After strenuous efforts Police teams zeroed upon a suspect namely Rajinder Singh, son of Sukhdev Singh, resident of Jig Bagli, at present Gran Morh Reasi who was arrested. During interrogation, he confessed his crime and recovery of snatched money is being done. Further investigation of the case is going on.



46 bovines rescued; 2 vehicles seized, smuggler arrested

KATHUA/NAGROTA: To thwart conspiracies of bovine smuggling from the society, Police on Monday foiled bovine smuggling attempts at Rajbagh and Nagrota by rescuing 46 bovines and seized 2 vehicles besides arresting a smuggler.

As per details, a police team led by Insp Amit Sangra SHO Rabagh under the supervision of SDPO Border Pankaj Soodan while on Naka/checking duty at opposite to NHW Rajbagh noticed a suspicious Truck (JK20B-6546) and signalled it to stop for checking.

On seeing police party, driver of vehicle managed fled from the spot leaving behind vehicle. On thorough checking, 18 bovines were found laden in vehicle which were rescued and vehicle was seized. Accordingly, FIR No. 109/2022 under section 188 of IPC Act, 11 of PCA Act was registered at Police Station Rajbagh.

In a massive drive against bovine smuggling, Nagrota Police also rescued 7 bovines during Naka checking at Ban Toll Plaza. A vehicle (JK02CU-4437) was also seized by police. FIR No.227/2022 under section 188 of IPC & 11 of PCA Act was registered at Police Station Nagrota. The overall arrests and recoveries were made by SHO Nagrota Insp Vishav Pratap Singh under supervision of SDPO Nagrota Pardeep Kumar.

Further, by rescuing 14 animals from a vehicle, Rajouri police also foiled a bovine smuggling bid and seized a vehicle besides arresting the accused driver.

Police said that in evening hours of Monday, a team led by Incharge Police Post Chingus Chatyar, PSI Sahil Chowdhary under close supervision of SHO Rajouri Insp Farced Ahmed during routine Checking/frisking at the Kallar Naka in jurisdiction intercepted a Truck. The vehicle with registration number JK02CD 2627 was found driven by one Qaramat Hussain, son of Liaqat Hussain, resident of Bhimber Gali and was found loaded with 14 bovines which were rescued. Cognizance in this regard has been taken under relevant sections of law at Police Station Rajouri

and further investigation is going on.

In another incident a Police Party headed by Incharge Police Post Chattyar PSI Sahil Choudhary under close supervision of SHO Rajouri Insp Farced Ahmed during patrolling at Naghooan area rescued 7 bovines from clutches of a smuggler namely Mohd Manzoor, son of Mohd Khan, resident of Tandwal Rajouri.

Woman nabbed with 5 lts illicit liquor

KATHUA: In a recent action against consumption/production of illegal liquor menace, Kathua Police under the overall supervision of SSP R C Kotwal arrested a woman at Chak Drab Khan Kathua on Monday and seized 5 lts of illicit liquor from her possession.

As per details, information was received from reliable sources that illicit liquor is being manufactured near Chak Drab Khan and its adjoining areas of Police Post Nagri. Acting swiftly, a team of Police Post Nagri led by Insp Balram Sharma Incharge Police Post Nagri under supervision of DySP Headquarters Kathua Shammi Kumar during special checking/ patrolling duty, noticed a suspicious woman who was involved in preparing/selling illicit liquor to people. On checking, approximately 5 lts illicit liquor was recovered from her possession. Identified as Babli Devi, wife of Balbir Chand, resident of Chak Drab Khan Tehsil, the woman was arrested and FIR No. 209/2022 under section 48(a) of Excise Act was registered against her at Police Station Kathua.

Missing woman, girl traced; reunited with families

KATHUA/JAMMU: Police on Monday traced out a missing woman and a girl and reunited them with family members.

As per details, on August 12, 2020 a missing report was lodged at Police Station Billawar by a person stating therein that his wife, resident of Guddu Falal District Kathua went missing from home. Acting on complaint, a missing report was registered at Police Station Billawar and search was launched to trace her. With strenuous efforts, coupled with technical assistance, a team of Police Station Billawar finally traced her and handed her over to family after completion of all legal formalities.

Meanwhile, another complaint was lodged at Police Post Sidhra, by legal heirs of a girl, stating that she went missing from her home. In this regard, a missing report dated March 26, 2022 was registered and investigation started. A team was formed under supervision of SDPO Nagrota Pardeep Kumar led by SHO Nagrota Insp Vishav Pratap Singh assisted by Incharge Police Post Sidhra SI Majid Hussain, which after putting in hectic efforts, traced the missing girl. Subsequently family of missing girl was informed and she was handed over to them after completing all legal formalities.

Theft case solved; 3 arrested, stolen telecom items recovered

KATHUA: Police on Monday solved a theft case by arresting 3 thieves and recovered stolen Telecom items (spare parts of Aircel tower) including 5 Eriession cards whose approximate value was Rs 1,55,000.

As per details, on May 21, 2022, one Boney Sharma, son of Thuru Ram, resident of Govindsar-B Kathua lodged a complaint at Police Post Industrial Estates Kathua stating therein that three persons namely Sandeep Kumar, son of Ram Paul, resident of Chumbrian Brahmana, Tehsil Bishnah; Sanjay Kumar, son of Sudesh Kumar, resident of Partap Singh Pura and Sunil Dutt, son of Tilak Raj, resident of Ratnal Bishnah, have stolen spare parts of machinery of Aircel tower which was installed in his fields and were trying to transport the stolen items by using a vehicle (JK02AS-7381).

Acting on report, a party from Police Post Industrial Estates Kathua headed by PSI Rambir Singh In-Charge Police Post Hatli under the supervision of DySP Headquarters Kathua Shammi Kumar arrested the thieves red handed. During sustained questioning all 3 accused confessed their crime and on their disclosure, stolen telecom items viz. 02 No's EDUR 9P (Edge Dual Transceive Unit) ERICSSON-03 cards whose approximate value was Rs 70,000, 1 EDUR (Edge Dual Transceive Unit) ERICSSON-02 cards net worth Rs 35,000 along with 02 RUW 01-B1 (Receive Unit Wide) ERICSSON cards net worth Rs. 50,000 thereby totalling to Rs 1,55,000 were recovered, for which FIR No. 205/2022 under section 379 of IPC was registered at Police Station Kathua.

Theft case solved; one arrested, stolen cash Rs 1.11 lakh, gold items recovered

JAMMU: Police on Monday solved a theft case by arresting an accused and recovered

ered stolen cash Rs 1,11,850 and gold items weighing 20 gm from his possession.

As per details, a complaint was lodged at Police Station Bakshi Nagar by one Rajeev Gupta, son of Charanjeet Lal Gupta, resident of Mazdoor Basti, Resham Ghar, Jammu regarding theft in his house.

On this, FIR No. 71/2022 under section 454/380 of IPC was registered and investigation started. After this, a team of Police Station Bakshi Nagar under supervision of SDPO West Rahul Nagar led by SHO Bakshi Nagar Insp Harjeet Singh, after putting in strenuous efforts, rounded-up a suspect namely Deepak Kumar alias Deepu, alias Daana, son of Amit Kumar, alias Manga, resident of Kalka Colony, Bahu Fort, Jammu. On further questioning, he confessed his crime and on his disclosure, stolen cash amounting to Rs 1,11,850 and gold ornaments weighing 20 gm were recovered from his possession.

Car lifting module busted; 3 arrested, four vehicles recovered

SRINAGAR: Police on Monday busted a car lifting module by arresting three persons in Srinagar and recovered 4 stolen vehicles.

As per details, Police Station Nowgam got an information about a module while investigating a theft case registered vide FIR No.57/2022 of Police Station Nowgam and subsequently, three accused were arrested, who were identified as Nazir Ahmad Dar alias Beta, son of Mohd Amin Dar, resident of Zangibagh; Mohd Younis Dar alias Inna Mir, son of Bashir Ahmad Dar, resident of Gund Chakpora and Sheikh Adnan Hussain, son of Sheikh Mohd Hussain, resident of Mochua, Badgam. Newly-wed policeman dies after getting hit by oil tanker

Mother assaulted by son, daughter-in-law

The victim further stated that she reported the matter to Sarpanch and Police too, but they didn't help her, after which she approached Deputy Commissioner Udhampur, who assured her a fair probe in the matter.

Dry fodder destroyed due to stubble fire in Gujjar Basti
