He praised smart city Jammu ltd for introducing smart parking on few locations of Jammu city, and said that without smart parking city can't be smart and urged that same plane should be opted under the flyover bridges at Akhnoor road Jammu.

DB annoyed over wasting of central funds for Wular conservation

JAMMU: In a PIL regarding protection of Wular lake and for the removal of all hutments and encroachment within catchment area in and around the lake, a Division Bench of Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh High Court Srinagar Wing comprising Chief Justice Pankaj Mithal and Justice Moksha Khajuria Kazni expressed annoyance over wasting of central funds for conservation of Wular Lake. DB observed that the Court is pained to notice that the Government has created Wular Lake Conservation and Management Authority for a specific purpose but aforesaid authority is unable to come up to the mark and rather, it appears to have been wasting the money sanctioned by the Union of India. When PIL came-up for hearing, Division Bench observed that the last order of the Court clearly indicates that 380 Kanals and 11 Marlas of Wular Lake is still under encroachment and efforts are being taken to retrieve aforesaid land.

DB observed that none of the authorities is coming forward with any specific time-limit within which they propose to retrieve the said land. DB further observed that it is also

recorded that Rs 200 crore more have been provided by Union of India for conservation and management of wet land. The report on record mentions that under Wular Action Plan, about Rs. 125 crore has already been spent. It was also recorded that residents of about 33 villages around the Wular Lake dump garbage into Lake and none of the authorities are able to check the said dumping or to provide any alternative site.

On last date, DB also directed the Senior Additional Advocate General, was directed to indicate strength of the staff of Wular Conservation and Management Authority; the number of persons employed and the effective steps taken for conservation and preservation of the Lake. In response, the Additional PCCF/Chief Executive Director, Wular Conservation and Management Authority, Kashmir, has filed an Action Taken Report, simply stating that the Authority is making sincere efforts for conservation and preservation of the Lake. It has staff strength of 43 employees only which are all drawn on deputation and there is no separate sanctioned staff in the Authority. After going through the ATR filed, DB called explanation of Chief Executive Director as to what

action he has taken to get staff for the Authority sanctioned and for its appointment, as also how amount of Rs 125 crore has been spent with complete details of heads under which the expenses have been incurred and steps taken for retrieving balance land of Wular Lake.

DB also requested Advocate General, D C Raina to co-ordinate between the various departments and to place before this Court the precise stand of the respondents with regard to the conservation and preservation of Wular Lake as also regarding the utilization of money sanctioned by the Union of India for the above purpose. "Nonetheless, we have called upon D C Raina, Advocate General and T M Shamsi, ASGI to arrange for some token payment to him for each effective hearing which offer they readily accepted. Accordingly, we direct both of them to contribute total of Rs. 10,000, in equal proportion, for each effective hearing for payment to the learned Amicus Curiae which amount shall be deposited with the Registry of this Court for payment to the learned Amicus Curiae or to his nominee or as may be deemed fit by the Court later on," the Court directed.

JAMMU: A Divisional Level Sensitization Workshop for key Stakeholders on Tobacco Control was on Tuesday organized by the Directorate of Health Services (DHS), Jammu in Government Hospital Gandhi Nagar.

The event was held under the aegis of National Tobacco Control Programme with technical support of The International Union against Tuberculosis & Lung Disease (The Union) New Delhi.

Several high ranking Officers from different Government departments like School Education, Police, Higher Education, Excise, Sales Tax, Litigation, Labour, Information, Administration, Food and Drugs, Rural Development and Panchayati Raj, Transport, Jammu Municipal Corporation attended the workshop. The nationally acclaimed experts from New Delhi with vast experience and knowledge in Tobacco Control, enlightened the audience regarding Health hazards, Epidemiology of Tobacco use,

Challenges in Tobacco Control, including implementation of World Health Organization's Framework Convention on Tobacco Control Article 5.3.

A presentation on Tobacco Vendor Licensing was given by an expert from The Union. The various provisions of Cigarettes and Other Tobacco Products Act 2003 and the Prohibition of E-Cigarettes Act 2019 were also discussed.

It is pertinent to mention that Smoking is prohibited in all Public places, while sale of Tobacco Products to and by Minors is also not permitted and can attract a penalty which can include imprisonment.

Also, it is against the law to sell any Tobacco products within 100 yards of any

Educational Institutions. Similarly, there is prohibition on advertisement, brand promotion and sponsorship of Tobacco products, both directly and indirectly. Further, displaying Pictorial Health Warnings is mandatory by law, on all Tobacco Products.

Director Health Services Jammu, Dr. Saleem-ur-Rehman, in his address, welcomed the participants and exhorted them to utilize this opportunity to aware themselves regarding their responsibilities in Tobacco Control. He specifically asked Health Officer Jammu Municipal Corporation to work on Tobacco Vendor Licensing in consultation with counterparts in other States where it is being

JAMMU: Expressing resentment against unruly behaviour of traffic police personnel in the Union Territory towards oil-tankers and drivers, a protest was held in Jammu on Tuesday under the banner of All J&K Tanker Driver and Conductor Association, which was attended by a number of members.

Speaking on the occasion, the protesting members highlighted unruly behaviour of traffic cops

who even not hesitate to beat drivers and their assistants, besides harassing them in several ways, which ultimately result in timely delivery of petrol and diesel.

They further said that many of the tankers have to deliver the supplies to defence installations, but due to adamant behavior

of traffic cops, they fail to deliver consignments in time.

Speaking on the occasion, Paramjeet, President of association asked the administration to issue necessary directives to traffic personnel for not harassing the oil-tankers unnecessarily so they can deliver the consignments without any problem. He further demanded that oil-tankers should not be stopped by traffic police at any place, as in past. If our demands would not be fulfilled, the association would be forced to intensify the agitation including closure of all oil depots, responsibility of which would be on the administration.

This is first of its kind surgery outside GMC Jammu in probably any of the Health Institutions of Jammu province.
