RAMNAGAR: Since the occupation of most of the people of Ramnagar is agriculture so to acquaint the students about the nutrient contents of the soil and the practical knowledge of the soil testing methods, an effort 'Know Your Soil' started by the department of Chemistry under the supervision of H.O.D Chemistry Prof. Ritika Mahajan.

In this regard the students visited to the 'Soil Testing Laboratory' in Department of

Agriculture and Farmer's welfare, Udhampur. The laboratory staff narrated the students about the basic soil needs and soil health cards. The staff also narrated the proper way of taking the soil sample from field and the various laboratory tests which are carried out to find the nutrient contents.

The electrical conductivity test, estimation of potassium using 'Flame Photometer', estimation of sulphur using 'UV-visible spectrometer' and the

estimation of phosphorous were the tests narrated by the staff. Similarly N content of the given soil sample was estimated by general Titration method using Potassium Dichromate solution as indicator. The students were also made aware with the studies using AAS (Atomic Absorption Spectrometer) for the analysis of micronutrients in the soil. Lastly a question answer session was conducted where students asked about the general problems faced by them in their respective fields. Sanjay Anand, CAO Udhampur appreciated the effort made by GDC Ramnagar and assured the assistance and guidance regarding soil testing in future too. Dr R K Pandoh, Assistant

Soil Chemist, Smt Jaymala AEO, Dr Vinay Jandial, ASCO and DR Sukhbeer MDO were also present.

Dr Udhay Bhanu, Principal GDC Ramnagar opined that such activities are necessary for the overall development of the students and 'Know Your Soil' an effort by our college will be of great help for the local farmers.
