has failed to fulfill its legitimate responsibilities toward working class. The BMS leaders further alleged that minimum wages has not been revised under minimum wages Act even after lapse of five years, as necessary recommendations in this regard were made by the concerned Committee in 2016.

The leaders further said that there are grave viola-

tions of contract labour act as very less workers are shown under ESI and PF, illegal deductions are being made by employers and labour is taken from open market on daily cash payment basis, without maintaining any record. The BMS leaders further said that PF amount lying with JKEPFO has not been

transferred properly to Central EPFO and there is no any transparency. "One can also guess about the casual attitude of Govt from fact that ALCs of District Jammu, Samba and Ramban were transferred one month ago but no any replacement has been provided due to which poor workers are sufferings.

There is huge exploitation of workers in ongoing prestigious projects as neither safety standards are being maintained nor proper wages are being paid. Moreover, no meeting of any statutory boards like ESI, PF or unorganised Workers Welfare Board has been convened from last more than three years," they added.

Afghan man held with medicines worth over Rs 64 lakh at IGI airport

NEW DELHI: An Afghanistan national was apprehended by CISF personnel at the Delhi airport for carrying tablets valued at more than Rs 64 lakh in an alleged unauthorised manner. Fazli Ahmad Shah Mohammad was intercepted on Wednesday evening just before he was about to board a SpiceJet flight to Kabul via Dubai from the terminal-III of the Indira Gandhi International Airport, a senior Central Industrial Security Force officer said.

A number of packets, of tablets understood to be used for treatment of brain tumour, worth Rs 64.40 lakh were recovered from his hand baggage, the CISF officer said.

"The passenger could not produce supporting documents or a medical prescription for carrying such huge quantity of medicines. He was handed over to Customs authorities for further investigation," the officer said.
