Besides World University Rankings, Times Higher Education publishes several other rankings of institutions every year on different parameters.

One of the most important among these is the Impacts Rankings, which evaluates thousands of universities from all over the world on their contributions to the United Nations (UN) Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

The Times Higher Education Impact Rankings assesses their commitment to sustainability across four broad areas: research, stewardship, outreach and teaching.

In this year's rankings, KIIT has been ranked 8th best in the entire

world for its impact in one parameter of SDGs - 'Reducing Inequalities'. With impressive ranks of 101-200 in other SDGs - Quality Education; Peace, Justice & Strong Institutions; and Partnerships for the Goals - KIIT has achieved the overall position of 201-300 in the rankings, which lists over 1500 universities from 106 countries.
