Killer of Martyr Constable among two JeM terrorists killed

SRINAGAR: Security forces shot dead two Jaish-e-Mohammad (JeM) terrorists in an overnight encounter in Pulwama district, police said on Monday.

One of the slain terrorists was involved in the martyrdom of police constable Reyaz Ahmad earlier this month, a police spokesman said.

He said that on a specific input generated by the Kulgam police regarding the presence of terrorists in village Gundipora of Pulwama, a joint cordon and search operation was launched by security forces.

"During the search operation, as the joint search party approached towards the suspected spot, the hiding terrorists in the residential house of Nazir Ahmad Mir fired indiscriminately upon the search party which was retaliated leading to an encounter," he said.

The spokesman said that to



avoid any collateral damage due to darkness, the operation was suspended during the night hours and was resumed in the wee hours.

"In the ensuing encounter, two terrorists, identified as Abid Hussain Shah son of Late Mushtaq Ahmad Shah resident of Monghama Pulwama and Saqib Azad Sofi son of Azad Ahmad Sofi resident of Amshipora Shopian, were killed. They were affiliated with proscribed terror outfit JeM," he



m Judge}$ NIA Ashwani Sharma observed that in present case, the question of unity, integrity, securi-

ty and sovereignty of India in general and UT of J&K In particular is involved in case in which the applicant herein is alleged to have played a key-role. "The investigation of the case is at its infancy and if the accused/applicant would be enlarged on bail, the course of justice would be thwarted. The embargo contained under section 43-D (5) of UA(P) Act is also attracted in the present case. Thus, in larger interest of security of the state, the accused is not entitled to bail at this stage. The application, as such, is accordingly rejected," the Court observed.

Language, Mathematics, Science, and Social Science were chosen as subjects for

assessment in classes 3 and 5, while Environmental Studies was added for class 8 and Social Science and Modern Indian Language for

A total number of 79256 students and 16260 teachers in 3650 schools from all the 20 districts of J&K UT par-

ticipated in the survey. According to the NAS report card published recently, the percentage ratio of boys to girls for class 3 was 51 and 49 respectively while it was 78 and 22 for urban to
