BSF detects suspected underground cross-border tunnel in Samba

JAMMU: BSFWednesday detected a suspected underground crossborder tunnel in Samba district of Jammu and Kashmir, nearly a fortnight after security forces gunned down two suicide bombers Jaish-e-Mohammed (JeM) outfit who had infiltrated from Pakistan, officials said.

Deputy Inspector General of BSF (Jammu) S P S Sandhu said a small opening, believed to be a suspected tunnel, was found in a general area near fencing in

Due to darkness further search could not be carried out. Detailed search will be carried out early in the morning at first light, Sandhu, who is the public relations officer of the force, said, sharing a few pictures of the suspected tunnel.

However, BSF sources said the suspected tunnel was detected by the troops
