Court awards life...

of Avtar Singh, resident of Preet Nagar Digiana Jammu and this vehicle had been used with an intention to kill deceased Madan Lal.

During investigation it came up that Jagmandeep Singh @ JD, Inderpreet Singh @ Rustam sons of Chanchal Singh, resident of Trikuta Nagar Jammu, Narijnan Singh @ Putu, son of Jameet Singh, resident of Gurha Slathia Tehsil Samba and deceased Madan Lal had dispute regarding land comprising of khasra Nos. 642 and 650 measuring about 94 kanals situate at village Dagdhore Tehsil Samba; that the land was under the possession of deceased Madan Lal and to obtain its possession Inderpreet Singh, Jagmandeep Singh and Narijnan Singh had filed a case before ACR Samba who decided that the land was in question was Evacuee (Custodian) Property and directed the parties that the case be filed in the court of Custodian General; that these three persons got this knowledge, they met at a hotel in Gandhi Nagar with Ramesh Kumar @ Chacha, Jarnail Singh @ Katta S/O Harpal Singh and Jasvinder Singh @ Jimmy S/O Kulbir Singh R/O Ward No. 72 Bhor Camp and entered into criminal conspiracy and devised a plan to get rid of Madan Lal so that the possession of the land may be obtained.

It was agreed that a tata sumo be purchased and a driver be prepared who under the pretext of accident shall kill Madan Lal; that a trucker Simranjeet Singh S/O Avtar Singh R/O Preet Nagar Digiana was prepared on 06.08.2010 a tata sumo No. JK02H-9654 was purchased in the name of Ramesh Kumar @ Chacha from Madan Lal Chowhan sale and purchase company warehouse Nehru Market against the consideration of Rs. 100,000/- on 11.08.2010, which was further got transferred in the name of Simranjeet Singh on 12.08.2010 from the owner of the vehicle by executing a transfer set.

As per plan on 12.08.2010 at 7:45 AM while Madan Lal was proceeding towards Vijaypur on his Vespa scooter. He was hit from the rear by driver Simranjeet Singh with tata sumo No. JK02H-9654 at Kartholi on National Highway.

Jarnail Singh @ Katta was also occupants of the tata sumo whereas Jagmandeep Singh @ JD, Inderpreet Singh @ Rustam, Ramesh Kumar @ Chacha, Jasvinder Singh @ Jimmy and Narijnan Singh @ Blootu had been waiting near Palahawan hotel near Kartholi regarding the occurrence.

The driver after committing the crime fled away and all the accused got connected each other telephonically. Driver Simranjeet Singh parked the offending vehicle at a secluded place near 17 miles and returned to Jammu along with Jarnail Singh in a bus and reached the home of Jagmandeep Singh @ JD, where all the accused had assembled and an amount of Rs. 25000 each were given to Ramesh Kumar @ Chacha and Simranjeet Singh by Inderpreet Singh for expenses to get bail. In view of these facts the offences punishable U/Ss 279/304-A RPC were discarded and offences U/Ss 302/120 B RPC were substituted in the FIR.

Principal Sessions Judge Samba Sonia Gupta after hearing Public Prosecutor Jawad Ahmed Khawaja with Special Public Prosecutor Rakesh Chagotra for the State, observed that it is a settled proposition that in awarding sentence in our civilized society, a reasonable proportion has to be maintained by the Court between the heinousness of the crime and the punishment.

The sentences are imposed to reflect the seriousness of the crime, to promote respect for the law, to provide just punishment for the offence, to afford adequate deterrent to criminal conduct and to protect the community from further similar conduct.

In awarding sentence, the court must look in to the crime, the victim besides the circumstances of the criminal and the impact of the crime on community and in the present case, as submitted by counsels for convicts that Jagmandeep Singh, Jasvinder Singh, Jarnail Singh and Ramesh Kumar are young persons and the imposition of sentence for life imprisonment u/s 302 RPC would serve the interest of justice and that the present case does not fall in the category of rarest of rare case so as to the imposition of death sentence, which is of exceptional nature.

Keeping in view the age of the convicts/accused and considering the contention of defence counsels about the crime, I think this case does not fall in the category of rarest of rare case. Keeping in view the age of the convicts, imprisonment for life shall be adequate sentence in the present case u/s 302 RPC.

Accordingly, the following sentences are imposed upon the convicts/accused for offences U/Ss 302/120-B/201 RPC and ordered that Convict/accused namely, Jagmandeep Singh @ JD S/O Chanchal Singh R/O Trikuta Nagar, Jammu, is sentenced to undergo imprisonment for life and a fine of Rs. 30,000 for offence u/s 302 RPC and in default of payment of fine, he shall undergo further imprisonment for six months.

New defence tech...

symposium is Raksha Atmanirbharta in line with Atmanirbhar Bharat'. Our defence industry has shown remarkable progress in the field of defence manufacturing in past few years and this symposium is a step to give it a further boost", the Army commander said.

He said that close linkages between armed forces, defence industry and academia will propel the efforts of Raksha Atmanirbharta in the right direction. "The symposium serves to showcase cutting-edge technologies and innovative products providing solutions to complex challenges faced by the Northern Command", he added.

Dwivedi said that it will enable all ranks to enhance their technological knowledge and threshold for conduct of efficient and smooth operational and technological solutions to

enhance all weather surveillance, ensure force protection and develop own fire power and mobility.

"With the rapid transformation of technology in the fields of robotics and artificial intelligence, the situation demands that the focus of the symposium be also on these shifting trends, in order to achieve cutting edge over our adversaries," he said. Army commander said that Northern Command is the operationally most active command of the Indian Army.

It is actively facing the challenges on the Western borders along the Line of Control, the Northern borders along the Line of Actual Control in Eastern Ladakh, and is also responsible for the internal security in the hinterland of J-K", he said.

He said that the symposium will help in mutual exchange of ideas between the defence industry and Army with respect to induction of currently available products and sensitise the industry with respect to the future needs.

"Interaction between defence industry and Army is critical for achieving higher degree of self-reliance. This way, the industry gets to know about the customization needs of the Army", Lt Gen Dwivedi said.

In reply to another question about the types of technology needed for most sensitive northern operation theatre, he said that the Northern Command area of operations being highly varied, poses various challenges to the troops in terms of enhanced fire power, mobility, force protection, Electronic Warfare, Intelligence, Surveillance and Reconnaissance.

"Hence, any technological solution or product which can obviate these challenges is welcome. Of particular interest to the Northern Command are drone and anti-drone technology, robotics and artificial intelligence, virtual reality and augmented reality, fire power, security solutions, disruptive technologies, individual force protection and habitat and medical innovations", he added.

Northern Army Commander also said that the actions by PLA along the Line of Actual Control (LAC) gave the Indian forces an opportunity to build their capacities and asserted that a high standard of operational preparedness needs to be maintained at all times along the border in Ladakh.

Lt Gen Dwivedi, who was referring to the clash between the Indian soldiers and Chinese troops in the Galwan Valley in June 2020, also said that People's Liberation Army's (PLA's) aggression in eastern Ladakh was met with 'swift mobilization and appropriate force posturing'.

"Given the nature of challenges faced by Northern Command, a high standard of operational preparedness needs to be maintained at all times (along LAC in eastern Ladakh)," Lt Gen Dwivedi said.

The General Officer Commanding-in-Chief of the Army's Northern Command (GOC-in-C) was replying to a question about the multi-sectorial challenges being faced by Northern Command for years.

He said that the Army is looking at enhancing its technological threshold in different areas of operational preparedness. "To sustain these levels of preparedness, we are looking at Atmanirbharta' or self-reliance to provide the solutions," he said.

The border row between India and China erupted in May 2020 and the stand-off escalated on June 15, when troops from the two sides clashed in Galwan Valley near Patrol Point 14.

The Army commander saw an opportunity in this aggression to buildup capacities and boost up defence preparedness along LAC.

"While the actions by PLA created an adverse situation temporarily, we took it as an opportunity to build our capacities, review our plans in light of the new realities about how PLA treats the LAC, enhanced our mobilization capacities, boosted our defence preparedness and brought about a shift in the overall response dynamics," the GOC-in-C said.

Despite existing agreements and protocols, PLA's aggression in Eastern Ladakh and attempt to surprise us were met with swift mobilization and appropriate force posturing, duly synergised with the other two Services, he said.

"Our speedy buildup of military infrastructure and logistics, indomitable spirit of our soldiers and astute leadership of commanders at all levels are of very high standards", he said, adding all this together has exemplified Indian Army as a powerful and modern military.

PM Modi meets...

to discuss how to ensure cessation of hostilities in Ukraine and mitigate the global economic consequences of this conflict.

On Tuesday, Macron spoke with his Russian counterpart Vladimir Putin and urged Moscow to rise to the level of its responsibility as a permanent member of the US Security Council by ending this devastating aggression, an Elysee statement said.

The Ukraine issue also figured prominently at the second India-Nordic summit attended by Prime Minister Modi and his counterparts from Finland, Iceland, Sweden, Norway and Denmark in Copenhagen on Wednesday.

Modi has said that India believes no country would emerge victorious in the Russia-Ukraine war as all will suffer losses and there will be a "more serious" impact on developing and poor countries.

Another focus area of the talks would be to unitedly deal with the challenges in the Indo-Pacific, amid China flexing muscles in the region. Soon after his arrival here, Modi in a tweet described France as one of India's strongest partners, with both countries cooperating in diverse areas.

Diplomatic sources said Modi's meeting with Macron days after his election victory is highly symbolic. It sends a powerful signal that the two leaders want to make the Indo-French partnership a guiding principle of their foreign policy for the years to come, they said.

It's also a demonstration of the level of personal chemistry between the two leaders, which gives impetus to our joint actions across all fields of cooperation, they said.

Modi will be among the first few world leaders to meet President Macron after his re-election last week. He had congratulated Macron after his re-election. "I look forward to continue working together to deepen the India-French Strategic Partnership," Modi had tweeted. His visit comes during the French presidency of the European Union. It also coincides with the 75 years of diplomatic relations between India and France.

He said the encroachment of pedestrian ways blocks the flow of the traffic and also results in accidents. We have seized a few kiosks and warned others during the drive carried out from Vikram Chowk to Gandhi Nagar. They have already been allotted special zones to earn their livelihood but any violation on their part will not be tolerated, the official said, adding the government has launched many schemes for the welfare of street vendors. He said the drive will continue and will cover different areas including Raghunath temple to Shaheedi Chowk, Gandhi Nagar to Shashtri Nagar; Shaheedi Chowk to City Chowk, Gandhi Nagar to Nanak Nagar; Lakhdata Bazar to chowk Chabutra, Nanak Nagar to Bahu Plaza, City Chowk to Parade, Vikram Chowk to Bagad Mandi Trikuta Nagar; Patel Bazar to Chowk Chabutra, Trikuta Nagar to Channi Biza, Chowk Chabutra to Panjirthi and Channi Himmat-Thanger in coming days. A man, who lost his iron-made roadside stall, claimed that he was not given any notice by the JMC even as he was running the stall since 2017 and was paying Rs 200 to the department per month. It was the JMC which gave me a loan under the street vendor scheme. I was at home nearby in connection with Eid-ul-Fitr when someone told me that the JMC is taking away my Khokha. I had not opened my staff for the past one month, he said.
