CRIME REPORT

Three Punjab-residents die in Nagrota car accident

NAGROTA: Three persons, including a driver, who were traveling in a vehicle met with an accident near Jambu Zoo under jurisdiction of Nagrota police, resulting in their on-spot death.

As per details, a Celerio car (PB6SAF/4794) driven by one Gurdeep Singh, son of Gurtej Singh, resident of Moga (Punjab) and 2 others namely Sham Lal, son of Bahadur Ram, resident of Firozpur (Punjab), Vikas Kumar, son of Ranjit Kumar, resident of Firozpur (Punjab), on way from Udhampur towards Jammu, when reached near Jambu Zoo, rolled down from NH as the driver lost control over the vehicle. In the mishap, all three persons died on spot. Later, the bodies were shifted to GMC Jammu for post-mortem. FIR No.178/2022 under sections 279/304-A of IPC was registered in Police Station Nagrota.



MVD Reasi recovers Rs 6,000 fine from traffic violators

REASI: Following complaints against flouting of traffic rules by commercial passenger vehicles, ARTO Reasi Rajesh Gupta on Friday laid Naka checking in different parts of Katra. The team of official led by ARTO Challedan 14 vehicles and recovered a fine of Rs. 6,000 from violators.

Rajesh Gupta said that the team also removed extra seats from passenger vehicles which were being used to carry extra passengers. The inspection team also advised the people to observe traffic norms and road safety rules while traveling. The ARTO Reasi asked drivers of passenger vehicles to strictly adhere to the traffic rules to avoid any action by the department.



Leh Police arrests drug peddler with Ganja

LEH: District Police Leh continuing its efforts to eradicate menace of drugs, arrested a drug peddler and recovered contraband substance from his possession on Friday.

As per details, a party of Police Post Choglamsar Leh while conducting random Naka checking at Kuze-Buddha Chowk, Chuchot Yokma apprehended a suspect carrying a bag.

During checking, Ganja like substance was recovered from possession of suspect identified as Vivek Kumar, son of Sonelal Prasad, resident of Pipra, Santpur West Chamaparan, Bihar. FIR No 55/2022 under sections 8/20 of NDPS was registered against him at Police Station Leh.



Two missing women traced, reunited with families

JAMMU: Police on Friday traced two missing women and reunited them with their

families.

As per details, a report was lodged at Police Station Janipur regarding missing of a woman by her legal heirs on January 23, 2022 after which investigation started. After this special, a team of Police Station Janipur under the supervision of SDPO West Rahul Nagar led by SHO Janipur Insp Ajaz Haider, after putting in hectic efforts, traced the missing woman.

Similarly, information was received at Police Post Rehari regarding a woman wandering in area. On this, a team from Police Post Rehari was sent, which brought the woman to Police Post Rehari and offered her meals. A team under the supervision of SDPO North Sharad Kalu led by Incharge Police Post Rehari SI Ahmed Din, after hectic efforts, contacted family of missing woman.

Finally, families of missing women were informed and both were handed-over to their respective family members after completing all legal formalities.

Three theft cases solved, 4 arrested, stolen material recovered

DODA/ARNLA/BISHNAH: Police on Friday solved three theft cases by arresting 4 accused and recovered stolen items from their possession.

Doda Police said that on a complaint lodged by one Vijay Sharma, wife of Late Shakti Sharma, resident of Sungli Bhadarwah regarding theft of 2 CCTV cameras from her house, FIR No. 68/2022 under sections 457/380 of IPC was registered in Police Station Bhadarwah. After this, a team of Police Station Bhadarwah led by Insp Jatinder Singh Rakwal SHO Bhadarwah assisted by PSI Nishant Salgotra and PSI Bhupinder Sharma, put in strenuous efforts and rounded up 2 suspects namely Ranjit Kumar, son of Rakesh Kumar and Sunil Kumar, son of Jaswant Singh, both residents of Kach Nalti, Bhadarwah.

During questioning, both suspects admitted their crime and on their disclosure, the stolen CCTV Cameras were recovered from their possession. The recovery and arrest of accused persons was made by Police Party under the supervision of Abdul Ghafoor Mir, SDPO Bhadarwah and overall supervision of Mohd Aftab Addl. SP Bhadarwah.

Meanwhile, on May 4, 2022, a complaint was lodged at Police Station Arnai by one Surinder Singh, son of Swarn Singh, resident of Sai Tingali (Secretary Gurdwara Sahib Committee) pertaining to theft at Gurdwara Sahib at Sai Tingali Jammu. On receipt of this information, FIR No. 35/2022 under sections 454/380 of IPC was registered at Police Station Arnai and investigation started.

A team of Police Station Arnai under the supervision of SDPO R S Pura Surinder Singh, after hectic efforts, rounded up a suspect namely Uday Kumar, son of Rajesh Kumar, resident of Jabawal, Tehsil Arnai. During thorough questioning accused confessed his involvement in crime and on his disclosure, stolen cash was recovered.

Miran Sahib police also arrested a thief involved in series of theft cases in shanties at Bishnah and its peripherals. The thief used to target shanties when all labourers were out for their work. On complaints, police scrutinized CCTV footage and nabbed him. The accused was identified as Rohit Kumar, resident of Miran Sahib.

Two absconders arrested

AKHNOOR/GANDO: Police on Friday nabbed two absconders who were evading their arrest from a long time.

As per details, an absconder namely Gurdeep Singh, son of Pritam Singh, resident of Ward No. 2 Simbal Camp Miran Sahib Jammu was arrested as Court of JMJC Akhnoor has issued a warrant of arrest under section 512 of CrPC against him in FIR No. 227/1993 under sections 279/337



of IPC. He was evading arrest since 1994. The arrest was made by a team of Akhnoor Police led by Insp Hilal Azhar SHO Akhnoor.

Doda Police also arrested an absconder who was evading arrest for last one year. While giving details, Police said that an absconder namely Mohd Yaqoob, son of Suleman, resident of Kathua at present staying at Talie Dhar Gandoh, wanted in a criminal case registered at Police Station Gandoh, was evading arrest for last one year. A massive hunt was launched by Police in which sources were generated about the movement and presence of absconder. Ultimately, after receiving specific information about his presence, a police team headed by SHO Gandoh, Inspector Vikram Singh, arrested the absconder and produced him before JMJC Court Gandoh.

SSP rewards cop for honesty

KISHTWAR: SSP Kishtwar on Friday rewarded a cop for showing honesty.

As per details, a SPO Chuni Lal Thakur posted in traffic wing of JK Police deployed at Om Mehta Road crossing, Kishtwar found a wallet containing some cash, ATM card, identity card & other important documents. Accordingly information was shared with Dy SP Hqrs Kishtwar Ashish Gupta who disseminated the same among all subordinate units. After putting in hectic efforts, the owner of wallet was identified and after proper verification, the found wallet was handed over to owner, who was a CISF personnel.

SSP Kishtwar Shafqat Hussain Batt appreciated the honesty of cop and also rewarded him suitably. It is worthwhile to mention here that it is second instance in last two days where cops of District Police Kishtwar while performing duties have found wallets containing cash etc and same have been handed over to their owners.

76 bovines rescued, 15 smugglers arrested

UDHAMPUR/RAJOURI/SAMBA/POONCH: Police on Friday rescued 76 bovines by foiling separate smuggling bids and arrested 15 smugglers.

As per details, a party of Police Station Udhampur at Jakhani naka, stopped 2 vehicles carrying bovines. On checking of vehicles, police team found 8 bovines laden in vehicles, which were rescued. Police seized both vehicles and arrested drivers identified as Mashkoor Ahmed, son of Parveez Ahmed, resident of Batote and Shoaib Ali, son of Mohd Billa, resident of Majalta. Case under relevant sections of law was registered in Police Station Udhampur. The arrest and recoveries were made by SHO Udhampur Insp Chaman Gorkha under the supervision of DySP Hqrs. Sahil Mahajan.

Meanwhile, several bovine smuggling bids were foiled in Thannamandi area of Rajouri with seizure of five vehicles. Five smugglers were also arrested and 23 bovines were rescued.

In an official statement, Rajouri police said that on Friday, teams of police from Thannamandi police station headed by SHO Shoket Amin under supervision of SDPO Thannamandi Dr Intiaz Ahmed during Naka checking intercepted five Tata mobiles, loaded with 23 bovines, which were rescued. All the vehicles were seized and the drivers were arrested. FIRs 61, 62, 63, 64 & 65/2022 under sections 188 of IPC, 11 of PCA Act were registered in local police station. The seized vehicles included Tata Mobiles (JK20B 4096, JK11E 5784, JK11E 7169, JK11D 6914 and JK11D 0219). The accused were identified as Mohd Rafiq, son of Fakir Mohd, resident of Kunder Reasi; Mohd Altaf, son of Mohd Shafi, resident of Dandote Kotranka; Mohd Mushtaq, son of Qamar Din, resident of Dandote Kotranka; Mohd Ishtyaq, son of Abdul Gafar; resident of Dandote Kotranka and Zarayat Hussain, son of Ali Sher, resident of Dandote.

In another instance, District Police Samba successfully foiled an attempt to smuggle bovines by rescuing 14 bovines with arrest of 2 smugglers under jurisdiction of Police Station Samba. Acting on information received through reliable sources regarding illegal transportation of bovines, a party of Police Station Samba during vehicle checking at Nud, Samba intercepted a truck (JK13B-8537) for checking, which was found laden with 14 bovines. The driver of vehicle namely Amar Dev, son of Sanjeev Dev, resident of Lambring, Assam along with his associate Showket Ali, son of Abdul Ghani, resident of Mralyan, Miran Sahib, Jammu was arrested and FIR No. 108/2022 under section 188 of IPC, 11 of PCA Act was registered against them in Police Station Samba.

Poonch Police also rescued 31 animals from clutches of bovine smugglers while foiling bovine smuggling bids in Surankote area.

On direction of SSP Poonch Rohit Baskotra teams headed by DYSP Surankote Tanveer Jeelani, SHO Surankote Insp Niaz Ahmed, Incharge Police Post Behramgalla SI Sushant Singh established Nakas at Behramgalla / Panar/fazlabad areas. During checking, police apprehended 7 bovine smugglers and seized 7 vehicles Tata mobile (JK11E 6640, JK11C 9104, JK12A 7835, JK 22A 0754, Jk11B 8285, Jk12 7556 & JK11D 3063). Seven FIRs 90, 91, 96, 98, 100, 101 & 102 of 2022 under sections 188 of IPC, 11 of PCA Act were registered at Police Station Surankote and further investigations started.
