CRIME REPORT

Abducted minor girl rescued in Jammu; accused arrested

REASI: Police on Saturday recovered a kidnapped minor girl from Jammu and arrested the accused.

As per details, a person, resident of Gungus Talwara, lodged a complaint with Police Post Talwara that his minor daughter, age seventeen years went to market but didn't come back. He along with his family members started searching her at their own level but found no clue and approached Police Post Talwara. Complainant doubted that his minor daughter has been kidnapped by someone.

On getting information, FIR No 90/2022 under sections 363 /109 of IPC was lodged at Police Station Reasi and search was launched by multiple police parties. After hectic efforts, presence of minor was established in Jammu.

SSP Reasi, Amit Gupta immediately framed a special team led by Sub Inspector and sent it to Jammu for recovery of minor. With help of local Police, the team raided several places and ultimately recovered missing minor girl. An accused namely Vishal Kumar, son of Tilak Raj, resident of Channi Himmat, Jammu was also arrested in the case.

Woman among two missing persons traced, reunited with families

JAMMU: Police on Saturday traced two missing persons and reunited them with their families.

As per details, a missing report was lodged at Police Station Bishnah, regarding missing of one Govind, son of Govind Ram, resident of Bishnah. In this regard, missing report was registered and investigation started. After this, a team of Police Station Bishnah under supervision of SDPO R S Pura Surinder Singh led by SHO Bishnah Insp Pawan Kumar, after putting in hectic efforts, traced the missing person.

One more missing report was lodged at Police Station Arnia by legal heirs of a woman stating that she went missing from her home. In this regard, a missing report was registered on April 16, 2022 and investigation started. After this, a team of Police Station Arnia led by SHO Insp Devinder Singh, after putting in strenuous efforts, traced the missing woman. Families of missing persons were informed by respective Police stations and traced persons were handed over to their respective family members after completing all legal formalities.

Four absconders arrested

JAMMU: Police on Saturday arrested four absconders evading their arrests for a long time.

As per details, an information was received at Police Station Akhnoor regarding an absconder namely Gurdeep Singh, son of Pritam Singh, resident of Simbal Camp Miran Sahib Jammu who was evading his arrest since 1994 i.e., 26 years in FIR No. 227/1993 registered under sections 279/337 of IPC at Police Station Akhnoor. After this, a team of Police Station Akhnoor under the supervision of SDPO Akhnoor Varun Jandial led by SHO Akhnoor Insp Hilal Azhar, after putting in strenuous efforts, arrested the accused from a suspected location. It is pertinent to mention that a warrant of arrest under section 512 of CrPC has also been issued against absconder by Court of JMJC Akhnoor.

Similarly, information was received at Police Station Gandhi Nagar regarding absconder namely Ravi Kumar, son of Shiv Nath, resident of Rampura who was absconding from last

22 yrs in FIR No. 332/1995 registered under sections 324/34 of RPC 4/25 of A Act and two absconders namely Vikas Sharma, son of Ramesh Lal, resident of upper Laxmi Nagar and Rakesh Singh, son of Surjeet Singh, resident of Sungal Akhnoor who were absconding for last 9 years in FIR No 26/11 registered under sections 353/109 of RPC at Police Station Gandhi Nagar.

On this, teams under supervision of SDPO South Sachit Sharma led by SHO Gandhi Nagar Insp Pankaj Sharma, after putting in strenuous efforts, arrested all the three absconders. It is pertinent to mention that absconder namely Ravi was produced before the Court and was sent to District Jail Amphalla, Jammu.

Six gamblers arrested, stake-money Rs 11,800 recovered

JAMMU: Police on Saturday arrested six gamblers arrested and recovered stake-money amounting to Rs 11,800 from the spot.

As per details, a team of Police Station Bus-stand headed by SHO Bus-stand Insp Vishal Shoor while on patrolling duty near Trikutia complex received information regarding some gambling activity in the area. On this, police teams raided the suspected place and nabbed six gamblers along with Rs 11,800 stake money and a deck of playing cards. All the gamblers were arrested and FIR under section 13 of Gambling Act was registered against them at Police Station Bus Stand. The arrested accused were identified as Ravi Sharma, son of Som Nath Sharma, resident of Resham Ghar Colony; Omkar Chand, son of Lal Chand, resident of Shiv Nagar; Dalbir Singh, son of Balbir Singh, resident of Dogra Hall; Roshan Sharma, son of Parkash Chand, resident of Resham Ghar Colony; Deepak Sharma, son of Om Parkash Sharma, resident of Bhagwati Nagar and Rattan Lal, son of Ganga Ram, resident of Dharabshalla Kishtwar, at present staying at Resham Ghar Colony. The overall arrests and recoveries were made under the supervision of SDPO North Sharad Kalu.

Man held with 10 lts illicit liquor

KATHUA: In its decisive action against consumption/production of illegal liquor menace, Kathua Police under the overall supervision of SSP R C Kotwal on Saturday arrested a man near Chak Drab Khan and seized 10 lts illicit liquor from his possession.

As per details, information was received from reliable source that illicit liquor is manufactured near Chak Drab Khan and its adjoining areas. Acting swiftly, a team of Police Station Kathua led by PSI Arfan Chandel under supervision of DySP Headquarter Kathua Shammi Kumar during special checking/ patrolling duty, noticed a suspect. On checking, approximately 10 lts illicit liquor was recovered from possession of accused, who was later identified as Kamal Kishor, son of Rattan Chand, resident of Chak Drab Khan Tehsil & District Kathua. He was arrested and FIR No. 179/2022 under section 48(A) of Excise Act was registered against him at Police Station Kathua.



24 bovines rescued, 2 vehicles seized

UDHAMPUR: Police under overall supervision of SSP Dr Vinod Kumar seized two vehicles and rescued 24 bovines.

As per details, during the intervening night of May 6-7, police team led by SHO Chenani Charanjeet Singh under supervision of SDPO Chenani Ahmed Shafi seized a truck (JK02AS 7981) carrying 18 bovines, which were rescued.

FIR No 66/2022 under relevant sections of law was registered at Police Station Chenani and further investigation is going on. Earlier, in the jurisdiction of Police Station Majalta,

06 bovines were rescued by the police.

Police party was headed by SHO PS Majalta Virender Gupta under the supervision of SDPO Ramnagar Dr. Bhishm Dubey. It was found during checking, the bovines were being illegally smuggled towards valley in a vehicle bearing registration number JK14F 0201 without any valid permission.

In this regard, case FIR no 29/2022 under section 429 IPC, 11PCA Act has been registered in Police Station Majalta.

Woman arrested with Charas, cash

RAMBAN: Cracking down heavily on narcotic smuggling, Ramban Police under the overall supervision of SSP Mohita Sharma nabbed a woman drug-peddler at Sangaldan, Gool and recovered Charas from her possession.

As per details, on specific information received at Police post Sangaldan, a special team was constituted and various locations were raided. After hectic efforts Charas (Cannabis) along with cash was recovered from a woman namely Saleema Begum, who used to sell the same among local youth. After completing all legal formalities, the accused woman was arrested. The search was conducted by a team led by Incharge Police Post Sangaldan PSI Aakash Magotra under supervision of SDPO Gool Nihar Ranjan.

Drug peddler arrested with 80 Kg poppy straw

SAMBA: Continuing its drive against narcotics smugglers, District Police Samba under overall supervision of SSP Samba, Dr. Abhishek Mahajan on Saturday arrested a narcotics smuggler and recovered approximately 80 Kg Poppy Straw like substance near Ghagwal.

As per details, a party of Police Station Ghagwal led by Insp Vijay Verma under the supervision of DySP Hqrs Samba, Mohd Usman intercepted a Mahindra Bolero Pickup without registration number during checking Naka NH Tapyal, Ghagwal. On search, 80 Kg poppy straw like substance in 80 polythene bags were recovered, which were tactfully concealed in vehicle's body modified for poultry purpose to avoid being noticed by Police. The accused identified as Mohamad Rafi, son of Fateh Mohamad, resident of Panchhat, Tehsil Panchhat District Kapurthala (Punjab) was arrested and FIR No. 69/2022 under section 8/15 of NDPS Act was registered against him at Police Station Ghagwal.



Two accused involved in assault on Army man nabbed

POONCH: Police on Saturday arrested two prime accused involved in assault on an Army man.

As per details, information was received at Police Station Poonch on May 4, 2022 that some unknown persons have attacked an army personal who was on leave at home with sharp-edged weapon and injured him. Acting on information, the injured was shifted to district hospital Poonch for treatment. Taking further cognizance, FIR.No.89/2022 under sections 307,34 of IPC 4/25 of Indian Arms Act was registered at Police Station Poonch and investigation started. Teams led by SHO Poonch Sureshwar Dev Singh were constituted to nab the culprits and all Nakas were put on high alert. With help of CCTV footage and technical assistance, accused persons namely Gangandeep Singh, son of Kulbir Singh, resident of Darrah, Poonch and Simranjeet Singh, son of Daljeet Singh, resident of Pind Chatha, Jammu, were arrested within 24 hours of incident. The weapon of offence and vehicle, in which they travelled, was also seized.
