The winner sees a problem in every problem.


The loser sees a problem in every answer.

The winner says , "It may be difficult but it is possible."




SUDOKU

Calligraphy

Calligraphy - the art of beautiful handwriting - is a branch of paleography or ancient writing. The artistic strokes created may or may not resemble letters. Calligraphy is extensively used in creating fonts, alphabets and words as a way of expressing ones imagination through creativity and design. A contemporary definition of Calligraphy is 'the art of expressing thoughts with beauty, harmony and peace'. The word Calligraphy has been derived from two Greek words 'kalli', which means beautiful, and 'graphia' which means writing.

Considered as a form of visual art that date back to the 10th century, Calligraphy has been used by many civilizations like ancient Greeks, Romans and Chinese since ancient times, in their texts, edicts, sagas, palm leaves, animal bones, ancient monument walls, ceilings, stones etc. Now it continues to flourish in the form of wedding and event invitations, paintings, maps, font design, graphic design, typography, cut stone inscriptions, religious art, ceramics, memorial documents, props and moving images for film and television, and other handmade presentations. This budding profession is integrated into the fields of fashion and interior designing and even on the human body in the form of tattoos.

Calligraphy is an expressive profession that offers a chance to unleash one's artistic potential. It opens a unique career option for those who have an artistic mind with a creative bend and passion for lettering. Calligraphers, professional artists who specialize in handwriting, can do wonders with their artistic skills. They use their talent to create new fonts and fancy scripts using various flat and oblique nibs with variety of inks, pens or brushes. A Calligrapher creates attractive texts and lettering for wedding and event invitations, logo designs, maps, memorial documents, religious art, cut stone inscriptions, quotes, poems, testimonials, birth and death



certificates, letters and stationery.

No specific degree is needed to learn calligraphy. What is required is excellent artistic talent, creativity and imaginative skill. Even though, university recognized calligraphy courses can be hardly found in India, aspiring candidates can opt for long and short-term calligraphy courses offered by private institutes/ coaching centers. Formal training can prepare individuals to make a living from this craft.

One can learn the basics of Calligraphy within a short period of time through these courses that lasts for a few weeks to a few months.
