legislative assembly, while Ladakh will be governed directly by the Centre.

The government had announced that elections to the legislative assembly would be held after the completion of the delimitation of assembly constituencies.

Last week, the Delimitation Commission for Jammu and Kashmir notified its final order in which it has recommended a 90-member House for the newly carved out union territory. But it may take some time to have an elected House in place in the UT.

It is not for the first time that legislators of a state assembly will not be able to participate in the presidential elections.

In 1974, the 182-member Gujarat Assembly was dissolved in March following the Navmirman Andolan and could not be constituted before the presidential election in which Fakruddin Ali Ahmed was elected.

However, Jammu and Kashmir will not go unrepresented in the presidential elections as members of Lok Sabha will be eligible to exercise their franchise to elect the First Citizen of the country.

The value of the vote of a Member of Parliament has been fixed at 708 since the 1997

presidential election.

The value of vote of a Member of Parliament for the first Presidential election in 1952 was 494. It increased marginally to 496 in the 1957 presidential election, followed by 493 (1962), 576 (1967 and 1969).

The presidential elections were held in 1969 due to the death of President Zakir Hussain on May 3, 1969.

In the 1974 presidential election, the value of vote of an MP was 723. It has been fixed at 702 for the presidential elections from 1977 to 1992.

President Ram Nath Kovind completes his term on July 24, and his successor has to be elected before that.

By holding bypolls to the Rajya Sabha and state legislative assemblies, the Election Commission is trying to fill up vacancies to complete the Electoral College which elects the president.

## PM introduced new political culture in country: Dr Jitendra

SITAMARHI (BIHAR): Union minister Jitendra Singh on Sunday said the BJP under Prime Minister Narendra Modi has sought to introduce a new political culture in the country, rising above considerations of vote bank politics or subjective preferences.

The latest evidence of this, he said, is the inclusion of Sitamarhi under the Centre's aspirational district programme purely on the consideration that it deserved a special attention for its growth and development in certain sectors.

Singh, Minister of State for Personnel and BJP national executive member, addressed a meeting of party workers here.

He said while PM Modi has vindicated Syama Prasad Mookerjee's dream of BJP being a truly democratic party suited to the requirements of post-independence India, it was the sacrifices of three generations of party workers, which enabled the party to survive over the last seven decades before emerging as the world's largest political party under the able organisational leadership of party presidents like Amit

Shah and J P Nadda.

"The Prime Minister has sought to introduce a new political culture in the country, rising above considerations of vote bank politics or subjective preferences," the minister said.

Singh said it was his good fortune to be able to pay obeisance at the holy place which was closely associated with Maa Sita of the epic Ramayan.

He said with the kind of special focus being given by the government of India, the day is not far when Sitamarhi will develop and live up to its name, which conjures up the

thoughts of Lord Ram and Ram Rajya.

Singh spent about two hours interacting with the party workers.

He informed them that he had impressed upon the local administration to maintain a closer coordination and rapport with public representatives and the citizens.

Singh said it was the priority treatment given to Sitamarhi by the Modi government that despite the constraints of Covid pandemic, a CT scan machine was installed in the Sadar hospital and a new nursing school has also been set up.

## J&K reports 10 fresh COVID cases, one in Ladakh

SRINAGAR: Jammu and Kashmir on Friday reported 10 fresh Covid cases- seven from the Valley and three from the Jammu division -- thus taking the total number of positive cases in the Union Territory to 454109.

Moreover, 22 more COVID-19 patients have recovered and been discharged from various hospitals, 07 from Jammu division and 15 from Kashmir division.

According to the daily Media Bulletin, out of 454109 positive cases, 56are Active Positive (33 in Jammu Division and 23in Kashmir Division), 449302 have recovered and 4751 have died; 2328 in Jammu division and 2423 in the Kashmir division.

The Bulletin said that out of 25106855 test results available, 454109 samples have tested positive and 24652746 samples have been tested as negative till date. Besides, 17,305 COVID tests have been conducted in last 24 hours.

Providing district-wise breakup for positive during the past 24 hours, the Bulletin stated that Jammu, Srinagar and Budgam reported three cases each and Kupwara district recorded one case while no other district across the Union Territory reported any fresh case.

Meanwhile, Ladakh reported one fresh Covid case on Sunday that took the infection tally to 28,248, officials said.

The number of active cases now stands at two, they said.

### 200 vehicles booked, 32 seized for MV Act violations

REASI: To keep a check on traffic violations, District Police Reasi under supervision of SSP Amit Gupta carried out a special checking drive during which 200 vehicles were booked while 32 others were seized for different violations of Motor Vehicles Act.

As per details, teams from Police Stations Pouni and Ransool laid surprise Nakas and booked 85 vehicles for visible traffic violations and seized 6 vehicles found plying without documents. Police Station Reasi booked 57 Vehicles for MV Act violations and seized 17 vehicles. Teams from Police Station Katra laid special Nakas in Katra and booked 25 vehicles. Similarly, Police Station Arnas seized 8 vehicles plying without documents and booked 20 others for MV Act violations. In Mahore and Chassana, 13 vehicles were booked and one was.

Moreover, two vehicles bearing registration numbers JK02AE 7811 and JK02AM 7833 were seized by Police Station Jhajjar Kotli while five vehicles bearing registration numbers JK02CU-8117, JK14F 7718, JK13F 5044, JK01AL 4327 and JK02AM 2966 were seized by Police Station Nagrota. Accordingly, FIR No.80/2022 and FIR No.81/2022, under sections 188 of IPC, 11 of PCA Act were registered at Police Station Jhajjar Kotli against two accused, who were arrested. Also five FIRs No.183/2022, 184/2022, 185/2022, 186/2022 and 187/2022 all under sections 188 of IPC and 11 of PCA were registered at Police Station Nagrota and three accused were arrested, who were later identified as Mohd Khalid, son of Mohd Gaggar, resident of Pahalgam Anantnag (Driver); Maqsood Ahmed, son of Mohd Rustum, resident of Raipur, Jammu city (Driver) both arrested by Jhajjar Kotli, Mohd Ishaq, son of Abdul Gani, resident of Hind Chachwa Gool, Mumtaz, son of Syeda, resident of Kukar Nag and Mohd Rafiq, son of Mohd Hussain, resident of Poni, Reasi, all arrested by Police Station Nagrota.

The overall arrests and recoveries were made by SHO Jhajjar Kotli Insp Vikram Sharma and SHO Nagrota Insp Vishav Pratap Singh under the supervision of SDPO Nagrota Pardeep Kumar.

The inquiry was ordered to ascertain the facts after a video of a CRPF jawan, complaining against the doctors, went viral on social media.

In an order, Deputy Commissioner (Rajouri) Vikas Kundal appointed Additional District Development Commissioner Pawan Kumar Parihar as the inquiry officer and asked him to submit a factual report along with recommendations within a week's time.

In the video, the complainant has also alleged that the same set of doctors have taken bribes in the past for issuance of disability certificates.

### Three narco smugglers held with heroin

JAMMU: The police have arrested three narco smugglers separately from Rajouri and Udhampur districts and recovered heroin from their possession, officials said on Sunday.

Irfan Khan, a resident of Chapriyan, was arrested after six grams of heroin was seized from his possession during checking at Fatehpur in Rajouri district, a police spokesperson said.

Khan's questioning led to the arrest of his associate Sharaz Ahmad from Khablan village of Thanamandi. Twenty grams of heroin, an electronic weighing machine and over Rs 1.62 lakh in cash was also recovered from him, the official said.

Separately, the police also nabbed one more peddler from Udhampur district and seized 20 grams of heroin from him. The peddler was identified as Abdul Yakub, son of Dulla, resident of Sadote Udhampur.

All the three men were booked under the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances (NDPS) Act, the spokesperson added.

### Terrorist associate arrested in Baramulla
