HC upholds PSA of narco smuggler

STATE TIMES NEWS JAMMU: Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh High Court has upheld detention under PSA of narco smuggler. Justice Mohan Lal, while dismissing petition filed by one Vijay Kumar, seeking quashment of impugned detention order No. PITNDPS 23 of 2022 dated September 29, 2022 issued by the Divisional Commissioner, Jammu (respondent 2) for detaining petitioner under Substances Act 1988 read with SRO 247 dated July 27, 1988, observed that petitioner, actively engaged in the sale and purchase of illicit traffic in narcotic drugs and psychotropic substances, poses a serious threat to lives of young generation and tried to spoil the peaceful atmosphere of Doda and Ramban area and if he remains free in the society. "Therefore. the presence of subject in socie-

ty is certainly prejudicial to the health and welfare of the people of District Doda and other adjoining area and this illicit traffic has a deleterious effect on the society, as the criminal activates of the petitioner are responsible for spoiling the lives of hundreds of youth.

From the bare perusal of the FIRs and DDRs the allegations therein against the petitioner, it is discernible, that the petitioner is a habitual smuggler and actively engaged in the sale and purchase of illicit traffic in narcotic drugs, the actions taken against him under ordinary law from time to time have not been proved to be deterrent. It seems that petitioner/ detenue instead of mending his ways continuously been indulging in such activities and has not shown any respect for the law of the land, as such, the

petitioner/detenue has created a sense of alarm, scare and a feeling of insecurity in the minds of the public of the area, has become a chronic fear amongst the people of the area. Even the Advisory Board under J&K Prevention of Illicit Traffic in Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act 1988 vide its order dated October 7, 2022 has confirmed the detention of the petitioner. Thus, the activities of the petitioner are of criminal and habitual nature of indulging in sale and purchase of narcotic drugs, hence, petitioner has been rightly detained by Respondent No. 2, therefore, the detention order issued vide order No. PITNDPS 23 of 2022 dated 29.09.2022 does not suffer from any illegality, impropriety and perversity, the same is upheld," the Court observed.

JAMMU: Justice Sanjay Dhar of Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh High Court upheld rigorous imprisonment for seven years and a fine of Rs 1 lakh awarded to one Nazir Ahmed Ganie which was awarded by Principal Sessions Judge Pulwama in 2015 under section 304-II of RPC. As per prosecution case, on August 16, 2011, PW (9) lodged a written report with SHO Pulwama, alleging therein that at about 9.00 AM, when his son Danish Farooq alias Umar Farooq was on his way to school, he was attacked by accused, including appellant. It was further alleged that as a result of the attack. the deceased received fatal injuries as all three accused had hatched a conspiracy to kill deceased, FIR No.25/2011

for offences under Section of

302.34 of RPC was registered with the Police Station Pulwama and investigation started. After investigation of the case, it was found that the appellant along with coaccused namely Gh Ganaie and Maqbool Ganaie caught hold of deceased Danish Faroog and was given beating by kicks, fists and hands. It was also found that appellant, who was armed with a club. gave a blow on head of the deceased with an intention to kill him, due to which deceased fell down and died on the spot.

Justice Sanjay Dhar after hearing both the sides observed, that it is clear that mere protraction in trial or delay in decision of the appeal cannot be a ground for reducing the sentence, particularly when during the pendency of the appeal, the appellant has been admitted to interim bail

in terms of order dated November 8, 2016 and continued to be on bail as on today. "For the foregoing reasons, I do not find any ground to interfere in the impugned judgment of conviction and order of sentence passed by the trial court. The appeal fails and the

same is, accordingly, dismissed. The appellant is directed to surrender before the trial court within a period of fifteen days from today and once the appellant surrenders before the trial court, he shall be sent to jail for serving the balance sentence. In case the appellant fails to surrender before the trial Court within the aforesaid period, the trial Court shall secure his presence through coercive measures and send him to jail for serving the balance sentence." the Court observed.
