JAMMU: Reetu Salathia (44) took up online gaming during the Covid period in 2020 after being introduced to the virtual world by her son. Now, the Jammu-based homemaker earns Rs 1.50 lakh a year streaming games online, carving out for herself an independent source of

Known as "Blackbird" in the gaming community, Salathia boasts close to four lakh followers on Rooter, a gaming platform. While she has been passionate about video games from her childhood, she has now taken gaming seriously and looks at it as a means to be independent.

"I am not highly educated. I have passed Class 12. I loved gaming. From the beginning, I wanted to earn for myself. When my son told (taught) me about livestreaming (of games), I started to do it. I am also earning for myself,"

Looking at her passion, the Salathias dedicated one room in the family home in Jammu's Netrikoti area for her gaming activities.

Having started with "Candy Crush", Salathia slowly progressed to "Battlegrounds Mobile . She tries one and all the games that her partners insist on playing. "I started with Candy Crush'. Then I started online gaming Slowly and steadily, I learnt it by continuously playing the games. I can play any game," she

While Salathia is known by her "Blackbird" handle in the gaming community, her partners -- most of whom are children -- call her "Muma".

"The biggest compliment for me was that children asked me whether they could call me 'mother'. It was an emotional moment for me," she said. Salathia, who has since launched her gaming channel on YouTube, said her family supported her throughout.

"The reaction of my family was very positive. I am very happy to play with youngsters," she said. Her son Gaurav Singh said, "We never thought she would get such love from the people." Balancing all her work, Salathia finds time to play three to four hours every day and earns more than Rs 1.50 lakh per year.

# Dulloo reviews implementation of HADP

SRINAGAR: Additional Chief Secretary (ACS), Agriculture Production Department, Atal Dulloo, on Thursday chaired a meeting of Project Grounding and Monitoring Committees to review progress on implementtaion of Holistic Agriculture Development Plan (HADP) in the Union Territory at Civil Secretariat here. The meeting was attended by

Vice Chancellor, SKUAST-K, Secretary Agriculture Production Department, Mission Director, HADP, concerned Chairmen and memebers of all Project Grounding and Monitoring Committees, members of PMU and technical officers. Addressing the officers, ACS

stated that this plan is a mission for transformative and holistic development of agriculture and allied sectors across J&K with potential to transform the UT into sustainable commercial agri-economy. He impressed upon the officers to work in mission mode and coordinated manner to achieve the desired objectives of the plan.

While reviewing progress on each project being executed under the ambitious plan, Atal Dulloo exhorted upon the members to consult the stakeholders so that all aspects of agricultural and allied sectors are included in the plan.

The sub projects taken up for discussion during the meeting included promotion of oilseeds, formulation of 300 FPOs, integrated farming systems, commercial floriculture, rainfed area development, identification of organic clusters in 14 districts and organic zones in 6 districts, alternate agriculture system for sustainability, sensor based smart agriculture, minimising pesticide use in agriculture, soil and land resource information system and soil health management, innovative extension approaches for promoting agriculture.

The meeting discussed upgradation of existing integrated farming system, upgradation of 54 nursery units in Srinagar, Budgam, Ganderbal districts in Kashmir division and Jammu, Udhampur districts in Jammu division. To increase production and productivity of oilseeds, the officers informed that they have covered additional 72,000 hectare under oilseed crops. It was given out in the meeting that 24 hectare of nursery has been added with establishment of additional 150 nursery units Srinagar, Budgam, Ganderbal, Anantnag and Baramulla districts in Kashmir
