### DB directs authorities to place on record steps taken for constitution of State Commission for protection of child rights

JAMMU: A Division Bench of Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh High Court (Srinagar Wing) comprising Chief Justice N. Kotishwar Singh and Justice Atul Shreedharan directed authorities to place on record the steps taken for constitution of State Commission for protection of child rights.

When the PIL came-up for hearing, DB observed that Section 44 of The Protection of Children from Sexual Offences Act, 2012 mandates monitoring of effective implementation of the provisions of the aforesaid Act by the concerned State Commission for protection of child rights. During the course of hearing it has been submitted that no such Commission has been constituted in the UT of Jammu and Kashmir as well as in UT of Ladakh, DB observed that considering the statutory role assigned to the Commission for effective implementation of the Act, non-constitution would be a serious lapse on the part of the authorities concerned. DB observed that before we issue specific directions in this regard, we require authorities to place on record the steps taken for constitution of this Commission.

## Wild boar rampage in Kashmir; May be dangerous to agriculture and rare species

The animal is also not accepted culturally and religiously in this region.

According to experts, Wild boars, which are not native to Kashmir and had not seen since the mid -80's have been sighted increasingly in the past few years in the Valley causing concern among the common masses

Wildlife Department said that the species was introduced by the Maharaja some 100 years

for many years. It has revived recently," he said.

He said that the reason for its revival may be multiple.

particularly in winter," he said. Experts said that the animal shares its habitat and even food with hangul, the endangered species of red deer native to Kashmir.

"While the wild boars serve as prey for leopards and other wild animals, it can also impact the habitat of hangul," they said. In north Kashmir, he said, the reason may be owing to the increase in the population of wild boars because it is located near

"Wild boars are not native to Kashmir and were first introduced in the region during the time of Maharaja Gulab Singh," he said, adding that the "first (recorded) sighting of the wild boar after the 1980s was in 2013, after a dead pig in the Limber and Lacchipora wildlife sanctuaries of the Kajinag range in North Kashmir was spotted." According to the official the

be studied thoroughly. He said that they have not yet conducted any census of the animal, "which is a prolific breeder and is omnivorous." "It is an invasive species and a

wild boar resurgence needs to

prolific breeder. And universally it is a fact that when an invasive species comes it becomes dominant on the native species. It will obviously have a negative effect on the ecosystem." he said.

It is believed that wild boars pose a new threat to agriculture sectors in Kashmir as these wild animals have damaged paddy fields, apple orchards the locals said that the wild boars have been on rampage, causing extensive damage to crops leaving community in distress.

The concerned residents said that the wild boars' attack paddy fields during the night and destroy crops in no time. They said these animals attack in groups and more than ten wild boars are seen at the same time attacking these paddy fields.

"The wild boars definitely vanished almost in Kashmir but since a few years their number has increased," the senior Wildlife officer said.

He said that the department has formed a team of researchers who will their presence besides their impact on the ecology and habitat.

The CJM, Kathua, on August 11th, 2021 had taken cognizance of a criminal complaint filed by Dr. Adeep Kalibari, Kathua. The said Web portal interview contain-

ing offensive/defamatory content was conducted by Arun Kumar Trishal in his Web

News Channel. The Editor in Chief on September 27th, 2021 of Web News Portal filed a petition before Jammu wing of the Court challenging defamation proceedings on the ground that no fetters can be placed on the freedom of press by initiating criminal proceedings against a reporter who was performing his professional duty by publishing a news on his news portal i.e the speech of Prem Lal Ex-MLA Hiranagar who expressed his views against the functioning of the hospital owned by Dr. Adeep Kumar Gupta.

When this matter came up for hearing, Advocate Jagoaul Singh appearing for petitioner (Web News Portal) submitted that the trial Magistrate i.e CJM Kathua mechanically took cognisance and failed to appreciate that the petitioner being journalist just performed his professional duties by interviewing Ex MLA Hiranagar, Prem Lal who was aggrieved of the death of his nephew because of COVID-19 at

HC dismisses petition filed by News Portal

On the other hand, Advocate Sheikh Shakeel Ahmed with Advocates Supriya Chouhan, Rahul Raina, Sayed Majid Shah, Mohd Aleem Beg, Adnan Mushtaq Jaral and M. Zulkarnain Chowdhary appearing for Dr. Adeep Kumar Gupta owner of Gupta Hospital, Kalibari Kathua submitted that the editor in chief of the News Web Portal aired the defamatory news item without taking the version of Gupta Hospital and the one sided news item caused extensive damage to the reputation of the Gupta Hospital which is serving the patients coming from districts Udhampur, Samba, Kathua and Punjab for the last more than 2decades.

Advocate S. S. Ahmed further submitted that the instant case is a classic example of 'Yellow Journalism' wherein the Petitioner /editior in chief of Web News Portal threw to winds the journalistic ethics and without verifying and ascertaining the facts aired the defamatory news thereby tarnishing the image of the Gupta Hospital which is a reputed

Hospital in district Kathua. Advocate S. S. Ahmed relied upon a recent judgment of the Supreme Court titled Rohini Singh and Ors. v/s State of Gujarat and Ors. wherein the Apex Court came heavily against a Web news portal for its one sided reporting.

After considering the submissions of both the sides, Justice Mohan Lal observed that "I have perused the impugned order dated 11.08.2021 passed by the Court of CJM, Kathua taking cognizance of the complaint filed by Dr. Adeep Kumar Gupta and I am of considered opinion that the trial court has applied it's mind, satisfied itself that the allegations in the complaint constitute an offence indicating sufficient grounds for taking cognizance of the offence of defamation against the petitioner Arun Kumar Trishal and Ex MLA Prem Lal. I do not find any legal justification to interfere with reasoned order passed by the trial court which doesn't
