E-Auction of 7 minor mineral blocks generate Rs 55 Cr revenue

JAMMU: The District e-Auction committee, under the Chairpersonship of Deputy Commissioner Avny Lavasa, successfully conducted the e-Auction of three minor mineral blocks located in Tawi river on Tuesday. The e-Auction notice for these three blocks was notified on 04-05-2023 by District Mineral Officer, Jammu and the e-Auction for the same was conducted today under the supervision of ADC L&O Harvinder Singh. The Department of Geology & Mining had identified 32 minor mineral blocks in Tawi river and its tribu-

taries in District Jammu, out of which clearances for 07 Number of Minor Mineral Blocks were issued by Single Window Committee of District Jammu. These blocks were put to e-Auction and four blocks had already been successfully auctioned and LOIs have been issued H1 Bidders, for which revenue of Rupees 15 Crores was generated. The remaining three blocks following in the Tawi river which were e-Auctioned on 30-05-2023 generated additional revenue of Rupees 40 Crores which is the highest ever recorded revenue for any minor mineral block in J&K.

During the e-Auction, the highest bid amount for Block Number 12/J and 13/J was submitted by M/s Choudhary Power Projects Pvt. Ltd. and for block 19/J highest bid amount was submitted by Sandeep Singh. The e-Auction was conducted in presence of Dr. Gulshan Kumar, District Mineral Officer, Jammu (Member Secretary), H.L. Court frames charges against CEO, ZEO & Ors

JAMMU: Special Judge Anticorruption Jammu Tahir Khurshid Raina framed charges against Tarsem Lal then Chief Education Officer (CEO) Jammu, Ram Rakha the then ZEO Chowki Choura, Jammu, Sheru Ram the then Headmaster Govt. High School Mallah and Priti Rani u/s 5(1)(d) r/w 5(2) of PC Act. Svt. 2006

and Sec. 120-B, RPC. The case of the prosecution against the accused is that one Kasturi Lal s/o Kaka Ram r/o Mallah, Tehsil Karah Balli, District Jammu, lodged a complaint against the public servants, namely, Sheru Ram, the then Headmaster Govt. High School Mallah, Ram Rakha, the then ZEO Chowki Choura, Tarsem Lal, the then CEO, Jammu, and others alleging therein that the public servants had misused their official positions for extraneous consideration to give undue benefit to Ms. Priti Rani d/o Bachan Dass r/o Mallah

Tehsil Karah Balli District Jammu for appointing her as ReT Teacher in Govt. High School, Mallah, On the basis of said complaint a preliminary verification was

conducted by the ACB wherein it was found that Ram Rakha, the then ZEO Chowki Choura, had prepared panel of select list wherein accused Preeti Rani figured at S. No. 1, despite knowing the fact that her category certificate based on ALC had expired on the date of application and her case for renewal of the same was pending disposal with Tehsildar Akhnoor. That the CEO, Jammu, namely, accused Tarsem lal, despite having clear directions of the Director School Education, Jammu, to keep the engagement order pending in case of any discrepancy, had processed the case of beneficiary which paved way for her engagement. As such, the aforementioned public servants made/ facilitated the illegal engagement of Ms. Priti Rani and conferred upon her undue benefit by engaging her as ReT Teacher in Govt. High School Mallah under ALC category. It was done in disregard to the Govt. Order No. 1034/Edu of 2013 dated 26-12-2013 which provides special dispensation for recruitment of teacher on RET pattern in socially and educationally backward areas and in the area near Line of Control identified under

J&K Reservation Rules. This illegal appointment led to beneficiary to withdraw salary of Rs. 99,000/- till Feb. 2017. was, therefore, revealed in preliminary verification that the said public servants in connivance with the beneficiary facilitated her selection/engagement as ReT Teacher quite illegally. Pursuant to the said findings of the said preliminary verification, the FIR got registered against the said public servants and the beneficiary for commission of offences under Sections 5(1)(d) r/w 5(2), J&K PC Act Svt. 2006, r/w Sec. 120-B, RPC. The registration of the case led to the

investigation in the case. Special Judge Anticorruption Jammu Tahir Khurshid after hearing both the sides held that in the light of the factual matrix of the case, as presented briefly in the foregoing paras, coupled with the legal position, as referred to herein above, I am convinced that there is a prima-facie material on record to presume that offences under sections 5(1)(d) r/w 5(2) of PC Act, Svt. 2006 and Sec. 120-B, RPC stand committed by the accused who are required to be charged for the commission of said offices.
