

SRINAGAR: Two terrorists were killed in an encounter as security forces foiled an infiltration bid along the Line of Control (LoC) in Kupwara district Wednesday, officials said.

Srinagar-based defence spokesperson Col Emron Musavi said that based on a specific intelligence input provided Senior by Superintendent of Police, Kupwara about likely infiltration from one of the terrorist launch pads across the LoC towards Machil sector, troops were put on high alert
