### Can't direct 50 per cent HC Judges should be from District Judiciary; but at least 1/3rd should be from Judicial Services: SC

#### STATE TIMES NEWS JAMMU: SC directed

that the High Courts

should take steps to fillup vacancies in judicial quota before they arise, as Judges from service normally get short tenure. Recently, the Supreme Court refused to issue directions to the High Courts to fill 50 per cent of the seats in the respective High Courts from the Bench (service judges, district judiciary), if vacancy from the Bar quota lies vacant for more than 6 months. A Bench comprising Justice B R Gavai, Justice Vikram Nath and Justice Sanjay Karol said that it was not inclined to grant the same noting and said, "We are afraid, as to whether such a direction can be issued on the judicial side". However, it gave permission to the applicants to approach the appropriate forum with their grievance. Considering another prayer in the application, the Bench clarified that at least one-third of the total vacancies in all High Courts should be filled up from the district judiciary. It noted, "We would expect the High Court to strictly maintain that ratio". In February, 2023, the Bench had expressed its prima facie view that, the present ratio of 1:3 between the judges who are elevated from District Judiciary to the High Court from the service cadre and those who are elevated from the Bar, needs to be maintained. The application was moved by the Judicial Service Association of Delhi.

The prayer with respect to issuing of directions to the High Court to fill the vacancies from judicial quota expeditiously was accepted by the Bench. It

noted that, most of the time, the tenure of the service Judges in the High Court is only a few years. In view of the same, it requested the High Courts to take immediate steps and recommend names for elevation of judges from the district judiciary prior to the occurrence of vacancies. The same would ensure that there is no delay in elevation from service cadre.

Additionally, the Bench earmarked seven important issues for the Amicus Curiae, Senior Advocate, Siddharth Bhatnagar and the Counsels for the State Government, Union of India and the High Courts to ponder over. The flagged issues are as under -whether the 10 per cent quota reserved for Limited Departmental Competitive Examination (for short, 'LDCE') for promotion to Higher Judicial Service i.e. cadre of District Judge, needs to be restored to 25 per cent as determined by the Court in the case of Services. Judicial Supreme Court refuses to order that 50 per cent of High Court judges should be recruited from judicial services. The Court said that ratio between judges from district judiciary and from bar be maintained at least as 1:3 and issued directions to speed up the filling up of vacancies from judicial quotathe tenure of the Service Judges in the High Court. most of the times, is only few years. So, High Courts were requested to take immediate steps in recommending names for elevation from the service cadre prior to the occurrence of such vacancies. so that there is no delay in elevation of the Judges from the service cadre.

JAMMU: A Division Bench of Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh High Court comprising Chief Justice N Kotiswar Singh and Justice Wasim Sadiq Nagral, while hearing a Public Interest Litigation (PIL) regarding shortage of doctors/paramedical staff in Union Territories of Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh. expressed anguish over nonfiling of status reports. The DB granted further two weeks time to do needful, failing which concerned officials of Union Territories of Jammu and Kashmir and Ladakh, may be liable to be directed to remain present in person before the Court on the next date of hearing.

This significant order has been passed in a much publicized PIL filed by RTI Activist Balwinder Singh wherein petitioner has sought directions to UT administration to provide duly sanctioned staff in all Health Institutions in Jammu Province as out of 259 PHCs. NPHCs and CHCs in hilly and remote areas of all Districts of Jammu province, 184 are running without doctors and lacking staff includ- $_{

When PIL came-up for hearing, DB after hearing Adv Sheikh Shakeel Ahmed appearing for the PIL observed that the Court vide order dated March 16, 2023 had granted time to ascertain as to when selection process in respect of 380 posts of Medical officers pending with Public Service Commission will be completed. Similarly, the State Government was also required to provide the details of the District-wise existing sanctioned staff position apart from the Medical Officers (Doctors) including Para Medical Staff working in the various Public Health Centers under the Health Medical Education Department.

DB also directed Vishal Sharma, Deputy Solicitor General of India appearing for the UT of Ladakh to furnish the necessary information DB observed that the said information is not coming forthwith and accordingly granted further two weeks time to do the needful, by or before the next date, failing which concerned officials of Union Territories of Jammu

and Kashmir and Ladakh, may be liable to be directed to remain present in person before Court on the next date

of hearing. It is worthwhile to mention here that on the last date of hearing, S S Nanda, Sr. AAG has informed the Court through affidavit filed on 14th March, 2023 that out of 708 posts Medical Officers which have been referred by the Health & Medical Education Department to Public Service Commission for selection of suitable candidates against post of medical officers, the PSC has furnished a selection list of just

328 selectees (Medical Officers). DB is also of view that

State Government should provide details of district-wise existing sanctioned staff position apart from Medical Officers (Doctors) including Para Medical Staff working in the various Public Health Centres under Health and Medical Education Department. DB also directed DSGI appearing for the UT of Ladakh to furnish the necessarv information regarding Medical Officers (Doctors) as well as non-medical (Paramedical Staff) in all districts of Ladakh.

### Modi emphasised timely changes in recruitment rules of ministries for more jobs: Amit Shah

NEW DELHI: Prime Minister Narendra Modi has emphasised timely changes in recruitment rules at all the ministries of the central government, paving the way for the creation of more jobs, Union Home Minister Amit Shah said on Wednesday.

Distributing appointment letters on regularisation of over 4.400 muster roll employees of the New Delhi Municipal Council (NDMC) at Talkatora stadium here, Shah said Modi has also worked to end uncertainties in many areas, which is why everyone is saying "Modi Hai To Mumkin Hai".

"Modi due to his innate decision-making capability has ended uncertainties in many areas while working earlier as chief minister of Gujarat and now as prime minister of the country. An example of this is the appointment letters received by you. That is why whether children, elderly or youth -- everyone savs Modi hai to Mumkin hai," he said.

Shah said the prime minister himself has exerted thrust on timely changes in recruitment rules and conditions in all the ministries

of the Union government. "This is why these appointment letters are being given."

Congratulated the regularised NDMC employees, he said they were provided respect and pride through regularisation under Modi's leadership, which was a matter of great pleasure and satisfaction to him.

Shah hoped that the NDMC workforce of 13,000 employees strengthened by 4,400 regularised muster role workers will work to ensure that a positive message is conveyed to the heads of states, who will visit the national capital during a G-20 Summit in September.

The Union home minister said the reason for the lack of regularisation was that there were no recruitment rules. The rules were prepared and the DoPT approval was obtained and now regularisation has happened, he added. Shah said the process of regularisation was completed with the creation of 900 additional posts in the NDMC to accommodate all the 4.400 muster role workers.

Shah also inaugurated 120 flats of the NDMC constructed at Pushp Vihar for the civic body's employees.

#### Bail denied to two narco smugglers ■ STATE TIMES NEWS

JAMMU: Principal Sessions Judge Udhampur Haq Nawaz Zargar rejected bail application of two narcosmugglers namely Mohd Javed and Amrej Iqbal, who were arrested with over 38.570 Kg poppy straw by Chenani police near motor shed on

March 13, 2023. After hearing Public Prosecutor Koshal Kotwal for the police, Principal Sessions Judge Udhampur Haq Nawaz Zargar while rejecting bail application, satisfied by arguments of the Public Prosecutor that the release of accused person at this stage, during ongoing investigation, will definitely destroy and disturb social fabric which cannot be allowed. "None can be allowed to play with the lives of others who have committed no crime. There is every possibility of repeating the same offence by accused. As far as liberty of a person is concerned,

Court further observed that having regard to nature of the offences committed, quantity of contraband items recovered and the stage of investigation, which is still under progress and Challan is yet to be produced before the Court of Law, the accused persons does not deserve concession of bail at this stage, as the same may severely hamper the investigation process. In such heinous offences bail cannot be claimed as a matter of right. No case of exceptional mitigating circumstances is made out for exercising discretion of bail in favour of accused persons.
