Aditi who has been proving her mettle as an actor one film at a time has worked with many stalwarts directors and one of them is Intiaz Ali, but her experience was unusual, the actress in an exclusive interview with BL revealed how her role was cut in Rockstar starring Ranbir Kapoor and she felt bad about it.

Recipes Hung Curd Tiramisu



Ingredients
4 inches ready made cake, 1/2 cup milk
1 tablespoon coffee powder, 3 tablespoon whipped cream
3 teaspoon custard powder, 1/4 cup sugar
3 tablespoon hung curd, 1 cup water

Method:
To prepare this scrumptious Tiramisu recipe, slice the ready made cake horizontally into three slices. Then mix the custard powder in a little cold milk. Heat the remaining milk in a pan over low flame. Add the custard powder mixture and cook by stirring continuously. Once the mixture attains a thick texture and sugar. Let it dissolve and allow it to cool.

Heat a cup of water in a pan over moderate flame. Add one teaspoon instant coffee powder and mix. Set aside to cool. In the meantime, add the hung curd to the custard mixture followed by adding whipped cream, mix all these to form a nice creamy mix.

Now place the base slice of the cake in a glass bowl. Pour some of the coffee decoction over it and let it soak well. Spread some of the custard mixture all over it. Soak the remaining cake slices in the remaining coffee decoction. Place another cake slice over the one in the bowl and spread some of the custard mixture all over it.

Cover it with the third cake slice. Pour the remaining custard mixture over it and spread it over the top and the sides of the sandwiched cake. Put the remaining instant coffee powder in a small sieve and sprinkle it all over the top of the tiramisu. Keep it in the refrigerator to set for at least one and a half hour. Serve chilled.

CRIME REPORT Bovine smuggling attempt foiled, 5 bovines rescued

SAMBHA: Police on Thursday foiled bovine smuggling attempt during the early morning hours in the jurisdiction of Police Station Ghagwal, district Samba and rescued five bovines from the clutches of bovine smugglers. A Police team of Police Station Ghagwal headed by SHO PS Ghagwal while performing vehicle checking duty at NHW naka Tappal, intercepted a Mahindra Pickup bearing registration number JK08M-7187 coming from Kathua side for checking. During checking of the vehicle, five bovines were found laden inside which were tied in a cruel manner and were being transported illegally without any valid permission. However, driver of the vehicle managed to escape from the spot taking advantage of the darkness. All the rescued bovines has been shifted to safer place. A case FIR No. 64/2024 u/s 188 IPC, 11 PCA Act has been registered at Police Station Ghagwal and investigation started.

3 drug peddlers arrested; psychotropic substances recovered

Accordingly, a case vide FIR No. 32/2024 under relevant sections of law has been registered at Police Station Tarzoo & investigation has been initiated.

SSP Jammu to blacklist vehicles repeatedly found involved in bovine smuggling

JAMMU: Continuing its drive to eradicate the menace of bovine smuggling under operation Kamdhenu, the Jammu & Kashmir Police took strong action against vehicles continuously indulging in bovine smuggling.

In this regard SSP Jammu Dr. Vinod Kumar-IPS wrote to the Transport Commissioner J&K to take appropriate action against vehicles used for bovine smuggling in three or more than three cases.

20 vehicles were identified, involved in several bovine smuggling cases & multiple FIRs have been registered against them under relevant sections of law in various Police Stations of Jammu District. Bovine smuggling is an alarming threat for disturbance of peace/tranquility as it has tendency to flare up communal tensions & many times due to this menace, situation turns unpleasant.

Therefore, it important to curb such menace and to take administrative action against the vehicles by blacklisting such vehicles which are being repeatedly involved for such illegal transportation. The Police Station wise list of vehicles and cases registered against such transportation has been shared with the office of Transport Commissioner J&K for further course of action.

It is pertinent to mention here that J&K Police is very particular regarding curbing menace of bovine smuggling on all the fronts. In Jammu District from 01.01.24 to 30.0425, five smugglers involved in repeated offences of bovine smuggling have been booked under PSA(Public Safety Act) so far.

'Solemnization of valid second marriage is a must for bigamy conviction'

JAMMU: In order to successfully prove charge for bigamy, proof of solemnization of second marriage in accordance with necessary ceremonies required under section 7 of Hindu Marriage Act (ceremony of Saptapadi) is sine qua non.

This was so held by the Court of Addl. Sessions Judge, Doda, Amarjeet Singh Langhe while dismissing a complaint under section 494 of RPC titled "Sheela Devi V/S Ranjeet Singh and Others". Complainant instituted a complaint alleging therein that her husband solemnized second marriage during subsistence of her marriage with him. In the complaint filed in the year 2006 before Chief Judicial Magistrate - Doda, complainant alleged that her marriage with accused/husband was solemnized some 5/6 years back in accordance with Hindu rites and customs and immediately thereafter, he turned her out from matrimonial home whereafter she filed a maintenance case wherein interim maintenance was granted in her favour and that in the meanwhile her husband solemnized second marriage with accused No. 2 during continuance of first marriage. Matter thereafter was committed to Sessions Court where charge under section 494 of RPC for the offence of bigamy was framed against three accused, one husband of complainant, another the alleged second wife and third the father of alleged second wife.

Holding that there is no proof of solemnization of valid second marriage between husband of complainant and other accused, Court observed "ceremony of Saptapadi (i.e., - the taking of seven steps by bride groom and the bride jointly before the sacred fire) is a must in order to prove a valid marriage".

Noting that complainant failed to prove the second marriage

between her husband and another and its solemnization consistent with Section 7 of Hindu marriage Act, Court further observed "Crucially however, complainant seems to have believed it immaterial to cite, produce and examine said witness (Pandit) as her witness and this omission alone brings the curtains down on her case" adding "further there is no coherence, consistent flow and sequencing in the evidence led by complainant in the case to prove the alleged second marriage". "Whatever may be the relation between accused 1 and 2 and whichever reason may have driven them to such a pass and this all notwithstanding, the evidence led by complainant in the case in hand does not prove the charge that accused 1 and 2 solemnized a valid marriage in accordance with Hindu law and rites so as to embrace the penal consequence of Section 494 of RPC." With these observation Court dismiss the complaint and acquitted the accused.

358 missing persons traced, re-united with legal heirs this year

JAMMU: Jammu & Kashmir Police in the Jammu District during current year upto 30.04.2024 have taken arduous efforts trace out to re-unite the missing persons to their aggrieved family members and accordingly traced out 358 missing persons including 145 male and 193 females whose missing reports were already lodged in different Police Stations and Public Posts of District Jammu.

All the traced persons were reunited to their family members after completing the legal formalities.

Besides this SSP Jammu has issued necessary directions to the subordinate units including all zonal SsP, SDPOs, SHOs, IC PPs to make sincere efforts to trace out all the missing persons pending on the role of Police Stations in order to re-unite them with their family members. General public of the district have highly appreciated the steps taken by Jammu Police in this context.

Four drug peddlers arrested in Samba
