JAMMU: Justice Vinod Chatter Ji Koul of Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh High Court directed Patwari Bari Brahaman to remain present on May 8, 2024. This significant order has

been passed by after hearing Adv Inderjeet Gupta with Adv Yatin Mahajan who submitted that the petitioner's father Late Sh. Prem Prakash Grover was owner of land 3.4 kanals comprising khasra 376 in village Patti, tehsil Bari Brahmana, Jammu which he had purchased by virtue of a sale deed dated November 17, 2008 regarding which mutation no. 1246 was duly attested in favour of the petitioner's father. The petitioner's father came to demise on

November 4, 2022 and the mother of the petitioner had pre-deceased the petitioner's father.

The petitioner along with his sister came to be the legal heirs to the estate of their father and in that respect, the petitioner came to seek a decree dated April 24, 2023 from the court of 2nd Additional Munsiff, Jammu declaring the petitioner entitled to inherit the said land of his father to the exclusion of the petitioner's sister. On the basis of this decree, the petitioner applied online for mutation of the land which came to be declined on August 22, 2023 by the Tehsildar, Bari Brahmana bearing reason that stamp duty deposited has to be clarified first

HC directs PDD to pay Rs 31.90 lakh compensation to 14-yr-old boy left upper limb due to an

JAMMU: Justice Rajnesh Oswal of Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh High Court directed Power Development Department (PDD) to pay compensation to the tune of Rs 31,90,000 to 14 years old boy who suffered from disability because of sheer negligence of the respondents in maintenance of the electric wires.

The petitioner Mauju, a minor boy aged 14 years, has approached this Court through his father for directing the respondents to pay the compensation of Rs.80.00 lakh to him on account of disablement suffered by him in the form of below elbow amputation of

incident of electrocution occurred because of negligence and carelessness on the part of officials of the respondents in maintaining the high tension wires.

It is stated that on January 31, 2017, the petitioner had gone for grazing his livestock when he came into contact with the broken live electricity transmission wire of 11 KV in the field, as a result of which the petitioner suffered serious and grave injuries to his left upper limb.

Justice Rajnesh Oswal after hearing both the sides observed that writ petition is disposed of by directing the respondents to pay an

to the petitioner along with interest @ 6 percent per annum except on the components of compensation on account of future earnings, attendant's expenses and marriage prospects, from the date of filing of the writ petition till its final disbursal. Out of the said amount, an amount of Rs. 15,00,000/-shall be kept in fixed deposit in the name of the petitioner for a period of three years and thereafter the petitioner shall be at liberty to withdraw the same. In the event, the petitioner requires more money for any justifiable purpose he shall be at liberty to approach this Court.

Elderly man found at railway station dies in Jammu hospital


