Circular

The Election Commission of India has notified election to the Srinagar, Baramulla and Anantnag-Rajouri Parliamentary Constituencies to be held on 13.05.2024, 20.05.2024 and 25.05.2024 respectively. Therefore, in pursuance of the above referred communications (copies enclosed) and under section 135B of The Representation of The People Act, 1951. All the Private Enterprises, Shops and other Establishments, Factories and Industrial Units, Brick Kilns, Hydro Electric Power Projects, Railway Establishments, Roadways Projects, Public Industrial Centres, the private Institutions including Educational Institutions, Financial Institutions, etc shall declare the day of Poll i.e. 13.05.2024, 20.05.2024 and 25.05.2024, as a "Paid Holiday" in favour of all the workers/Employees who are residents of at Srinagar, Baramulla and Anantnag-Rajouri constituencies and are currently working in district Ramban. Moreover, no deduction or abatement in wages of the said workers/Employees shall be effected on this account by the employer.

Therefore owners of all the private establishments operating in district ramban are hereby directed to sanction paid Holiday on respective Poll day as mentioned above in favour of those workers in whose native constituency, the election to the Lok Sabha is going to be held in coming phases in J&K as well as in another state of India.

Further, the provisions of the section 135B of The Representation of People Act, 1951, are reproduced for implementation in letter and spirit, in this regard:-

- Every person employed in any business, trade, industrial undertaking or any other establishment and entitled to vote at an election to the House of the People or the Legislative Assembly of a state shall, on the day of poll, be granted a holiday.
- No deduction or abatement of the wages of any such person shall be made on account of a holiday having been granted in accordance with sub-section (1) and if such person is employed on the basis that he would not ordinarily receive wages for such a day, he shall nonetheless be paid for such day the wages he would have drawn had not a holiday been granted to him on that day.
- If an employer contravenes the provision of sub-sections (1) or subsection (2), then such employer shall be punishable with fine which may extend to five hundred rupees.
- The section shall not apply to any elector whose absence may cause danger or substantial loss in respect of the employment in which he is engaged.

CRIME REPORT

Two notorious drug peddlers arrested; contraband substance, cash recovered

ANANTNAG: Continuing its efforts to eradicate the menace of drugs from the society, Police in Anantnag arrested a drug peddler and recovered contraband substance & cash from his possession.

A Police party of Police Station Bijbehara at a checkpoint established at Laktipora near Play Ground intercepted a person identified as Mohammad Yousuf Malik son of Mohd Jabbar Malik resident of Melhora Shopian. During search 2.4 KGs of charas powder and cash amount of ₹1,96,000 (believed to be proceeds of narcotics crime) was recovered from his possession. He has been arrested and shifted to police station where he remains in custody.

Accordingly, a case FIR No. 105/2024 under relevant sections of law has been registered in Police Station Bijbehara and investigation has been initiated.

Meanwhile Kulgam Police also arrested a drug peddler and recovered contraband substance from his possession.

A police party of Police Station Kulgam during patrolling at Okey, intercepted a suspicious person who tried to flee from the spot but was apprehended tactfully. During search, 5.2 Kgs of Poppy Straw concealed in a nylon bag was recovered from his possession. He has been identified as Bilal Ahmad Bhat son of Abdul Khaliq Bhat resident of Okey.

Accordingly, a case vide FIR No. 60/2024 under relevant sections of law has been registered in Police Station Kulgam and investigation has been initiated.

Drug peddler arrested with heroin, vehicle seized

A party of Police Station Akhnoor during routine Naka checking at Old bridge Akhnoor intercepted a Motorcycle (JK02DB 2911) which was on its way from Jammu towards Akhnoor. The rider on reaching old Bridge Akhnoor tried to evade naka but was stopped by alert Naka party. During investigation the rider disclosed his name as Sahil Singh alias Chota, son of Swarn Singh alias Kaka, resident of Tehsil Akhnoor, District Jammu and during frisking of rider 3.4 grams Heroin (Chitta) like Substance* was

recovered from his possession.

FIR no.79/2024 u/s 8/21/22NDPS Act stands registered at Police Station Akhnoor* and investigation taken up. The said peddler was arrested alongwith contraband narcotic substance and Motorcycle also seized. Further investigation of the case is going on. The arrest, seizure and recovery made by police party headed by SHO Akhnoor Tariq Ahmad under supervision of SDPO Akhnoor Mohan Sharma & SP Rural Brijesh Sharma.

9 Illegal commercial structures demolished at Lidroo, Pahalgam

ANANTNAG: Taking strong note of the reports of several illegal construction activities going on at Lidroo Pahalgam, a demolition drive was carried out on Saturday at Lidroo Pahalgam under the supervision of Chief Executive Officer PDA, SDM Pahalgam and SDPO Aishmuqam.

The drive was carried by the demolition squad of Pahalgam Development Authority (PDA) with the assistance of a police contingent from police station Pahalgam.

During the drive, 09 illegal commercial structures which were found to be in violation of Master Plan Pahalgam 2014-32 were demolished. The demolition drive served as a strong message to such elements that are held bent to carry construction in violation of the Master Plan.

The persons intending to carry out any type of construction in PDA jurisdiction have been impressed to follow the procedure laid down in the Master Plan for carrying construction activities within the jurisdiction of Pahalgam development Authority.

The Chief Executive Officer, PDA Pahalgam urged the public to take a proper and legal course for obtaining proper permission from the competent authority while starting any construction activities in the jurisdiction of Pahalgam Development Authority.

It was given out that anyone found committing violation within the PDA jurisdiction shall be taken to task as warranted under law.

A complaint of financial fraud of Rs 36700 in which victim lost his phone and unknown person broke the unlock pattern, changed password and made transactions into his account.

During the investigation, the Cyber Cell DPO Jammu, acted swiftly and exhibited hectic efforts which ultimately led to put on hold an amount of Rs 1,48,500/- out of 1,56,700/- in these three separate online cyber crime complaints. Further investigation is underway.

District Police Jammu, equipped with advanced technology and skilled personnel, remains at the forefront in the fight against cybercriminals.

Police's multiple raids in drugs hotspot; Contraband, tools facilitating its sale recovered & several unclaimed vehicles seized

JAMMU: Jammu Police continuing its drive to eradicate the drug menace from the society under operation Sanjeevani, raided suspected drug hot-spot Sikenderpur Kotly area of Police Station Bishnah on Saturday.

It is pertinent to mention here that earlier R.S.Pura Police arrested a drug peddler namely Navjot Singh, son of Gurcharan Singh, resident of Chohala, R.S.Pura and recovered narcotics from his possession and in this connection a case FIR No. 87/2024 U/S 8/21/22/60 NDPS Act was registered at Police Station R.S.Pura.

During investigation, accused Navjot Singh disclosed backward linkages of narcotics and stated that the he has brought the narcotics (Chitta) from Liaqat Ali and Shokat Ali both sons of Hassan Mir, resident of Sikenderpur Kotly and Shamsah Begum of Sikenderpur Kotly. Accused Navjot Singh further disclosed that Liaqat Ali and Shokat Ali are the main drug peddlers and there is a possibility that on the search of their houses, more narcotics including tools of narcotics and other items can be recovered.

Moreover, a search warrant was issued by the Court and houses of above mentioned accused persons were searched by Police teams after obtaining the search warrant in presence of the EMIC. These raids were led by SSP Jammu Dr.Vinod Kumar and SHOs R.S.Pura, Bishnah & Miran Sahib, SDPO R.S.Pura,SP Hqrs Jammu among others participated during these raids.

During search, it was found that accused persons Liaqat Ali and Shokat Ali fled away from their houses, but Police achieved a major success and recovered 8 bikes & scooties, 01

ear (Alto), narcotics and 1 weighing machine from the house of above mentioned drug peddlers. The recovered unclaimed vehicles are suspected to be the stolen property.

One accused namely Shubham Sharma, son of Tara Chand, resident of Paloura, Jammu was also arrested from the spot along with small quantity of narcotics. In related to this, case FIR No. U/S 8/21/22/60 NDPS Act was also registered immediately at Police Station Bishnah.

Moreover, search of absconding accused continues & further investigation in the case is going on.

Raids were also conducted at Asrarabad in Sidhra area by Police Post Sidhra and SHO Nagrota, Rajpura Mandi by SHO Kanachak, Pallanwala by Police Post Pallanwala & Gole Gujral Bh Police Post Pouni Chak. Foot patrolling was also conducted in the Chitta hot Spots of PP canal area.

Besides to take Operation Sanjeevani of J&K Police to the door steps of Chitta hot spots in Zone South of Jammu, Jammu police led by SP South Jammu, SDPO Gandhinagar and all Jurisdictional SHOs, IC PPs and beat officers carried out surprise patrolling and established checkpoints to seal entry exit points at known hot spots of Rajiv Nagar in the JD of PS Bahu fort and Gandhi Nagar.

During surprise raids two persons were picked up for questioning from Rajiv Nagar and one person from Valmiki Nagar. Besides street awareness programme were conducted for drug awareness.
