Wanted Criminal booked under PSA

STATE TIMES NEWS JAMMU: Jammu Police, in a significant breakthrough, has apprehended Sonu, also known as Ranjha, a resident of Valmiki Colony, Gandhi Nagar, Jammu. Sonu was wanted under the Jammu and Kashmir Public Safety Act 1978, as per a warrant issued by the District Magistrate, Jammu. Sonu has been involved in several criminal activities, including cases registered under various sections of the Indian Penal Code, Arms Act, and the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act. Notable among these are FIRs registered under IPC sections 341/307, 323 and 452 IPC along with violations of the Arms Act and NDPS Act. The apprehension of Sonu was the result of diligent efforts and the utilization of human intelligence by the Jammu Police, particularly in the South Zone. Raids conducted in Valmiki Nagar led to the successful arrest of this notorious individual. Today, the warrant against Sonu was executed, and he has been subsequently lodged in the Central Jail Kot Bhalwal, Jammu. This development marks a significant victory for law enforcement agencies in their continuous efforts to maintain peace and security in the region.

Two narco smugglers nabbed with heroin

STATE TIMES NEWS JAMMU: Continuing its war against drugs under operation Sanjeevani in a significant operation conducted by the police party of Police Post Gadigarh, two drug peddlers were apprehended and 26 grams of narcotics-like substance were seized. Acting on a tip-off, ASI Swaran Singh and his team established a naka at Dharap for vehicle checking duty. During the operation, a Swift car bearing registration number JK 01 AB 4108 was signaled to stop for checking. Upon personal search, 13.86 grams of heroin-like substance were recovered from the possession of the driver, identified as Asrar Ahmed Wani, son of Gulam Nabi Wani, resident of Batwara BB Cantonment Srinagar. Additionally, 12.38 grams of heroin-like substance were found on Tariq Hussain, son of Mohd Ramzan, resident of Batwara Srinagar. The total haul of 26.24 grams of narcotics was recovered from the two individuals. Upon further questioning, they failed to provide any reasonable explanation for the possession of the contraband. In light of these findings, a case FIR No 89/24 U/S 8/21/22 NDPS Act has been registered at Police Station Satwari, and investigations are underway.

Major traffic enforcement operation in Poonch-Rajouri: 35 Vehicles Seized, 45 Challaned for overloading

STATE TIMES NEWS POONCH: In a determined effort to enforce traffic laws and ensure road safety, the traffic police in Rajouri and Poonch District carried out a significant crackdown on overloading and other traffic violations. This operation, directed by DYSP Traffic Rajouri-Poonch Range Navaz Ahmed, involved the strategic placement of checkpoints (Nakas) across various locations in Rajouri Surankote. The coordinated effort led by DTI Rajouri Kapil Manhas, DTI Poonch Ajaz Mirza, and SOT Traffic Surankote Shabir Ahmed SOT Mendhar Maroof Ahmed resulted in the seizure of 35 vehicles and the issuance of challans to 45 others for violating traffic regulations, particularly overloading. The enforcement teams meticulously inspected vehicles, focusing on those suspected of carrying loads beyond permissible limits. Overloading not only poses a significant risk to road safety but also damages infrastructure and increases the likelihood of accidents. DYSP Navaz Ahmed emphasized the critical nature of adhering to traffic laws, highlighting the broader impact on community safety. He commended the efforts of his team and reiterated the department's commitment to maintaining stringent enforcement measures. Both DTI Kapil Manhas and Ajaz Mirza echoed these sentiments, advising drivers to comply with traffic regulations and avoid illegal activities such as overloading, which endangers not only the drivers but also other road users. In addition to the immediate penalties, the traffic authorities also engaged with drivers to educate them on the importance of following traffic rules. They stressed that these rules are in place to protect lives and ensure smooth traffic flow. The authorities warned that such operations would continue and that violators would face strict consequences. This operation serves as a stern reminder of the legal and safety repercussions of disregarding traffic norms. By seizing vehicles and issuing challans, the traffic police aim to deter violations and promote a culture of compliance among road users. The crackdown in Rajouri Surankote Mendhar reflects an ongoing commitment to road safety and the well-being of the community, sending a clear message that traffic laws will be rigorously enforced.

Five drug peddlers arrested, contraband substances recovered

STATE TIMES NEWS KULGAM/BARAMULLA: Continuing its efforts to eradicate the menace of drugs from the society, police have arrested five

(05) drug peddlers in Kulgam & Baramulla and recovered contraband substances from their possession.

In Kulgam, a police party of Police Station Qaimoh at a checkpoint established at Khudwani Bypass near NHW intercepted two suspicious persons carrying a nylon bag. During search 03 kgs of poppy straw concealed in the nylon bag & 3 grams of brown sugar like substance was recovered from their possession.

They have been identified as Manzoor Ahmad Wagay son in law of Gull Mohd Dar & Mushtaq Ahmad Bagow son of Wali Mohd Bagow, both residents of Redwani Payeen.

Moreover, a police party of Police Post Mirbazar intercepted a vehicle (XUV-500) bearing registration no DL4CNB-7870 at a checkpoint established at Manigam crossing. During search, officers at the checkpoint were able to recover 220 grams of charas like substance and cash amount of Rs 15,000/- (believed to be proceeds of narcotic crime) from the possession of Rayees Ahmad Turray son of Mohd Yousuf Turray resident of Khawa Mir Ali Chani Chowk Anantnag. Vehicle used in the commission of crime has been seized.

In Baramulla, A police party of Police Station Boniyar headed by SHO PS Boniyar intercepted two persons at a checkpoint established at Ganie Mohalla Trikanjan. They have been identified as Abdul Qayoom Ganie & Gh Hassan Ganie, sons of Gh Rasool, both residents of Trikanjan Boniyar. During search, 446 grams of Heroin like substance (worth Rs 2 crores approximately) was recovered from their possession.

The drug peddlers have been arrested and shifted to respective police stations where they remain in custody. Accordingly, cases under relevant sections of law have been registered and initiated further investigations.

Community members are requested to come forward with any information regarding drug peddling in their neighbourhood. Persons found indulging in drug peddling will be dealt as per law. Our consistent actions against drug peddlers should reassure the community members that we are making efforts to keep our society free from the scourge of drug menace.

Police attaches properties of 2 terror handlers

STATE TIMES NEWS BARAMULLA: Police attached properties of two terror handlers based in Pakistan after obtaining attachment orders passed by Hon'ble Sub Judge Uri. The attached properties include 1 Kanal & 11 Marlas of land worth lacs belonging to two terror handlers based in Pakistan namely Mohd Arif Badal son of Ghulam Hussain resident of Nawarunda & Mohd Bashir son of Mir Alam resident of Gowhallan, Uri.

The action was taken under sections of 83 CRPC & are linked with case FIR No.82/1999 under section 2/3 EIMCO Act, case FIR No. 34/1999 under section 354, 323 & 06/2008 under section 2/3 EIMCO Act of Police Station Uri.

The property was identified belonging to terror handlers during the course of investigation/enquiry conducted by Police. The operation reaffirms the commitment of Police to combat the terror activities. It is pertinent to mention here that, in year 2024, police in Baramulla have attached properties of 20 terror handlers, worth crores.

Police affixes GPS tracking device to bailed out accused person

STATE TIMES NEWS KULGAM: In compliance to an order received from Hon'ble Court of Kulgam, police in Kulgam on Tuesday affixed a GPS tracking device on a bailed-out person in a UA(P) case of Police Station Qaimoh. The accused was arrested in case FIR No 37/2019 under section 13, 16, 19, 20, 38, 39 UA(P) Act, 7/25 Arms Act and has been bailed out recently. The GPS ankle will be used to monitor the movement of the said accused person and ensure that he doesn't violate the bail conditions.

Illicit timber seized; vehicle seized, driver arrested

STATE TIMES NEWS GANDERBAL: Police in Ganderbal seized illicit timber in Kangan area besides seized vehicle and arrested the driver. Acting on specific input about timber smuggling, a police party of Police Station Kangan headed by SHO Kangan Inspector Mehboob Bandy established a checkpoint at Gujjar Pati Prang. During checking, a Santro car bearing registration No. DL3CAT-1731 driven by Tariq Ahmad Bhat son of Gh Hassan Bhat resident of Najwan Kangan loaded with illicit Timber (Kairu) was intercepted. During preliminary questioning, officers learnt that the timber loaded in the vehicle is illegally acquired from the nearby forest. The accused driver has been arrested and the vehicle alongwith illicit timber (Kairu) has been seized. Investigation into the matter is underway to track down all the accused persons involved in the commission of the crime. Accordingly, a case vide FIR No. 38/2024, under relevant sections of law stands registered at Police Station Kangan & further investigation is in progress. The drive against timber smugglers will continue to ensure protection of green gold. The consistent actions of Police against anti-social elements should reassure the community members to keep our society free from crime. J&K Police have resolved to act as per law against those smugglers who indulge in such activities in future also.

Four missing persons including 3ladies traced, reunited with families

STATE TIMES NEWS SAMBA: Police has traced four missing persons including three ladies from different areas and reunited them with their families whose missing reports were lodged at Police Station Vijaypur, Police Station Bari Brahmana and Police Post RakhAmbTalli falling under the jurisdiction of PS Samba.

The family members of missing persons hailing from Vijaypur, Bari Brahmana, RakhAmbTalliand Glar areas respectively had approached police and lodged their missing reports at PS Vijaypur, PS Bari Brahmana and PP RakhAmbTalli. Accordingly, missing reports were entered vide DD No. 18 dated 10-05-2024, DD No.10 dated 09-05-2024, DD No.16 dated 02-05-2024and DD No. 17 dated 13-05-2024. With continuous strenuous efforts, police teams of PS Vijaypur, PS Bari Brahmanaand PP RakhAmbTalli have succeeded in recovering the missing persons including three ladiesfrom different areas and reuniting them with their families. The said missing reports have been closed accordingly.

Timely action by traffic police saves life of accident victims

STATE TIMES NEWS JAMMU: Prompt evacuation of accident victims by on duty Traffic Police officials saved the lives of three people who were injured in a road mishap here near Purkhu Ghari on Akhnoor Road. At about 0730 hours in the morning, SO (T) Akhnoor SI Ravinder Singh, while on way for duty, saw three injured persons lying on the road following a collision of a Mini Bus and Motor Cycle. The victims were lying on the road in aPool of blood. The SO Traffic Akhnoor, immediately swung into action and with the help of bystanders evacuated the injured shifting two of them in his own car and another on a Tata Mobile to GMC Jammu. The timely action by the officer saved precious lives. The traffic police have advised the general Public to refrain from Over speeding and Rash Driving to avoid accidents. Moreover, safety gadgets viz Crash Helmet shall always be worn while driving two wheelers and also avoid Overloading and Triple Riding. Traffic Police is committed to serve the people and to ensure that the general public follows traffic rules.

Absconder evading arrest for five years apprehended

STATE TIMES NEWS JAMMU: Police Station Peermetha in Jammu District has successfully arrested an absconder who was evading arrest for the past five years. The absconder, identified as Mohd Rafi, S/o.Mohd Qazi and resident of Belieharana, Jammu, was wanted in connection with case FIR No. 23/2019 under section 379 IPC. The arrest was made possible by the dedicated efforts of a team led by the Station House Officer of Peermitha under close supervision from the SDPO City North, Jammu, and guidance from the SP City, Jammu. Utilizing a combination of technical expertise and human intelligence, the team executed the arrest operation with precision. Following the legal formalities, Mohd Rafi was presented before the court and subsequently lodged in District Jail Amphalla, Jammu. Narcotic smuggling bids; 3 held with poppy straw, Charas

STATE TIMES NEWS RAMBAN : Police cracking down on Narcotics smuggling, District Police Ramban under Operation Sanjeevani under the overall supervision of SSP Ramban Anuj Kumar, foiled two Narcotics smuggling bids, arrested two persons with Poppy straw like substance in the jurisdictions of PS Chanderkote and arrested one person with Charas like substance in the Jurisdictions of PS Batote. A police party of Police Station Chanderkote headed by PSI Gourav while conducting routine checking intercepted one Scooty bearing Registration No. PB07CB/3332. On questioning the rider disclosed his identity as Harpreet Singh son of Sudarshan Singh resident of Mananhana Tehsil Garhshankar Distt. Hoshiarpur Punjab and pillion rider disclosed his identity as Jagdish Singh son of Jagtar Singh resident of Baddi Miani Tehsil Tandi Distt Hoshiarpur Punjab. During the process of checking poppy straw like substance approximately 5 kgs was recovered from the above said scooty. In another instance Police Party of PS Batote headed by PSI Mukesh Singh while conducting routine checking intercepted one person who disclosed his identity as Tanbir Ahmed son of Abdul Karim resident of Ballihote Tehsil and District Ramban.During the process of checking Charas like substance approximately 55 grams was recovered from his possession. Subsequently FIR No.67/2024 was registered at PS Chanderkote and FIR No.68/2024 registered at Police Station Batote under relevant sections of NDPS Act. Three accused persons named above have been arrested and contrabands/vehicle seized, investigation of the case going on to prove backward and forward linkages.

4 bovine smugglers arrested, 31 bovines rescued by police

STATE TIMES NEWS SAMBA: Continuing its drive against bovine smugglers and their propagators, Police has foiled bovine smuggling attempt in the jurisdiction of Police Station Samba, arrested bovine smuggler and rescued twenty bovines from the clutches of bovine smugglers. A police party of Police Post Mansar headed by Incharge Police Post Mansar has successfully foiled bovine smuggling attempt, arrested bovine smuggler and rescued twenty bovines which were being smuggled by foot via ChanniMansar road. All the rescued bovines have been shifted to safer place. The arrested bovine smuggler has been identified as Mohd Yaseen, son of Mohd Rafiq, resident of KorgaKorgasa tehsil Dansal district Jammu.

A case FIR No. 141/2024 U/S 188 IPC has been registered at Police Station Samba and investigation started.

Reasi police also foiled bovine smuggling at Bhambla. An information through reliable source received at PP Bhambla that some bovine smugglers have carried bovine animals by foot from Sudheeni towards Kashmir for selling purpose. Soon after the receipt of the information, the police party reached on the spot and bovine smuggler namely Khadam Hussain, son of Mohd Shafi, resident of Peo Manyallan, Rajouri who was found carrying 02 bovine animals without any valid permission of the concerned authority, was apprehended by the Police party. On this, Case FIR No. 27/2024 U/S 188 IPC 11 1(A) PCA Act stands registered at P/S Poomi and investigation initiated to unearth the forward and backward linkages. Foiling bovine smuggling bid, police in Rajouri district arrested one person at Rajjal, Nowshera and rescued nine bovines being smuggled.

The bovine smuggling bid has been foiled by police in Nowshera police station jurisdiction wherein vehicle bearing registration numbers JK11B 4694 carrying as much as nine bovine animals was intercepted. Taking cognisance into the instant matter, police has registered a Case FIR No. 62/2024 under Sections 188 IPC & 11 Prevention of Cruelty to Animals, Act at PS Naushera. Commencing investigation, the vehicle used in commission of instant crime has been seized. The arrested person has been identified as Yasir Khurshid, son of Khurshid Ahmed, resident of Khablan Tehsil Thanamandi.
